Mohammedans scrape thru'

A late strike from defender Zahirul Islam Mitul enabled Mohammedan Sporting Club duck a possible debacle during their Green Delta Insurance First Division hockey league tie against a Sonali Bank at the National Hockey stadium yesterday.
Mitul broke the evening's duck in the 68th minute with a firm drive from just inside the opponent box much to the relief of a strong band of black and white supporters as Mohammedans managed to scrape through.
Although Sonali Bank were never been a champion force in the past, but the ordinary team recently developed a habit to stun their awe-inspiring opponents with upset results.
For record's sake it was Sonali Bank, who handed Mohammedans their last league defeat (1-2) in 1989. Since then the reputed Motijheel outfit have never lost a match in a record 83 league appearance.
But, the slimy outcome, however, hardly reflected the course of yesterday's game. It were Mohammedans who made

a heavy weather of an easy win. The holders, buoyed by the presence of a fresh Pakistan cap Waheed Shahid, dominated the entire proceedings. But with their forwards engaging in an exhibition of poor marksmanship, a mind boggling total of 29 short corners went down the drain. Mitul was one of the culprits who failed to capitalise most of those free hits. The national left-half, who later amended his blunders by scoring the all-important goal, miserably failed to even stop most of Mohammedans' 15 penalty corners in the first 35 minutes.
Situation hardly improved in the second session when Mohammedans did everything but to find the target, to break the jinx. Waheed, who made a rusty debut in the Dhaka hockey last evening, was pushed to upfront from his customary position in the left-half. But the tall Pakistani had failed to live up to his reputation.
Mohammedans' misery compounded when Ashik and Waheed shot the ball wide from a hand shaking distance in successive attempt midway through the second half. At times it looked the match was heading for an obvious draw be-

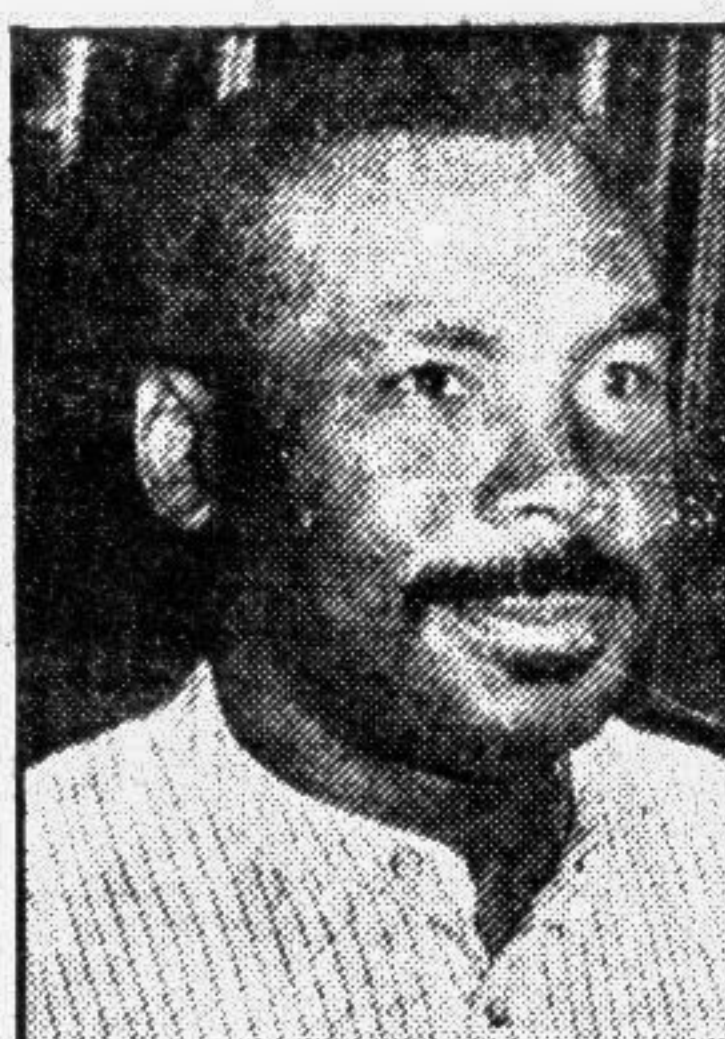


It was a dream come true when ICC, cricket's world governing body awarded Bangladesh with one-day status at the organisation's annual meeting at Lord's on Sunday. The decision, considered to be the gateway to the ultimate prize — entrance into the Test arena, however, proved no surprise to many of our cricket personalities as the whole nation was ready to hear the declaration, especially after the ICC Trophy triumph in Malaysia April last.

While talking to The Daily Star yesterday, most of the local cricket experts hailed the news and said it was very much on the cards. Following are excerpts:

Gordon Cuthbert
Greenidge

Coach Greenidge, who helped Bangladesh to their maiden ICC Trophy victory with his inspirational guidance and motivation, was bit cautious while expressing his opinion.
He said, "Of course it's very

good news but nothing to be carried away by as Bangladesh has to go long way in next two years before reaching their main target of playing Tests. In the next two years, the whole cricketing world will keenly observe us.

"Nobody will expect us to win a match against a Test-playing nation, but the most important thing is to how Bangladesh play.

Shafiqul Haque Hira

Hira, the former national captain in the first and second ICC Trophies in 1979 and 1982, said Bangladesh deserved the inclusion.

Talking over telephone from Chittagong, the former wicket-keeper-cum batsman, said, "I am very happy. It is only the beginning of our journey to reach the ultimate goal of playing Test cricket and I think this will help us in the coming days."
"I think the board should bring one bowling expert from England to teach our youngsters about art of seam bowling."

Gazi Ashraf Hossain Lipu

The manager was calm and quite. Talking after lunch with the newly selected national team at the Dhaka Stadium yesterday, Lipu, who led Bangladesh in the third and fourth ICC Trophies in 1986 and 1990, said, "This (one day status) has imposed a great responsibility on us and so we have to play better from now on to prove ourselves worthy of the status."

Minhazul Abedin Nannu

The former captain and most experienced member of the national team was also found in a happy mood.
"I can not express in words. It's an amazing moment of my life and I am proud of being a cricketer today," said Nannu.
"I think this will help us in changing the whole picture of our cricket infrastructure which is completely Dhaka based. Cricket has to be decen-

tralised if we want to play Tests in future," Nannu added.
UNB adds: State Minister for Youth and Sports Obaidul Quader has congratulated Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) for achieving One-Day International status.

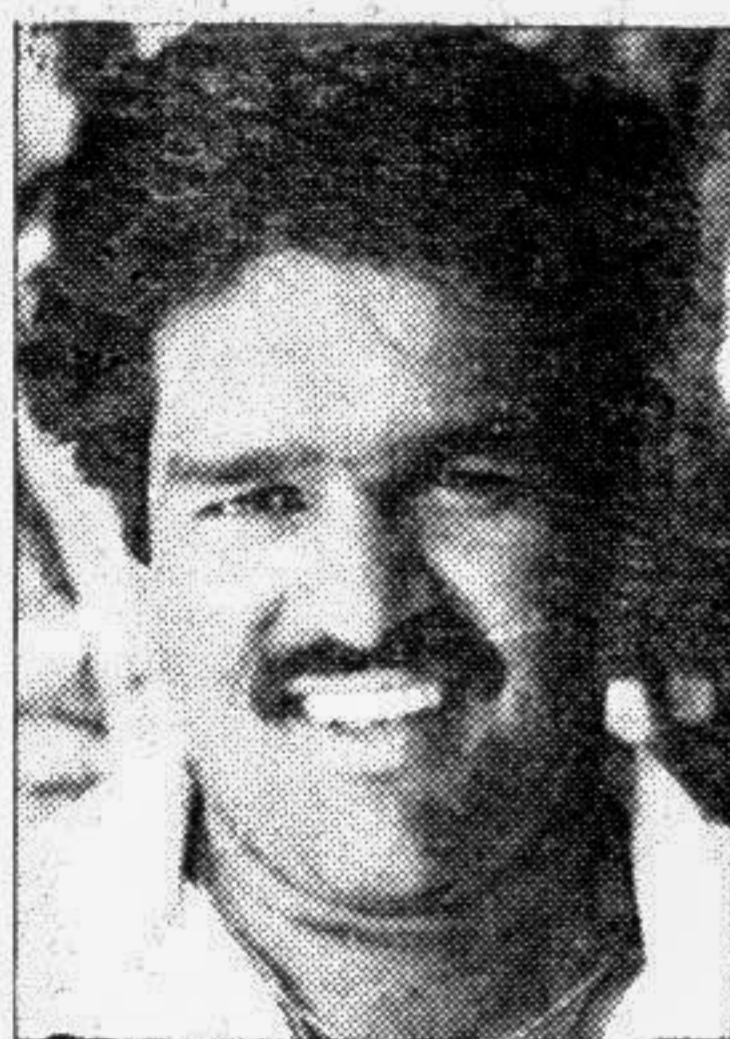
The State Minister also thanked the International Cricket Council (ICC), the world cricket body, for awarding due recognition to Bangladesh.

Akram Khan

Talking to Akram is always a pleasure and there was no exception when the stocky but most successful Bangladesh captain was expressing his feelings yesterday.

Some solace for Barca



MADRID, June 16: With nothing but their pride left to gain in the Spanish league FC Barcelona lived up to their promise to play hard Sunday and rolled over Betis 3-0, report agencies.

In a match whose meaning was made empty by Real Madrid's championship victory Saturday, Barcelona vowed to play hard against a Betis side they will face in two weeks in the final of Spain's Cup.
Real Madrid's convincing victory Saturday over Atletico Madrid ruined any hopes Barcelona had to prevent their arch-rival from winning their 27th league title.

Barcelona striker Oscar Carrol, playing in place of departed star Brazilian forward Ronaldo, tallied his side's first goal at minute 44.

Bulgarian striker Hristo Stoichkov netted the team's second score at minute 75 and Spanish national team member Luis Enrique Martinez scored the third at minute 83.

In Madrid, work crews spent Sunday morning cleaning up from the massive celebration held by Real Madrid's players and coaches at the downtown Plaza de Cibeles.

The rally, attended by more than 500,000 people, continued well into the early morning hours. About 20 people were treated for injuries caused by sudden surges by the packed crowd.
But victory jubilation was tempered by news that the 6-year-old son of the team's doctor, Alfonso del Corral, died at a Madrid hospital Sunday morning, a few hours after being struck in the head by a garage door at the family's home.

At the other end of the table, Sporting Gijon beat Rayo Vallecano 3-0 to lift themselves out of danger and leave Rayo deep in trouble.

Needing to win to escape certain relegation, Extremadura dispatched fellow strugglers Celta Vigo 2-0.

In other matches Sunday, it was Valladolid 1, Hercules 0; Valencia 2, Oviedo 1; Sevilla 3, Espanyol 1; Logrones 1, Racing Santander 1; Compostela 1, Real Sociedad 2; Tenerife 3, Zaragoza 3.

INDIANAPOLIS, June 16: Newly crowned US sprint queen Marion Jones outdueled her idol, Jackie Joyner-Kersey, with the long jump of her life to conclude a sensational week at the US Athletics Championships on Sunday, reports Reuter.

The 21-year-old former college basketball player leaped a world-leading 6.93 metres (22 feet, 9 inches) to claim her second gold medal of the week.
"I'm overwhelmed," said Jones, who Thursday won the women's 100 metres after producing the year's fastest time of 10.92 seconds the previous night.

"It was a great experience to jump against one of my idols and to come away with a personal best and win the long jump," said the former teenage star who had been away from the sport for almost two years, "It's been a great week."

Joyner-Kersey finished second with a wind-assisted 6.91 metres (22 feet, 8 inches).
The 35-year-old American legend, who is retiring after this season, had taken the lead from Jones with that mark on her fifth attempt. Then Jones delivered, "the jump of my life."

The final day of the championships also produced the year's best performances in the men's 400-metre hurdles and the women's 100-metre hurdles.
Bryan Bronson ran down Olympic and world champion Derrick Adkins on the final straight to win the 400-metre hurdles in 47.79 seconds. Adkins claimed silver in 48.00 seconds, the year's second fastest time.

Newcomer Melissa Morrison's lifetime best of 12.61 seconds decided the women's 100-metre hurdles.
World shot put champion John Godina finally made the

US World Championships team with a lifetime throw of 67.40 metres (221 feet, 7 inches) in the men's discus. Only Germany's Lars Riedel has thrown farther this year.

Godina had missed the US team in the shot by finishing fourth earlier in the week.
Only the top three finishers in each final at the national championship meet qualified for the US team for the August World Championships in Athens.
