



Taylor agreed to step down?

SYDNEY, June 2: Australian cricket captain Mark Taylor has told close friends he will step down from the Test team after a run of low scores and a recent torrent of criticism, Sydney's Daily Telegraph newspaper reported today, reports Reuter.

"Captain Mark Taylor has decided to step down from the Australian cricket team for the first Ashes Test, finally conceding defeat after 18 months of disastrous form," the tabloid newspaper said in a front page

"Taylor has told only a close circle of friends about his decision," the Telegraph said. The report was written after Taylor scored five in the first innings of a three-day match

against Derbyshire, but before

his overnight 59 not out in the second innings of that match. The second innings halfcentury was only Taylor's third first class 50 in 18 months and he has not scored a Test halfcentury since late 1995.


