In an interview with The Daily Star yesterday, Fujimori spoke candidly about his visit to Bangladesh as well as Peru's fight against terrorist groups like the Shining Path and Tupac Amaru.

Shining Path leader Abumel Guzman was sentenced to life imprisonment in Peru while Tupac Amaru commander Nestor Cerpa, who led a 126-day siege of the Japanese mission in Lima, was killed in last month's much publicised rescue of 72 hostages.

Fujimori, who earlier addressed a press conference, pointed out that there were leftist groups which commanded a lot of respect in Peru. But they were non-violent and were participating in the national development process. His country could not afford violence and terrorism, he added. Fujimori said fighting


