Company spokesman Paul Duffy said Jordan, the richest commercial spokesman in sports for the sixth consecutive year last year with 38 million dollars in product endorsement money, would not receive upfront money under the deal.

Instead Jordan, who earlier this month led his team to a fifth National Basketball Association title in seven years, will receive CBS Sportsline stocks and a percentage of advertising revenues and merchandise sales, he added.



The rainfall that has disrupted Wimbledon could make this the wettest June in England

in a century. A total of 103 millimetres fell through 9 am (0800 GMT) Thursday, closing in on the record figure of 105 for June 1987 — the wettest June in 10 years. The wettest June of the century was 129 in 1982.

"I would put money on going into a third week", said Andrew Honeyman, senior forecaster at the London Weather Centre.

"Through the weekend and into next week the weather looks pretty unsettled," he added. "A lot of that time it should be pretty damp if not downright wet. Ironically, some parts of

southern England are still under water-use restrictions because of a drought that has been called one of the worst of the century.




