

**World Team Cup
Croatia beat
Czech Rep**

DUESSELDORF, Germany. May 21: Goran Ivanisevic wrapped up a personal victory double as Croatia completed their win over the Czech Republic at the World Team Cup today, reports Reuter.

World number four Ivanisevic who gave Croatia a 1-0 lead by beating Bohdan Ulihrach in his singles on Tuesday, joined Sasa Hirszon to beat Daniel Vacek and Martin Damm 5-7, 6-4, 6-3 in a rain hit doubles match that took two days to finish.

With Croatia leading 3-1 in the third set, and the level 1-1, Tuesday's play was halted by bad light and barely completed today before torrential rain disrupted the event for the second consecutive day.

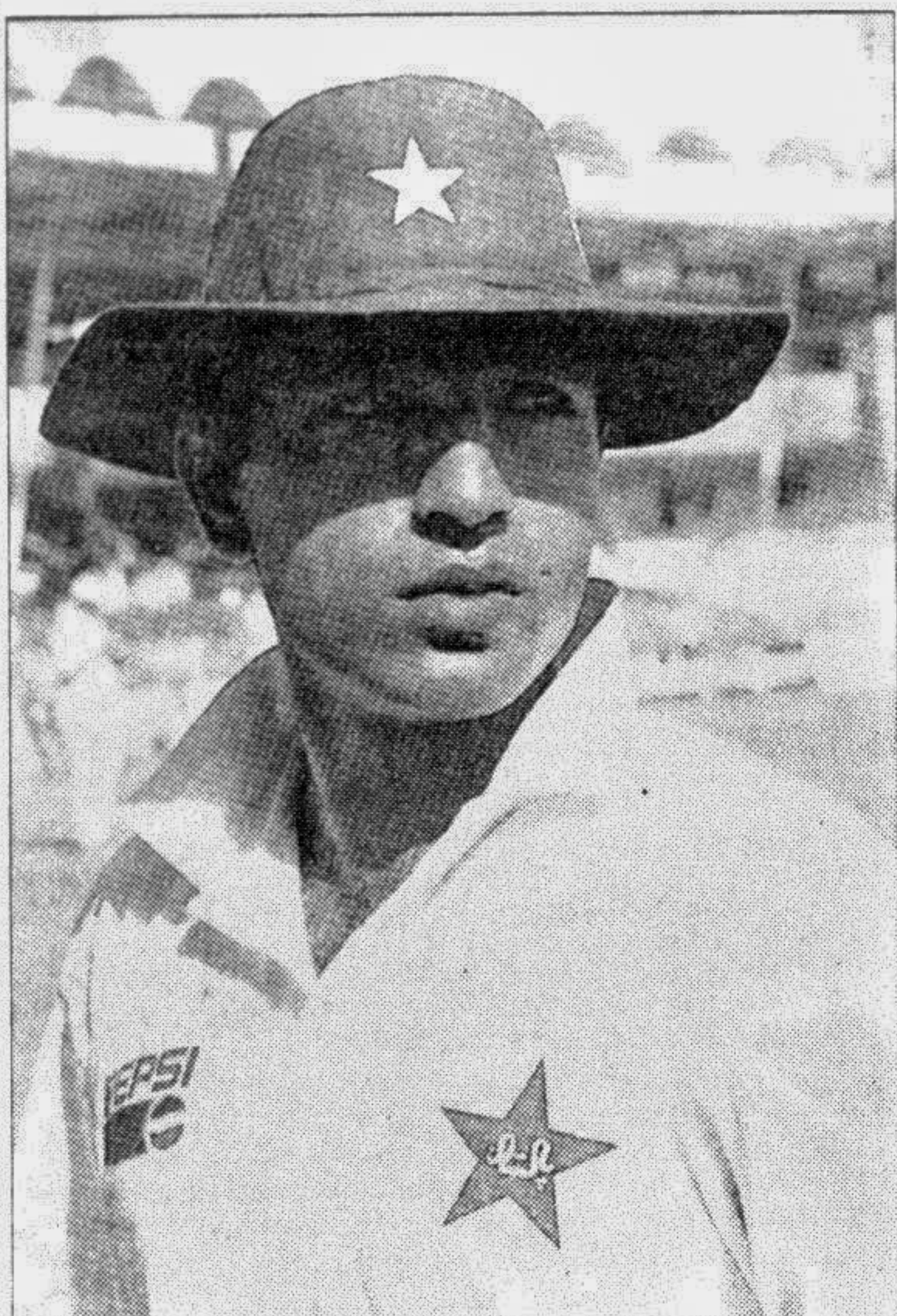
Scheduled play today has Croatia taking on the United States, and Australia meeting the Czech Republic in the other tie.

World number one Pete Sampras, who retired from his opening match against Australia's Mark Philippoussis on Monday after straining a left thigh muscle, was ruled out of the tie with Croatia and replaced by doubles specialist Alex O'Brien.

Sampras, playing in only his third event after missing two tournaments with a wrist injury, is to remain in Germany and said he hopes to play on Friday.

After first round losses in Monte Carlo and the Italian Open, Sampras is desperate to get in some clay-court competition ahead of the French Open, the only Grand Slam title to elude him, which begins next Monday.

**Agassi skips
French Open**

PARIS, May 21: Former world number one Andre Agassi pulled out of the French Open because of a lingering wrist injury, organisers said on Tuesday, reports Reuter.

The same injury forced the American to withdraw from the German Open in Hamburg earlier this month.

A losing finalist in the French Open in 1990 and 1991, Agassi has fallen in the world rankings in recent weeks and is currently ranked 28.

Agassi is the third leading player to pull out of the French Open. German Boris Becker and American Todd Martin have also withdrawn due to injury.

Big blow for Hoddle

MANCHESTER, England, May 21: England coach Glenn Hoddle launched a stinging attack on Roy Evans on Tuesday after Steve McManaman and Robbie Fowler were withdrawn from his squad for the next five international, reports Reuter.

Hoddle blasted the Liverpool boss' decision as "disappointing" as that I didn't know about the situation until after I'd announced the squad.

Fowler has been withdrawn because he needs surgery on his nose to cure a breathing prob-

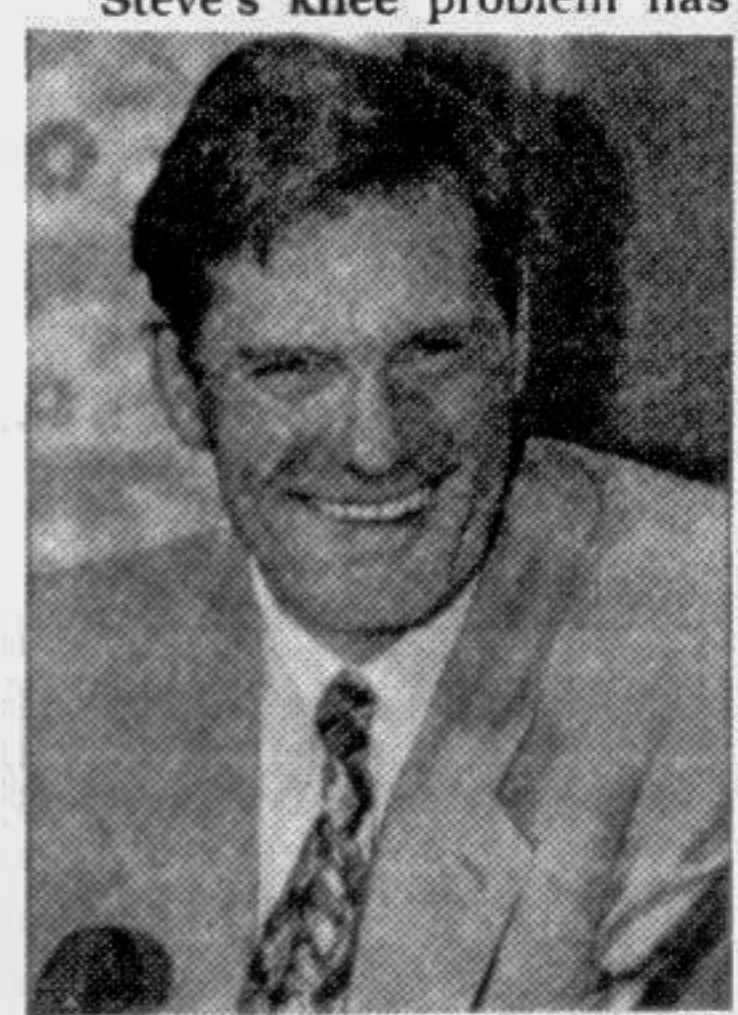
lem while McManaman has a knee problem which needs rest and recuperation.

England play a friendly against South Africa at Old Trafford on Saturday, a World Cup qualifier against Poland on May 31 and three matches in the Tournoi de France in June.

"We knew Steve's knee was a problem but we thought Robbie's operation could have been put off," said Hoddle.

"You can bet I have had some conversations with Roy Evans in the last 48 hours and you know that sometimes there has to be a bit of give and take in medical situations."

"Steve's knee problem has

been a long-term one and he does probably need some rehabilitation on it.

"But Robbie's operation could have been done at a different time. He's not played the last three games of the season for Liverpool because of suspension. If he had undergone the

operation when he was suspended, he could have been eligible for the Poland game and may be even fit enough to play in it.

"This could stop Robbie playing in the World Cup in 12 months time. As one door shuts for one player, another opens for someone else."

Hoddle has called up Manchester United's Andy Cole and John Scales of Tottenham as replacements and Hoddle is now keen to take Cole to the tournament in France.

"The people in the squad now have a very good opportunity to stake their claim, especially if they are in the squad for a longer period than usual and Andy Cole will now have the opportunity that Robbie had," said Hoddle.

England will also be without Les Ferdinand, Gary Pallister and Paul Merson through injuries, while Paul Gascoigne's place in the starting line-up is still in some doubt although he trained with the squad on Tuesday.

Yevgeny suffers setback

ST POELTEN, Austria, May 21: World number three Yevgeny Kafelnikov suffered a blow ahead of his French Open title defence when he crashed out in the first round of the Grand Prix event on Tuesday, reports Reuter.

Second seed Kafelnikov, who was sidelined for three months with a broken finger in his right hand, lasted less than an hour against unfancied Slovak Dominik Hrbaty, losing 6-3, 6-3.

SL viewers deprived

COLOMBO, May 21: Cricket-mad Sri Lankans were infuriated today because state television said it would not show a crucial game between India and Pakistan because it clashed with a Buddhist festival, reports AFP.

Sri Lanka will meet the winners of today's Independence Cup match in the best-of-three finals starting on Saturday.

The state-owned Rupavahini station which owns exclusive television rights in Sri Lanka for the Indian tournament said its decision was aimed at preserving the solemnity of the religious occasion.

Sri Lanka's majority Buddhists today mark the anniversary of Buddha's birth, enlightenment and passing away over 2,500 years ago and the day is generally devoted to religious activities.

"Rupavahini took this decision having given consideration to the significance of the Wesak Day which is being observed by the whole nation with such reverence and solemnity," Rupavahini said in a statement.

It said cricket was kept out to "ensure the prevalence of a peaceful, serene, religious atmosphere in every home."

Television officials said they had received a barrage of angry calls from fans who insisted on seeing the match live on television.

The station, however, said recorded coverage would be shown on Thursday.

Sri Lanka's liquor stores and slaughter houses are closed during the Wesak festivities which officially end on Thursday.

Aussie-Eng 1st ODI today

LEEDS, England, May 21: Tasmanian Ricky Ponting has been put on standby for tomorrow's first one-day international between England and Australia at Headingley after a knee injury to all-rounder Greg Blewett, reports Reuter.

Ponting's ability as a change bowler will give him a place in the order ahead of reserve wicketkeeper Adam Gilchrist if Blewett is unfit.

Michael Kasprowicz is likely to get the third pace bowler's place ahead of Andy Bichel, who was due to play his first match of the tour against Durham on Tuesday.

The match was abandoned

after heavy overnight rain and Bichel, who had been suffering from a back strain, missed the chance to press for a place in the Australian side.

Australia, who started the tour late in order to give their players a break after the demands of their South African tour, have been hampered by some inclement if not untypical May weather.

They have played only two competitive matches, both of them one-dayers, and have only two three-day matches after the three-match one-day series before beginning their Ashes defence.

Australia, who set the pace in the one-day game during the 1980s, have fallen behind recently and this year failed for the first time to reach the finals of the World Series Cup.

"I've been criticised at times for playing down the one-dayers," Australian captain Mark Taylor conceded.

"I play the one-dayers as everyone does. We take them very seriously but they are drifting a long way from the Test matches."

It would be nice to win them because I think the side that does well will take some sort of psychological advantage from it come first test time, especially if it is won by either side.

England will probably omit teenage all-rounder Ben Hollis, reserve spinner Ashley Giles and medium-fast Chris Silverwood.

WC qualifier Bulgaria squad sans Stoichkov

SOFIA, May 21: Bulgaria's volatile striker Hristo Stoichkov will not be involved in his country's World Cup qualifier against Luxembourg in June, reports Reuter.

Stoichkov, who plays for Barcelona, is still at odds with Bulgarian Football Union chiefs for axing former national coach Dimitar Penev and dropping his nephew, Lyuboslav Penev, from the team for making insulting remarks on local television after Bulgaria's poor showing at Euro '96.

Stoichkov, who played a major role in making Bulgaria a World Cup semifinalist for the first time in 1994, quit the national side last year after demanding the resignation of the soccer union chiefs.

But although he was named in Bulgaria's initial squad to face Cyprus in April, he declined to accept the invitation and coach Hristo Bonev has ignored him this time.

Ironicly, though, striker Penev has been recalled along with Yordan Lechkov for the qualifier on June 8, which will be played in Bulgaria's Black Sea Port of Bourgas.

Striker Radostin Kishisev, who has been named in all World Cup qualifiers so far, has been left out.

In European Group Five Bulgaria lie second with nine points from four matches behind Israel who have 10 points from five matches.

Tapie admits his part

MARSEILLE, France, May 21: Failed tycoon and former soccer boss Bernard Tapie admitted to a French court on Tuesday that he had been used to bribe rival players to lose a 1993 match, reports Reuter.

"There was no need to use intermediaries to buy these matches, at least in the case of the money for Valenciennes—it was cash from ticket sales for the European Cup final against Milan," Tapie said.

But pressed for details by a lawyer for the French Soccer Federation, Tapie, who is standing trial while serving out an earlier jail sentence for match-rigging and interfering with witnesses, quickly backed away from the statement.

"But I never said that," he responded when told what he had said. In any case, the disclosure was not a "scoop," he added.

"It certainly was a scoop. You have never said it before," responded the lawyer.

The 54-year-old rags-to-riches businessman, who also pursued a promising career as a politician before ending up in jail as bankrupt prisoner, is accused of embezzling 100 million francs (17.5 million dollars) from his Marseille club.

He went to jail three months ago when the French Supreme Court upheld his eight-month

sentence for bribing players of league rival Valenciennes to give Marseille an easy game days before Marseille beat AC Milan in the 1993 Cup final.

Nineteen other soccer figures are standing trial along with Tapie in the Marseille case, which opened on May 12 and is expected to last another two weeks.

He faces a five-year sentence if convicted on charges of swindling, misusing corporate funds and falsifying documents between 1987 and 1993.

An investigating magistrate has accused Tapie of falsifying accounts to conceal bonuses and loans to players and illegally paying advertising companies based in tax havens to improve the image of soccer stars.

Tapie has said he can justify the sums that were spent.

His statement on the lack of need for intermediaries in the Valenciennes bribes came during questioning of Portuguese sports intermediary Miguel Barbosa by judge Guy Richarte.

Barbosa insisted a missing 2.3 million francs given him in connection with the transfer of Brazilian player Jose Carlos Mozer to Marseille from Lisbon's Benfica had not been used for bribes to throw matches.

Instead, he kept the money for himself, investing it in companies, Barbosa testified.

Derby sign Eranio

DERBY, England, May 21: English Premier league club Derby signed Italian international midfielder Stefano Eranio from AC Milan on Tuesday, reports Reuter.

Eranio, who is out of contract in the summer, has agreed a three-year deal. Derby manager Jim Smith said.

He won his 30th Italy cap against Poland last month and has been included in the squad for the Tournoi de France next month when Italy play England, Brazil and France.

Ronaldo, Baggio changing clubs?

MILAN, May 21: Brazilian star Ronaldo could be on his way from Barcelona to Inter Milan next season, the Italian press reported today, while Manchester United have their eyes on Roberto Baggio, reports AFP.

Ronaldo, whose goals have guided Barcelona to the European Cup Winners' Cup and second place in the Spanish league, is widely expected to leave the Catalan Club at the end of the season.

Serie A rivals Lazio had been a front-runner for the 20-year-old but all three of Italy's sports newspapers reported today that Inter president Massimo Moratti has matched their offer.

The Spanish club are expected to ask 25 million to 30 million dollars for FIFA's world-player-of-the-year, while Ronaldo himself is demanding a four million dollar a year salary.

The contract would run until 2005.

Moratti's club has the financial backing of Italian tycoon Gianpiero Pirelli, who would like to develop their business interests in South America, while Inter have more cachet that Lazio in European football.

Ironicly, Moratti's interest comes only a year after he withdraw from negotiations to buy Ronaldo from Dutch club PSV Eindhoven, claiming the hugely talented striker was too expensive.

However, Ronaldo's future was not the only one to shake the Italian transfer market on Tuesday.

With Eric Cantona unexpectedly announcing his retirement on Sunday, Manchester United have reportedly joined Olympique Marseille as candidates to buy Baggio from AC Milan.

Baggio, only now sure of a regular first team place, has so far shown little appetite for English football.

However, the pony-tailed striker would be guaranteed championships league football next season, with Alex Ferguson, while Milan would be willing to trade if United's offer for the 30-year-old is big enough.
