

### Calypso coverage runs huge loss

ST MICHAEL, Barbados, June 23: Weak corporate advertising and the high cost of production contributed to a 500,000 dollars loss for the Caribbean Broadcasting Union for its coverage of the Indian national cricket team's tour of the West Indies in April and May, reports AP.

The CBU, a regional consortium of broadcasters which provides programming mainly to the English-speaking islands of the Caribbean, issued a statement saying it remains committed to airing the West Indies cricket matches, but "the existing level of loss is unbearable. The CBU cannot do this alone.

The CBU reaches about 5 million people in the Caribbean with sports and news programming in English. Recently, Cuba's state-controlled media allowing that nation to broadcast the group's programming. About 8 million potential viewers in Cuba could be added to the CBU's reach, though the programming would have to be
