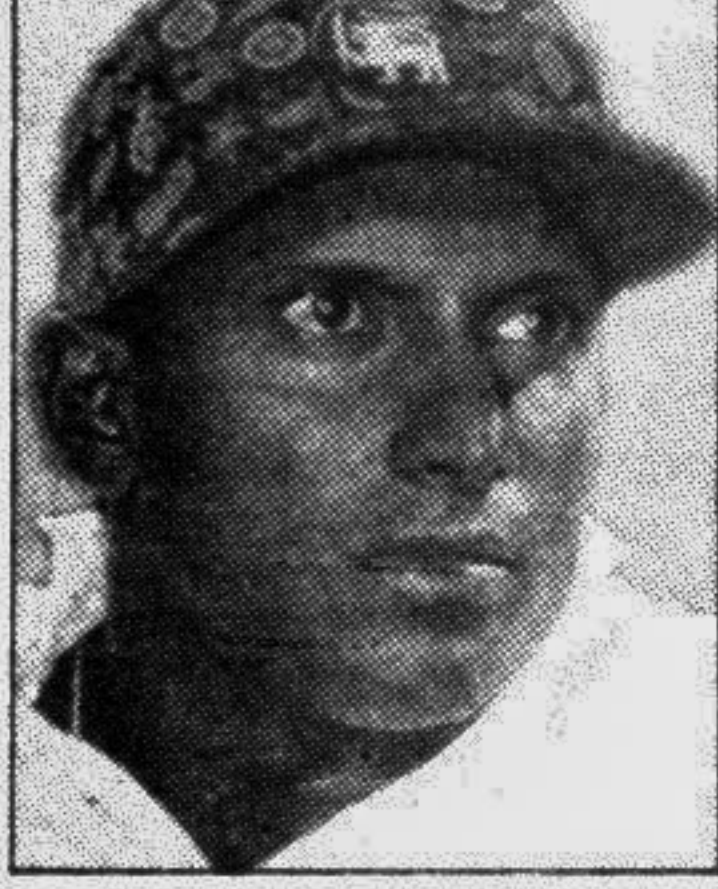

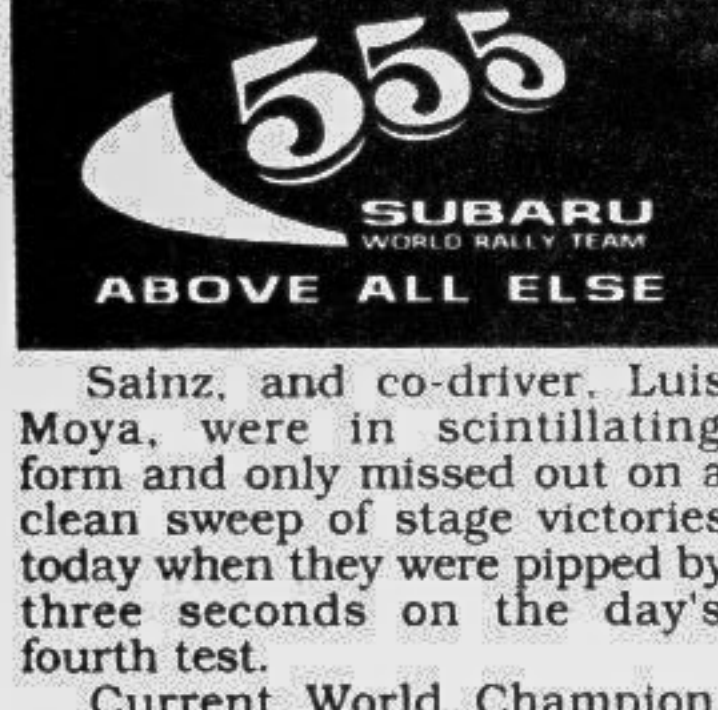

Three more events were finalised in the BAF Inter base swimming championship held at the National Swimming Pool, Mirpur yesterday, says a press release.



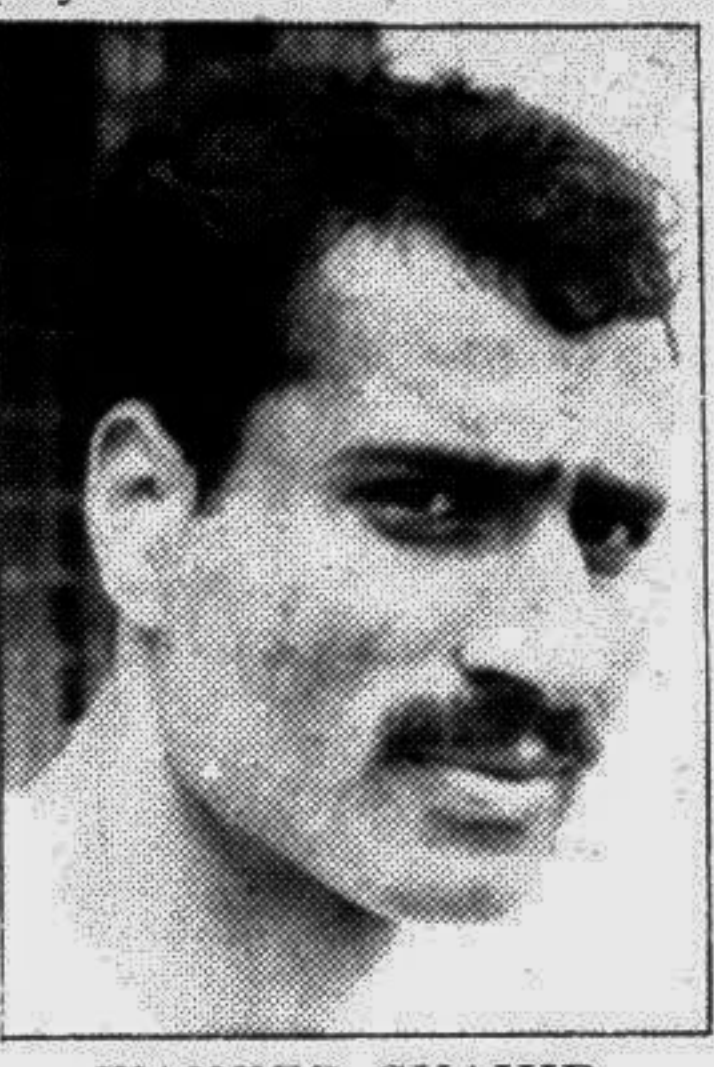

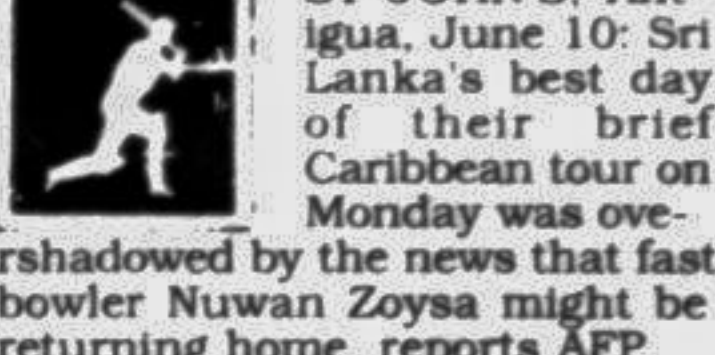
Stadium issue raised in JS

The government has taken up a massive plan to develop sports facilities, particularly for cricket, across the country, reports BSS.

Replying to a question from the opposition BNP legislator Jafrul Islam Chowdhury, State Minister for LGRD Syed Abul Hossain, on behalf of the State Minister for Youth and Sports, told the Jatiya Sangsad yesterday that the National Sports Council would build an exclusive cricket stadium at Moghbar within one year.

One playing ground, a pavilion, a 3,000-capacity gallery, an improvised swimming pool and a gymnasium would be included in the complex on 10 acres, he said.

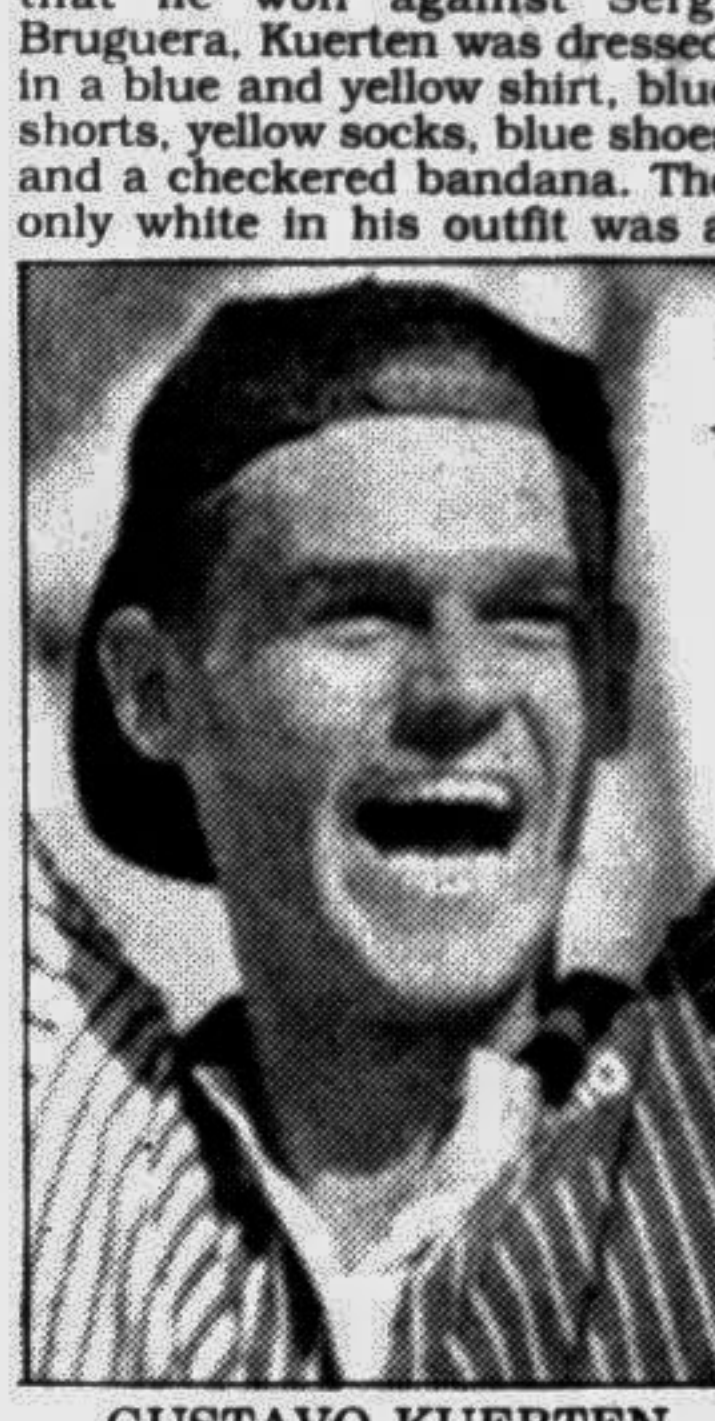
