MANCHESTER, England June 28: Manchester United's increasingly desperate search for a major signing finally ended on Friday when the Premiership champions signed England striker Teddy Sheringham from Tottenham, reports AFP.

Spurs originally asked for six million pounds for the former Millwal and Nottingham Forest player, but finally settled for 3.5 million after it became clear that interested clubs would not pay more for the 31year-old.

Sheringham put in a transfer request before the England squad set off for the Tournoi de France earlier this month, claiming that he could not imagine the north London club challenging for honours in the near future.

Sheringham, who prefers to play in a deep-lying striker's role, tried to play down comparisons with Frenchman Eric Cantona, who left Untied in a state of shock when he announced his retirement from football in May.

"It's inevitable people will make comparisons with Eric Cantona but I can only do what I'm good at," Sheringham said. "I've got the number 10 shirt, and it's great for me to be wear-

ing that. A number of top players had reportedly turned down the chance of a move to the Premiership champions including Rangers' Brian Laudrup, Markus Babbel of Bayern Munich and Fiorentina's Gabriel Batistuta.

Bolivia, June 28 (Agencies): Despite four World Cup titles and four South American

titles. Brazil still have not accomplished a few things in soccer - like winning the Copa America away from home.

They have an opportunity to scratch that off the list on Sun-

After annihilating their opponents in the relative plains of Bolivia, Brazil must now climb into the clouds of La Paz and beat the host country to claim the ultimate prize.

Surprisingly, given their superiority over most other South American teams, the Brazilians have won the prestigious title the last in 1989.

Overcoming the physical difficulties of playing at high altitude in La Paz will not be easy for the Brazilians. They may face the game without striker Romario, who is nursing a thigh injury.

But coach Mario Zagallo tried to play down the worries following his team's 7-0 demolition of Peru in Thursday's semifinal. "Our opponents on Sunday

will be Bolivia, not the altitude," he said. "The altitude is there, it always has been." He went on to refer to his

AUCKLAND, June 28: Australia took a stranglehold on their World Cup Oceania Zone play-off when they beat 10-man New Zealand 3-0 in the first leg

Diego feels fighting fit

BUENOS AIRES, June 28: Diego Maradona says he is in "Marvelous" physical shape and has set the date for his return for Boca Juniors' in a July 13 match against Racing in Argentina's "Clausura" or second league season, reports AP.

Speaking on radio from Canada, where he has been training with disgraced sprinted Ben Johnson, the temperamental former captain of the Argentina national team says he is at "nine" on a scale of

"Maybe nine-and-a-half," Maradona said. "But the rest I'll get when I play more. I'm lacking football, nothing more."

Despite relative inactivity for 10 months, his 10 days of conditioning with Johnson has him "feeling great, with the desire to play. I'm strong. This is part of the work we have with Ben, the combination is explosive.

Maradona denies he has a contract with Johnson for a 1,000 dollars a day to train him, but will remain in Toronto before returning on July 6 for the match a week

later. This is the latest in a series of comeback attempts for the 36-year-old Maradona.

He was suspended by FIFA for 15 months in 1991 after testing positive for cocaine use following an Italian league game. He also was thrown out of the 1994 World Cup and suspended for using banned stimu-

In earlier comeback at-tempts, Maradona left the team saying the club's morning training sessions were scheduled too early.



Germany. Hingis was a much more compact player today than she was against Kremer of Germany in the first round. She served a volleyed well and was not afraid to come to the net, to return the soft drop volleys of Olga. In the two sets that she played she made only two wild shots at the end of the second set in sheer exasperation. But strangely enough Olga had bro-ken through Martina's service

at 1-5 in the second set. Hingis who is always 'sure' of herself asserted, "I think I can see the court pretty well, my anticipation is pretty good, where the ball might go, and I see the whole court and then I see what she's doing, where she is moving around, and then I just see the free spot and try to get it there, and most of the time it works, but being from the baseline, I have a very fast game." In reply to another question she said, "I don't have any problems with that (playing probable five matches in seven days). I think the physical part is not that bad, especially not on grass, where the points are not that long, you don't have to move that much and it's like a normal tournament."

Martina does not have a real challenge in the third round but has wait for the outcome.

In the first match at the Centre Court another Belarussian and a specialist doubles player grass Natasha Zvereva meekly surrendered to Russian Likhotseva in straight sets 6-2, 6-2. The match was over in 51 minutes. Incidentally, Martina also won in 52 minutes.

Yet, in another first rounder Grzybowsk of Poland in Court One created a little stirr by upsetting the much publicised Venus Williams of the USA 4-6, 6-2, 6-4 in 1 hour 18 minutes.

Top-seed Martina Hingis made up for lost time at rainwept All-England Club when she beat second-round opponent Olga Barabanschikova of Belarus in straight-sets 6-2, 6-2 in just 52 minutes on the Centre

Court. The 16-year-old Swiss player, whose only defeat this season came when she was beaten by Iva Majoli in the French Open final earlier this month, will now play the winner of an all-American clash between Lisa Raymond and Nicole Arendt for a place in the

last-sixteen. After Thursday's and Friday's playing schedules were rained off, tournament referee Alan Mills was hoping for a full day's play to help reduce the enormous backlog. Russia's Elena Likhovtseva

opened the day's play by completing a 6-2, 6-2 first-round victory over Natasha Zvereva of The match had been stopped

because of bad light on Wednesday with the 21-year-old Russian leading 6-2, 4-0.

Likhovtseva needed just 14 minutes to complete victory. There was one other result Javier Frana of Argentina withdrew because of an ear ailment, allowing France's Cedric Pioline to advance to the third


Venus Williams made her

debut five days late Saturday and squandered a 6-4, 2-0 lead to-lose in three sets to Poland's Magdalena Grzybowska. Ranked 32 places below the

American, 18-year-old Grzybowska triumphed 4-6, 6-2, 6-4 on a half-full No. 1 Court to reach the second round Williams lost seven games in a row during the middle of the match and never recovered.

Officials were monitoring the forecast to determine whether to play on the middle Sunday for only the second time in Wimbledon's 121-year history. Showers were possible through at least Thursday.

All-England Club chief executive Chris Gorringe had to get the approval of the local municipal authority, residents and police before deciding on middle Sunday play rather than the traditional mid-tournament

understanding and co-operative," he said. "We must now wait and see what the weather will be for Sunday before we make the final decision.

Apart from Tuesday, which had largely fine weather and a full day's play. Wimbledon has been deluged by rain. Only 16 of some 60 matches were completed on the opening day, and two on Wednesday.

By the end of the Friday the second washed out day in a row and only the second backto-back washout since 1909 -the total number completed was 94 out of an expected 300.

Among the stars hoping to play Saturday were three-time champions Pete Sampras and Boris Becker, men's defending titlist Richard Krajicek and French Open champion Iva Ma-

Sampras was due to face Germany's Hendrik Dreekmann on No. 1 Court while Becker was against Thomas Johansson of Sweden on Centre. Krajicek continued his defence against Romania's Andrei Pavel, and Majoli was to meet Marion Maruska of Austria.

There were some positive sides to the Wimbledon washout: - The stall holders at the gift

shops announced huge increases in turnover because the rain dragged spectators off the courts and into the All-England - The first and so far only

so-called "Peoples Sunday" in 1991, when spectators came on a first-come-first-served basis with no advance ticket sales, took some of the snootiness out of Wimbledon and was considered a major success. A second was likely to be just as fun. But some 56,000 fans who

paid up to 27 pounds (44 dollars) for tickets didn't see any play on the two days and some were angry that there was not a roof put on the new, 20 million pound (33 million dollars) No. 1 court, which is being used for the first time this year.
