INDIANAPOLIS, June 10 Several world-class athletes, including Olympic stars Michael Johnson and Carl Lewis will be missing when the US national championships start here on Wednesday, reports Reuter.

Big attractions Johnson and Lewis won't even be in town, and world record-holders Dan O'Brien and Mike Powell have bowed out because they, like Johnson, are injured.

Mary Slaney, the queen of American Runners, also is unlikely to participate, but not by choice. The 38-year-old Slaney is under IAAF suspension for a doping test at last year's Olympic trials, and US officials are not expected to defy the IAAF edict although they have not suspended her.

Against this background of intrigue and uncertainty American athletics is likely to experience the beginning of a changing of the guard, coaches and officials say.

While Olympic champions Allen Johnson Derrick Adkins. Charles Austin, Kenny Harrison, Randy Barnes and Gail Devers and women's 400-metre world record holder Kim Batten seem certain to secure World Championships berths in the five-day qualifier, new faces also are expected to emerge.



Inter struck a deal with Ronaldo's agents last week, agreeing to pay a reported 26 million dollar fee stipulated in buy-out clause in his contract with the Catalan club. Barcelona, however, have

since claimed that the buy-out clause was only valid for moves within Spain, and could not be extended to other countries. This would enable Barcelona

to either keep the 20-year-old goal-scoring phenomenon - or negotiate an even higher price for him from Inter.

Moratti, though, said it was unlikely he would be meeting with Barcelona president Josep Nunez in the near future.
