LONDON, June 29: Spinners Peter Such and Paul Grayson ran through Derbyshire to bowl Essex to the top of the county championship table after an innings victory inside three days of their match at Southend, reports Reuter.

Left-arm paceman Mark Ilott picked up two early wickets as Derbyshire chased a target of 231 to save the innings defeat after Essex reached 373 for eight shortly after lunch yesterday.

Australian Stuart Law and captain Paul Prichard had earlier both completed centuries as Essex hammered home their advantage, Prichard made 106 and Law was finally dismissed for 157.

Glamorgan also earned a day off as paceman Darren Thomas claimed five for 24 in his team's 234-run victory romp over Sussex at Swansea which lifted then level on points with previous leaders Middlesex, one behind Essex.

England off-spinner Robert Croft also claimed three for nine in eight overs as the visitors were bowled out for 67 in just 32.4 over following their first-innings total of 54 all out.

Sussex lost their last four wickets for seven runs in 19 balls as Glamorgan recorded their forth championship win of the season.

Lancashire took three more Worcestershire wickets at New Road, reducing the home side to 100 for seven when rain finished play just before lunch.

Darren Shadford claimed his third victim when he dismissed captain Tom Moody for 26, and former England seamer Peter Martin had figures of three for 30 off 17 overs. Gavin Haynes stood firm for Worcestershire, reaching 38 not out.

Betis still will qualify for the European Cup Winners' Cup, with Barcelona earning a berth in the Champions League by virtue of their runner-up spot. The match finished with a



TOKYO, June 29: Japan drew with Oman 1-1 to finish top of the Asian zone Group Four tournament here Saturday and assured themselves of a place in the final qualifying round for the 1998 World Cup finals, report agencies.

Japan ended the competition with five wins and one draw for 16 points, three points ahead of Oman, who finished with four wins, one draw and a sole de-

Only the top team form each of Asia 10 first-round groups advances to the final qualifying round in late October and early November for three berths in next year's 32-nation finals in France.

In their earlier encounter in Bosher in March, Japan beat

Oman 1-0. In their second head-to-head encounter on Saturday, Oman needed to defeat Japan by a margin of 10 goals or more to reach the final round.

Earlier, Macau rallied past Nepal 2-1 for its first victory in the group.


