

## People of Magura deprived of better postal service

MAGURA, June 17: Thousands of people in the remote areas of Magura district do not get better service from the Extra Departmental Branch Post Offices (EDBPO) due to lack of office buildings, furniture and adequate staff, reliable sources said.

According to reports, there are about 50 EDBPOs in four thanas of the district. Most of the EDBPOs have no office buildings, adequate furniture and staffers.

About 70 per cent EDBPOs of the district were established during the period of British and Pakistani rule at the houses of village 'matabbars', 'zamindars', or in the premises of 'muktabs' and clubs at local initiative. The local educated rural people including teachers, retired officials came forward to set up the

Magura Head Post office, Talkhari, Dhaneswargati, Baraichara, Harisipur, Bhabanbati bazar under Arpara SO, Gangni, Panighata, Gorail, Mondolgati, Banidig, Lahiria, Kaligonj under Nohata SO, Digha, Dhoail, Palla under Muhammadpur SO, Amalsar, Karandi Dhalahachandra, Masalia under Langalbandh SO and Kazali bazar, Kutichongachi, Khamarparabazar, Barisal, Malainagar, Srikola, Hal Amtail, Sachilapur and Sirup SO.

Besides, there are some extra departmental sub-post offices including Nakol EDSO, Bindupur EDSO in the district.

The local people alleged, they do not get better service due to lack of office building, furniture and adequate number of staffers.

## Satkhira Newsletter

SATKHIRA, June 17: An unmarried young girl was allegedly gangraped by a group of miscreants at dead of night on June 11.

The victim is identified as Jamila Khatun, 17, daughter of Abdul Sheikh of village Kushodanga under the sadar thana in the district. According to police sources, one Abdul Momin, son of Motaleb Sardar of village Kushodanga under the sadar thana with his accomplices Motifuzz Islam and Sekender Ali of the same village abducted Jamila Khatun from her house at night. They took her to a date tree garden, raped her one after another the whole night and left her in an unconscious state.

The villagers after being informed by the victim's parents rushed to the spot and rescued her. She was profusely bleeding.

She was shifted to Satkhira hospital in a critical condition.

Shahidul Islam, the victim's brother filed a case with Sadar thana accusing Abdul Momin, Motifuzz and Sekender. None was arrested till writing of this report.

The villagers after being informed by the victim's parents rushed to the spot and rescued her. She was profusely bleeding.

She was shifted to Satkhira hospital in a critical condition.

Shahidul Islam, the victim's brother filed a case with Sadar thana accusing Abdul Momin, Motifuzz and Sekender. None was arrested till writing of this report.

According to police sources, housewife Farida Khanam, 18, wife of Harooner Rashid of village Banda Kati under Kaligonj thana against the Editor and Publisher of the Dainik Khabar, Mianur Rahman Mian and its Rajshahi Correspondent Nazrul Islam for publishing false, fabricated, baseless and defamatory news items entitled 'Makho Tel, Felo Kori Nititey Rajshahi Police Proshashan' on May 14, 1997.

The plaintiff alleged, the news item and the editorial published on the same news on May 16, 1997, in the same paper had injured the prestige of the plaintiff and the district police.

On the basis of the charge filed against the accused persons, the court summoned the Editor and Publisher of the Dainik Khabar and its Rajshahi Correspondent under BPC Section 500, 501 and 502. The plaintiff was assisted by Advocate Shiraj Shaokat Saleem.

In another incident, one Monju Ara Khatun, 20, wife of Hafizul Islam of village Raita under Assasun thana took poison and died on the spot.

Family trouble is the cause of her suicide, police sources said. An unnatural death (UD) case was lodged with Assasun thana.
