BUET budget approved

The BUET syndicate meeting on Monday approved a deficit budget of Tk 19 crore 11 lakh for the fiscal year 1997-98 along with the revised deficit budget of Tk 18 crore 53 lakh 55 thousand for the fiscal year 1996-97, says a press release. The current budget showed a deficit of 91 lakh while the deficit for the revised budget stood at 63 lakh 55 thousand.

The revenue side of the budget shows a total of 17 crore 20 lakh to be provided by government sources through the UGC and 1 crore from internal sources.

On the expenditure head 10 crore 67 lakh 50 thousand taka has been accounted for as the salary of the teachers, officers and employees. The other important heads of expenditures are pension, education and general expenses.

The meeting called upon the UGC to make a special grant of Tk 1 crore 54 lakh 77 thousand to meet the deficit of the two fiscal years.

Structural reform in health sector stressed

Speakers at a seminar in the city stressed structural reform in the health sector to attain self-sufficiency and cater the needs of the clients.

The topic of yesterday's dissemination seminar held at ICDDR,B Sasakawa auditorium in the city was 'Lessons Learned and Programmatic Implications'.

The two-day seminar concluded yesterday, was held under the auspices of ICDDR,B MCH-PP Extension Project (Rural) and Ministry of Health and Population Welfare with support from USAID and the Population Council.

The Secretary of Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Mohammad Ali chaired the concluding session of the day's programme in which three papers were presented.

Dr Barkat-e-Khuda presented two papers entitled 'Bangladesh Family Planning Programme: Lessons Learned and Direction for the Future' and 'Improving the Bangladesh Health and Family Planning Programme: Lessons Learned through Operations Research'.

These papers were prepared with two other co-authors Dr John Stoetzel and Nancy Piet-Pelon. Dr Barkat told the seminar.

Dr Thomas Kane presented another paper titled 'Reproductive Health in Rural Bangladesh: Policy and Programmatic Perspectives'.

The discussions included high officials of the government and officials of World Bank and USAID, based in Dhaka.

The needs and intentions of the family planning programme have changed from providing FP-MCH to providing an essential services package, said Dr Barkat. He said manpower shortages at all levels and a lack of coordination will pose a major challenge to the programme.

There are internal conflicts between medical and non-medical staff with the FP directorate, he said. "And staff hired under the development budget have lower morale than those hired under the revenue budget."

Dr Barkat suggested a unified management structure for the health sector and proposed three alternative options for its implementation.

According to him the reforms could be implemented in phases, both in respect to the programme components as well as the service delivery tiers, or through a unified merger and complete integration at all levels of service delivery and all components programme.

The Secretary, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, said that the government was developing its family planning and health programme keeping in view of the needs of the 21st century.

He also said the government was aware that the sector needed structural reform to ensure services to meet the needs of the clients.

Measures like recruitment of more health service personnel has already been initiated, he said.

He also said that the suggestions and recommendations of the seminar will be given due importance for future implementation.

Blood donation clinic organised at Uttara

Ignorance and financial constraints hampered efforts to attack Bangladesh's blood shortage at a volunteer blood donor clinic in Uttara yesterday.

The Lions Club of Dhaka Paradise, Rotary Club of Uttara and Rotaract Club of Ekaton North organised the clinic at a tent near Azampur bus stand.

Sharif Alam, president, Rotary Club of Uttara, said he hoped the clinic would collect 50 bags, despite the threat of bad weather.

A recent study, conducted by the New York-based Population Council, estimated Bangladesh blood banks collect 200,000 units annually, mainly from professional donors. It suggested the amount meets less than half the demand.

Club members fanned volunteers with newspapers to alleviate the intense heat as a large crowd gathered outside the tent. The staff used antiseptic and clean needles, but club officials still seemed to have trouble convincing the audience to donate. A young waiter in a clean white shirt and bow tie agreed to sit for the medical exam, but then refused to go through with the donation. Alam blamed ignorance.

"They don't understand why we need blood, especially the rare groups like O-negative and AB-positive," he said. But some questioned the quality of the blood collected by the clubs.

The clinic kept the blood in a cardboard box with a couple of chilled cold packs on top. Dr Hussain Khan from the Lion's Blood Bank said the blood would stay in the box for about three hours.

Meanwhile, Badrul Islam, a physician at the Red Crescent Blood Centre, said it was important to store blood between two and six degrees Celsius while in an ice box or refrigerator. Otherwise, he said, the blood separates and becomes unsatisfactory for transfusions.

Staff safety also seemed inadequate. The staff put blood samples, used for blood group tests, into an open pan on the table and nobody wore masks or gloves. A nurse discarded the dirty needles on the floor underneath the table. Khan said the clubs didn't have much money to spend on the clinic so it had to cut some corners.

"We don't get any financial help from other sources," said Khan. "So we don't have the capacity to take steps against contamination."
