

The wooden-floor squash complex of Dhaka Club plays host from May 24-31 to the Bangladesh Squash Open, the first-ever international squash tournament of the country. In all, 12 teams including four from India will compete in the team event, organised by the Bangladesh Squash Rackets Federation and sponsored by Hotel Purbani.

May 31. The organisers expect to hold this event on an annual basis with more international participation from regional countries in future. At the same time, they also intend to send more local players to overseas tournaments to raise the standard of squash in Bangladesh.

Squash enthusiasts of the country are eagerly anticipat-

The Indian charge will be led by the Calcutta Racket Club and Saturday Club, while the local contenders include the starstudded Biman team, followed by Dhaka Club Blues and Greens, Peregrine, British High Commission Club, Gulshan Club, Dhaka Tigers and Dhaka Panthers.

Newly-appointed Bangladesh Squash Rackets Federation president, Lt. Col. Muhammad Faruk Khan, PSC. (retd), MP, is hopeful that the tournament will provide a much-needed fillip to the promotion and development of the

game in this country. The tournament will kick off today at 5 pm with Biman taking on Calcutta Racket Club-3, followed by Dhaka Club Blues against Dhaka Panthers. The 12 teams will first compete in a round robin league with the top two teams from each group entering the knockout stage. The final is scheduled to be held on ing a feast of matches. Players to watch Ravindra Malik, the number 4 seeded player in India, Deepak Agarwalla, the number 2 seed in Calcutta, and Jay Shrestha, the reigning national champion from Nepal.

Among the local players there will be: Sohel Hamid, the reigning national champion and Bhola Lal Chauhan, presently number 2 but national champion for the last 8 years. ing at the Game of Cricket fetching the highest sum. The book, which dates back to 1804, was sold for 5.520 pounds, making it a wise investment for the last buyer who

Johnson, Bailey in record books

bought it for 58 pounds in 1966.

MONTE CARLO, Monaco, May 23: It took nearly 10 months, but sprinters Michael Johnson and Donovan Bailey finally got their names in the record books, reports AP.

The International Amateur Athletic Federation on Wednesday formally ratified the world records set by the two at last summer's Atlanta Olympics -Johnson's 19.32 seconds in the 200 metres and Bailey's 9.84 in the 100.

IAAF spokesman Giorgio Reineri said it took so long to ratify the records because of delays in obtaining the paperwork from US track officials.

Reineri said there were also delays in getting paperwork on doping control from the International Olympic Committee. Like all medalists at the games, Johnson and Bailey submitted to urine tests, and both passed. However, because of the bu-

reaucratic delays, the IAAF never ratified Johnson's previous world record of 19.66 seconds, set at the US Olympic trials in Atlanta. Johnson and Bailey will

meet June 1 at Toronto's Sky-Dome in a 150-metre match race, billed as determining the world's fastest man.

Munich meet Linford's last

LONDON, May 23: Sprinter Linford Christie, captain of the British team for the past eight years, will lead the team for the last time at next month's European Cup in Munich, reports

The June 21-22 meet will mark the final international appearance for Britain of the former world and Olympic 100metre champion.

Christie has captained Britain at every European Cup - and both Olympic Games -Since 1989. He has a record 11 individual victories in the European Cup's 100 and 200-metre events.
