

### Indian soldier runs amok inside camp, kills 6 officers

The soldier, who was not identified, was overpowered by others in Shopian, 50 kilometers south of Srinagar, and arrested, said Maj. Pramod Puroshottam, the spokesman.

The experts coming from USA and Singapore will technically handle it to contain the fire by using chemicals, Noor Uddin Khan said.

Talking to newsmen at his parliament office the Energy Minister said there was no scope for further damage and the extent of damage was limited to a rig, few other drilling equipment and the investment made by the Occidental for the

Khan said the fire would not affect the reserve of the field, estimated at about half a trillion cubic feet, as it is still far below. The blowout took place when the Occidental rig dug in 840

metres. The well is at least at 3,500 to 4000-metre depth. He said except for the delays in the process, the loss would be borne by the company, which has already called experts from Houston, USA, and Singapore

to extinguish the fire. During exploration of gas all responsibilities lie with the drilling company with whom Production Sharing Contract (PSC) has been signed.

### NBR clarifies budget proposal on income tax return

The National Board of Revenue vesterday said that according to the provisions in the proposed budget, persons residing in the metropolitan and municipal areas and having one or more of the items - Pucca house, motor car or telephone would be required to submit in-

come tax return, reports BSS. Referring to newspaper reports, the NBR clarified that the proposal did not say that they would have to pay income tax on compulsory basis.

If an owner of the above mentioned items has an annual income over Taka 60,000, only then he will have to pay income tax according to the existing rates, the clarification said.

In this case, the tax pavers could also take advantage of self assessment of income tax.
