## Rain forecast

Rain or thundershower accompanied by temporary gusty or squally wind is likely at many places over Chittagong, Sylhet, Barisal divisions and at a few places over Dhaka, Rajshahi, Khulna divisions in the next 12 hours till 6 pm today, reports UNB.

Met Office said day temperature may remain nearly unchanged across the country.

Meantime, Dhaka experienced the highest 39 mm rain in the 36 hours till 6 pm yesterday. Dinajpur had 26 mm shower, Rangpur 25, Jessore 17, Sylhet 16, Comilla 15, Faridpur 11, Cox's Bazar 10 and Barisal 9 mm during the period.

The country's highest temperature 34.7 degree Celsius was recorded at Rajshahi and the lowest 20.5 degrees at Dinajpur and Ishurdi.

The sun sets today at 6:40 pm and rises tomorrow at 5:11 am.

## Workshop concludes

## Awareness campaign against child abuse stressed

At the concluding session of a two-day workshop on 'Sexual abuse of children', yesterday, M Azizul Haque, Inspector General of Police, commented that the current laws regarding violent acts against women and children are very strict, awarding convicted offenders a maximum punishment of the death penalty or life imprisonment. In the case of rape of a child or woman, if the victim dies, the culprit would be given the same punishment.

Haque, however, acknowledged that enforcement of these laws was a problem. "The only prevention of child abuse is to develop awareness at all levels," he said. "No matter how strict the legal measures are", he added, "this problem will not be solved unless everyone is involved in creating this awareness".

The workshop, organised by 'Breaking the Silence', a human rights group for children, was attended by school teachers, NGO officials, social activists, journalists, children and others. Sponsored by Radha Baran, the workshop was based on a report, prepared by Afas Chowdhury for Breaking the Silence, which includes numerous case studies of sexually abused children.

"There are many loopholes in the existing laws," said Shamsul Huda, Director, Association of Development Agencies in Bangladesh (ADAB). "These should be fixed by the law makers. He also pointed out that the judiciary process is very complicated, which makes it difficult for victims of child abuse to gain access to it. He reiterated that most laws need to be fundamentally changed. The police, media and entire society should all be involved in helping the victims and enforcing the law on the culprits.

Participants of the workshop were divided into groups to chalk out a plan of action to find ways to tackle the issue of child abuse.

The groups presented various strategies, including identifying the reasons behind sexual abuse and eliminating them, initiating an awareness campaign through the media, encouraging more openness among children and parents to discuss these issues, treatment rehabilitation and security of

## New body to combat trafficking of women formed

A new organisation named Trafficking Watch Bangladesh (TWB) was formed following a three-day consultation and workshop of 36 grassroots organisations in the city yesterday.

Prof Ishrat Shamim was made the convener of the newly formed network of NGOs, which aims to combat the trafficking of women and children from the country and create awareness among the people through an effective monitoring of cases.

The formation of the organisation was announced in a press conference on conclusion of the three-day consultation and workshop, held under the auspices of Centre for Women and Children Studies.

The press conference was attended, among others, by Prof Latifa Akand, Prof Khaleda Salahuddin, Farah Kabir and Prof Ishrat Shamim.

A memorandum will be submitted to the Prime Minister on the situation of trafficking of women and children from the country shortly, the organisers said.

The organisers suggested formation of an inter-ministerial cell, comprising ministries of Home Affairs, Foreign Affairs and Law and Parliamentary Affairs, to deal with the trafficking issue.






