MANIKGANJ, June 24: Leader of the Opposition Begum Khaleda Zia today warned of a movement to topple the government if it tries to rig the Manikganj byelection sched-uled for June 30, reports UNB.

The BNP chairperson said if the government tried to rig the election, tamper result of the polling or indulge in any other manipulation, her party would launch such a movement as will compel the government to quit.

She was addressing a huge public meeting at Saturia High School ground in the afternoon. It was organised by district BNP in support of the party candidate in the byelection, Abdul Wahab Khan.

"I've come here to meet you with a demand ... the demand for your valuable vote ... I always consider you as my close kins ... So I've the right to make this demand," Begum Zia told the cheering people amidst

From Staff Correspondent CHITTAGONG, June 24: Four persons, including two women, were burnt alive and seven others seriously injured when a microbus and a dead body caught fire carrying them in Colonelhat area of Pahartoli on the Dhaka-Chittagong highway Monday night.

The dead were identified as Rono Das, 9, Putul Rani Das, 40, Niati Rani Dhar, 40, and Nipul Kanti Day, 18.

The injured were admitted to the Chittagong Medical College Hospital and clinics.

Police said, the microbus on way to Bhatiary from a clinic at Panchlaish skidded off the road when the driver lost control of the vehicle and caught fire im mediately killing the four occupants and also burning the deadbody. The seven other occupants
