

From page 1 Karo Kaitha, and their eggs are on sale in the markets in large quantities. This turtle weighs between 300 and 900 grams.

Upto May 1997, the Forestry Department issued licences for exporting 415 tonnes of Lissemys punctata, Kachuga Tecta and Geochelone Elongata tur-The study says a massive

quantity of turtles are smuggled

through different points of the country. Since India and Nepal banned export of turtles, smugglers use Bangladesh as their transit point. Moreover, lack of monitoring allows traders to export rare varieties of turtles under the name of some comincome target includes Tk 96 mon varieties.
