large scale that it has created considerable depletion of the bamboo resources of those districts. Thus it has become a cause for serious concern with the authorities concerned. If this be the position in northern districts, it seems there is every reason to believe that the brick fields within our city areas are not free from making similar inroads into our bamboo and forest resources. No indications are available as to the extant the existing laws are being enforced to check the smoke pollution being caused by the brick field kilns and also the ongoing destruction of our forest and bamboo resources as a result of their use by such brick kilns.

It is a sad aspect of our city planning that some of the brick fields using such harmful materials for their kilns are allowed to operate with impunity near city areas without let or hindrance being placed on their damaging modes of operation both from the environmental and public health aspects. The Department of Environment, which have a definite role to play, seems, by its default in these respects, to be allowing the brick fields near city areas to operate with a free hand.

In this situation, the sooner the areas of operation of these brick fields are shifted outside the periphery of the city areas including the areas earmarked for inclusion in the planned expansion of the city through development of satellite townships in the near future, the better will be the prospects for a more organised civic life in our emerging mega city.

Six killed, 17 hurt in road accidents

Six people were killed and 17 others injured in road accidents in Jessore and Sylhet yesterday and the day before.

Our Jessore Correspondent reports: Three persons were killed on the spot and 15 others injured, nine of them seriously, when a Jessore-bound night coach met with an accident near Nazrul Islam College here vesterday morning.

Of the dead, two were identified as Moinuddin, 40, and his daughter Jui, 6 of Rajapur under Golapganj thana in Sylhet and S Paul of Chittagong.

According to police, the accident occurred when a night coach of Green Transport coming from Dhaka hit a roadside tree and skidded off the road. Of the injured, nine were

admitted to Jessore General Hospital. They are Probhat Paul, 35, Sumon, 20, Nazrul Arefin, 45, Bilkis, 25, Abdul Awal, 25, Abul Hasin Khan, 38, Kazi Nasiruddin, 34, Mohammad Faruk, 30, and Syed Haider, 6. The rest were released after first aid.

In Sylhet, three people, including a minor girl, were killed and two others injured in separate road accidents in the district on Wednesday, according to UNB.

Police said Ruhena Begum, 6, daughter of Modabbir Ali of village Amtail in Bishwanath thana, was run over by a speeding microbus near the thana health complex on Bishwanath-Rampasha road on Wednesday.

The body was sent to hospital morgue for autopsy. The microbus driver fled the scene.

Kudsia Begum, 60, who was seriously injured in an accident at Ambarkhana in the town, succumbed to her injuries at the Osmani Medical College Hospital on Wednesday.

On the same day, Salik Mia, 30, a hotel owner, was killed and two others injured when their private car collided with a passenger bus near Raypura on Sylhet-Dhaka highway.

The injured were sent to a local clinic in critical condition.

The study will examine alternative arrangements that may be appropriate in this regard, including establishment of a centre for settlement of commercial and investment disputes. It will also estimate the cost of creation of an office of Ombudsman.

According to them the extremely limited capacity of the Law Ministry is a major constraint in decision making on key business-related issues.

Besides, the Ministry of Law also acts as the clearing house for all proposed legislation rules and regulations, which could be another major delaying factor constraining the government's ability to implement the private sector-oriented policies, the sources pointed

The study will examine and evaluate these practices and the volume of business and the complexity of the work of the ministry.

Citing last year's experience, a DSE member explained that in the process of manipulation, a section of DSE members buy some "selected shares" at 10 per cent higher rate to lure the general investors and when the price reaches up to their "target", they release a bulk of stocks at higher rates and make good profit.

However, a DSE councillor, while refuting this said it is very difficult for the brokers to influence the market because their investment in the capital market comprises only 2 percent of the total DSE market capitalisation.

He said the total investment of the 195 DSE members will not be more than Tk 300 crore against Tk 10 thousand crore market capitalisation of the DSE. "How can such a small amount influence that big investment market?" he argued.

The DSE officials said almost 99 per cent of DVP deal in the DSE is being settled within



Minister tells BEA seminar

GDP to reach 8.2pc at the end of FFYP

State Minister for Planning and Civil Aviation Dr Mohiuddin Khan Alamgir yesterday said that the gross domestic product (GDP) would steadily increase and reach 8.2 per cent at the end of the next Fifth Five Year Plan (FFYP) to be placed in parliament on June 30, reports BSS.

"Although on an average 7 per cent GDP has been targetted in the FFYP, it may go up after implementation of the programmes taken in the FFYP." he told the concluding session of a national seminar on "Bangladesh's Economy: Present Policy Structure and Fu-

ture Challenge" in the city. Bangladesh Economic Association (BEA) organised the seminar which was addressed, among others, by Dr Rehman Sobhan, Prof Anisur Rahman, Dr Mahbub Hossain Khan. Workers Party General Secretary Rashed Khan Menon, World Bank Resident Mission chief Pierre M Landel Mills. Dr Wahiduddin Mahmud President of the BEA presided over the

Dr Alamgir said the main objective of the FFYP is to alleviate poverty which is a political commitment of the Awami League government.

He said the investment tar get has been projected in the FFYP at 22 per cent from the present 18 per cent, an increase of 4 per cent of which 2 per cent will come from foreign direct investment (FDI) and 2 per cent from the domestic resources.

The planning minister said the GDP would reach 5.7 per cent at the end of the current fiscal year which indicates a good sign of the economy. The country did not see such a high growth in the past, he added.

Dr Alamgir said the FFYP has focussed an expansion of the public and private sector investment particularly in the field of agriculture. The government has earmarked 22 per cent investment from the public sector and 13 per cent from the private sector investment in the agriculture sector. The planning minister said
