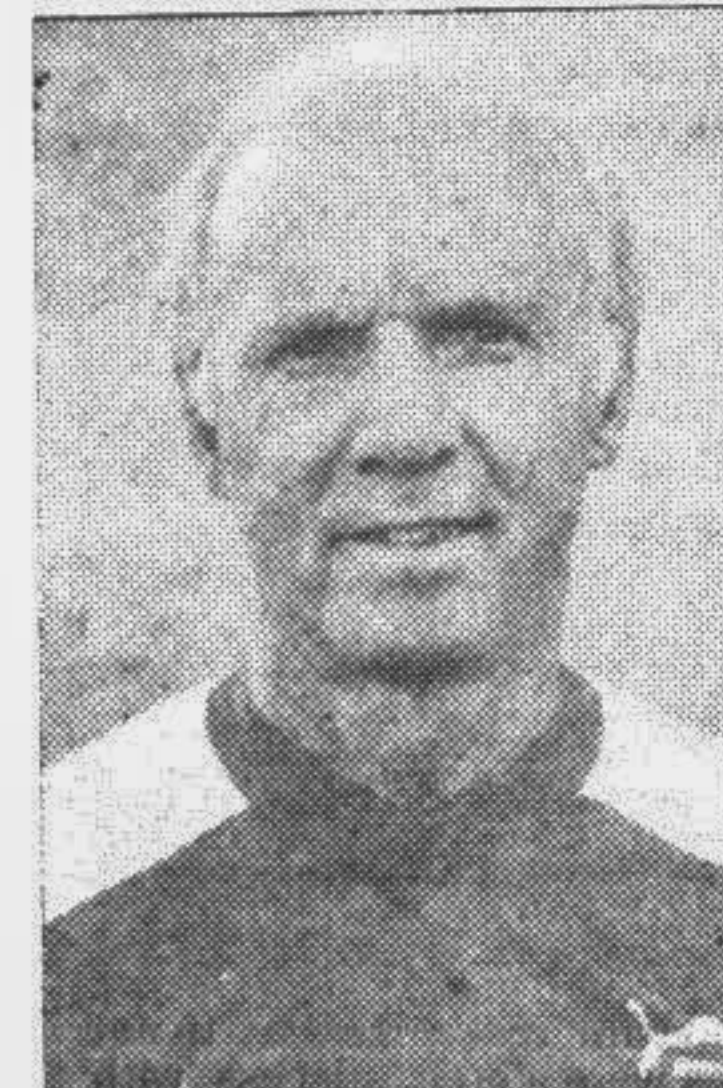

On the other hand, after seven wins and two draws, it was first defeat for the Ajax youngsters in the league which kept them glued to their previous collection of 23 points.

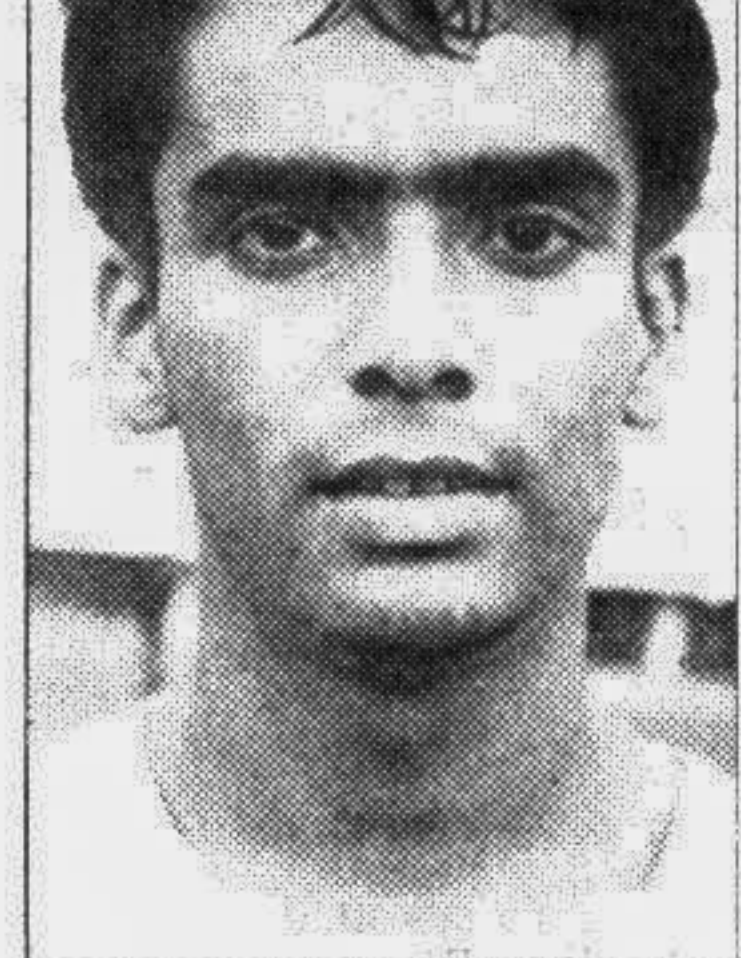

Ebiende gets 1-year jail

BRUSSELS, June 11: Nigerian midfielder Emmanuel Ebiende of Belgian soccer club Aalst has been given a one-year jail sentence, mostly suspended, for indecently assaulting a 14-year-old girl, a Belgian prosecutor's office said on Tuesday, reports Reuters.

"He has been sentenced to 12 months, nine of which are suspended, for indecent assault..." Dendermonde public prosecutor's office spokesman Tom Lamiroy said.

Ebiende, 19, was arrested in April and accused of having violently raped the girl, but the Dendermonde court later reduced the charges.

Lamiroy said the prosecutor's office was considering appealing against the sentence.

The club was not immediately available for comment on Ebiende, whose contract expires in two years' time.

IAAF ratifies

Kipketer's marks

MONTE CARLO, June 11: Wilson Kipketer's 800-metre world indoor records were officially ratified Wednesday by the International Amateur Athletic Federation, reports AP.

Kipketer, a native of Kenya now living in Denmark, obliterated the indoor mark twice at the World Indoor Championships in Paris in March.

On March 7, he ran 1 minute 43.96 seconds, wiping out the old mark of 1:44.84 set in 1989 by Kenyan Paul Ereng. In the finals two days later, Kipketer smashed the record again — this time beating his own time — with a new standard of 1:42.67.

Kipketer, who was kept out of the 1996 Olympics because he lacked Danish citizenship, will run in August for Denmark in the worlds outdoors in Athens. He is expected to challenge the world outdoor mark of 1:41.73 held by Britain's Sebastian Coe. Kipketer has the second-fastest time outdoors of 1:41.83.

Torrence joins absentees

INDIANAPOLIS, June 11: Injured defending world 100-metre champion Gwen Torrence withdrew from the US Championships on Tuesday, depriving August's World Championships of yet another American star, reports Reuters.

Torrence, who has been slowed by knee and leg injuries most of the spring, had planned to run the 200 metres at the championships, which start today. "But that is not going to happen," her husband and coach, Manley Waller said.

World record-holders Michael Johnson, Dan O'Brien and Mike Powell also have withdrawn from the meeting because of injuries.

All are ineligible for the World Championships under US rules which limit US world team members to the top three finishers in the national meet.

Turk club run after Rekdal

ISTANBUL, June 11: Turkish club Trabzonspor have made an offer to French club Rennes for Norwegian international midfielder Kjetil Rekdal, according to reports in the Turkish press on Tuesday, reports Reuters.

No details of the offer have been made public and, according to a spokesman at Rennes, nothing has been signed.

AUCKLAND, New Zealand, June 11: New Zealand avenged an earlier 1-0, defeat to beat Papua New Guinea 7-0 in a World Cup qualifying Oceania Group soccer match on Wednesday night, reports AP.

Vaughan Coveny scored three goals for New Zealand while Winton Rufer added a pair at North Harbour Stadium. New Zealand led 5-0 at halftime.

Lankans limber up well



ST JOHN'S, June 11: Sri Lanka's batsmen gained valuable batting practice ahead of Friday's first cricket Test against West Indies as their three-day first class tour match against Leeward Islands ended in a draw at the Recreation ground on Tuesday, reports AFP.

Centuries from Russell Arnold and Marvan Atapattu, along with a half-century from Aravinda de Silva, pumped up Sri Lanka's total to 398 for four declared.

When play was called off with 11 overs remaining, Leeward, trailing by 44 on first innings, reached 120 without loss at stumps with Alex Adams unbeaten on 68 and Junie Mitchum on 50 not out.

Sri Lanka, 213 for one overnight, did not declare their second innings until after lunch.

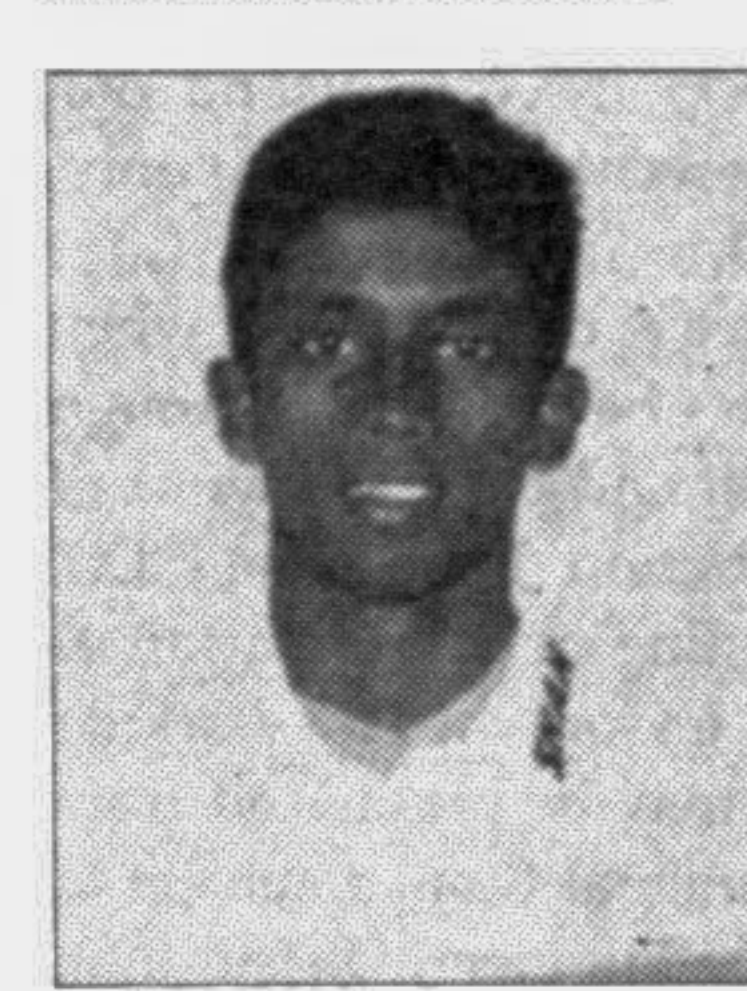
They used the opportunity of a modest attack and ideal conditions to gain form and confidence ahead of the Test matches to be played here from June 13 to 17 and in Kingstown from June 20 to 24.

Arnold unbeaten on 104 overnight finished on 185 and extended his partnership with Atapattu (118) to 242 for the second wicket which was the hub upon which Sri Lanka built

their total.

Towards the end of the innings, De Silva, Sri Lanka's premier batsman, gathered 80 and shared 56 for the third wicket with Arnold before he became the last of left-arm spin bowler Warrington Phillips' two wickets.

Using the relaxed atmosphere of the final period of the match, Mitchum and Adams, two of the Leeward's promising players enhanced their reputations in completing half-centuries bringing Sri Lanka's bowlers back down to earth.

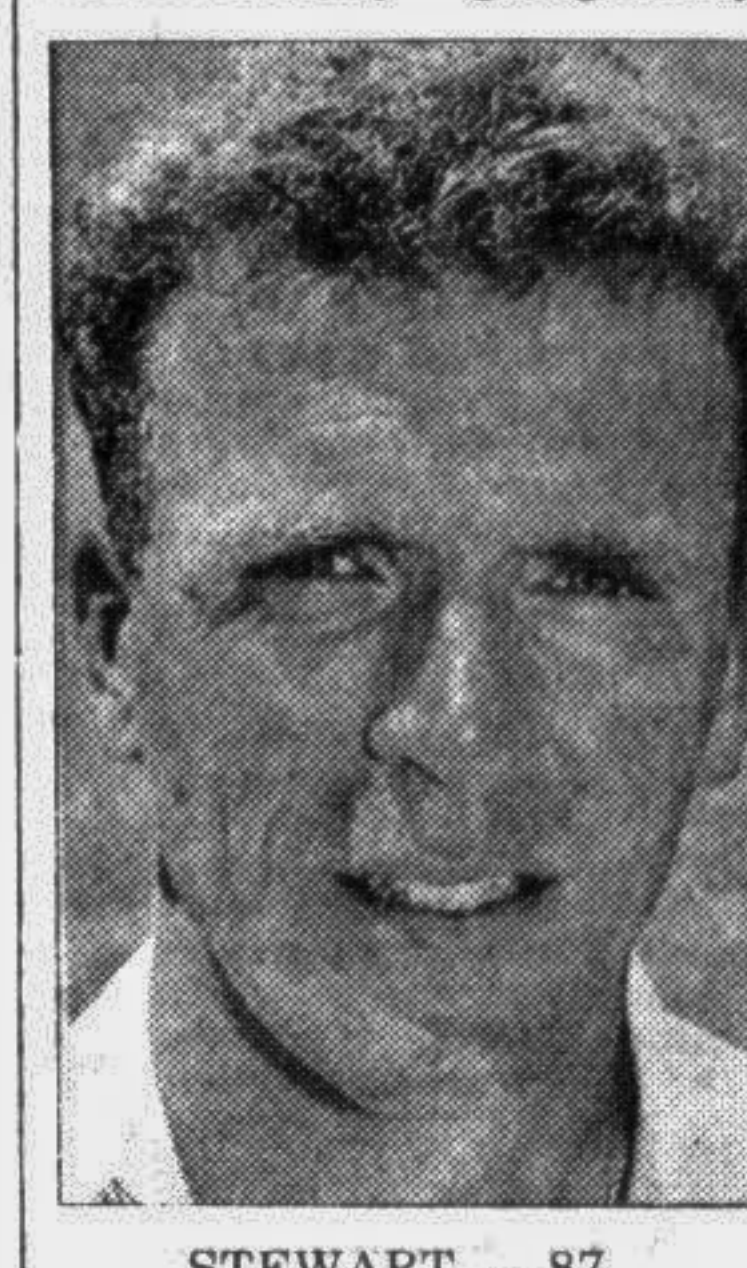

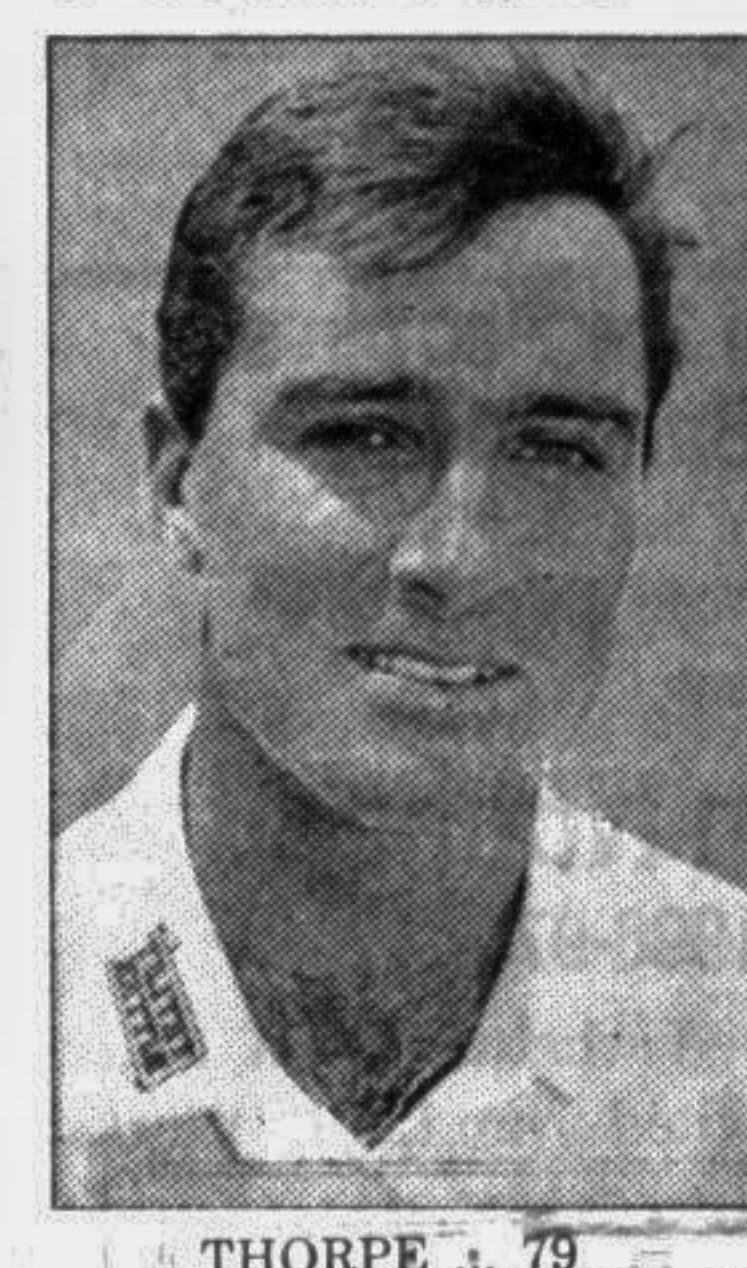
