

The official answers being debated at the UN Earth Summit were not encouraging — a choice between 'worse' Vice President Al Gore said as he welcomed leaders and envoys from 170 nations to New York to review progress since the 1992 Earth Summit in Rio de Janeiro, reports AP.

"We must unite to meet the challenge of climate change ... to protect the world's forests." Many delegates hoped the United States, the world's No. 1 polluter, would take the lead in setting clean-up goals. particularly on the tough issue of global warming. But it was Germany's Helmut Kohl who promised an action plan for Earth Summit Plus 5.
