## Govt considering construction of tube railways in city, JS told

The government is consider-ing a long-term plan to con-struct underground railways in the capital city as part of a public transportation system to

ease traffic jam, reports UNB. Communications Minister Anwar Hossain said this in the Jatiya Sangsad Thursday while replying to a call attention notice by Shamsul Alam Pramanik who demanded tube railways in the city.

The minister said the construction of underground railways is highly technical and costly, and foreign funds will be needed for it. The government is yet to seek funds from any country, he said.

He said a short-term plan will be implemented to ease traffic congestion in the city. It includes construction of five over-bridges and improvement of the Sonargaon Hotel inter-

section. Besides, he said, Bangladesh Railway is considering a number of mass transportation projects under medium and long-term plan to be implemented during the 2000-2015 period.



# Moderate rain likely

Moderately heavy to heavy falls are likely at places in the next 12 hours till 6 pm today, reports UNB. Met Office said moderate rain or thundershower accompanied by temporary gusty wind may occur at most places

## Soldiers sacked in 1977 demand judicial inquiry

A group of armed forces members, sacked on charges of joining a mutiny in October 1977, Thursday demanded a judicial inquiry to ensure justice, reports UNB.

The non-commissioned army and air force men, under the banner of Affected Soldier Rehabilitation Association. raised the demand at a press conference at the Jatiya Press

Convenor of the association Khairul Anwar claimed the victims as innocent, saying hundreds of army and airforce personnel were victimised follow-

ing the "abortive coup." He said they (members of the armed forces) had no connection with the coup d'etat that took place on October 2, 1977. And even they did not know what actually happened in the Dhaka Cantonment in the aftermath of the coup, he told journalists.

Association leaders Nurul Islam, RM Monirul Huq, Giasuddin Ahmed, Mohammad Qader and Mosharraf Hossain also spoke.

The speakers alleged that a group of armedmen had attacked sleeping soldiers and driven them out of the barracks at dead of night on October 1. coincidentally with the end of Japanese Airlines plane hi-

jacking drama by Red Army. Ironically, they said, these very soldiers were later brutally killed on charges of being the mutineers

They said the tribunal which tried the accused was not constituted according to military rules. None of them was given a chance for self-defence, they

According to their assessment, a total of about 1,400 personnel were hanged, whose bodies could not be traced. Some 600 military personnel were jailed and 1400 dismissed.

Recalling the coup, they said it was an arranged game which, they indicated, was designed by late President Ziaur Rahman to

consolidate his power. In the press conference, they placed a five-point demand including publishing a white pa-per on the incident and a list with photographs of the soldiers either killed, jailed or sacked, identifying and openly trying the real villains and conspirators of the plot, and trying the members and judge of the 1977 military tribunal.

#### 86 arrested

Police arrested 86 people on various charges from different parts of the city in last 24 hours, a DMP press release said, reports UNB.

Of them, 21 were detained against warrants of arrest and 24 others for killing, dactity, snatching, extortion and terrorism . . . . . .

same time. The patients will have to bear the minimum expenditure fixed by the hospital.

On this day in 1992, more than 100 journalists were injured when police at the instruction of the then BNP government stormed the press club and attacked the journalists.

BFUJ President Iqbal Sobhan Chowdhury, secretary general Abul Kalam Azad and acting DUJ president Shubha Rahman and general secretary Azizul Islam Bhuiyan in a statement urged the journalists to attend the rally.


