Dousing of gasfield fire may be delayed

Flame comes down to below 50 ft

2 burnt alive, 400 shanties gutted at Maghbazar

By Staff Correspondent Two children were burnt alive and some 300 people rendered homeless in a fire that also gutted at least 400 shanties at a slum in Maghbazar area of the city Saturday night.

The charred remains of the children were found when the local people and the homeless slum dwellers were removing the debris yesterday morning. Police took the bodies of the children, aged between five and eight, to the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH), ac-

cording to Ramna police. According to hospital sources, one of the two was identified as Jyotsna. Police said none came to claim the bodies or file any complaint about any missing person.

Fire brigade sources said, about 30 small shops were also gutted in the fire which broke out at about 8 pm and fast engulfed the slum near the Maghbazar kutcha bazaar.

However, the cause of the fire could not be known till last night.
