TOKYO, July 2: Bangladesh and Japan today underlined their desire to break new grounds to strengthen further the existing ties between the two countries through expanded economic cooperation.

Tokyo indicated that it was willing to fund construction of the Rupsha Bridge and development of Mongla Port. It also expressed its desire to extend technical support for feasibility study for the proposed Ganges Barrage.

This was disclosed at an official briefing after the formal talks between Japanese Prime Minister Ryutaro Hashimoto and the visiting Bangladesh Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina. The Japanese premier hosted a lunch at his residence where the discussions took place for nearly two hours. The talks were also participated by senior officials of the two sides. The Bangladesh side included Finance Minister SAMS Kibria. State Minister for Foreign Affairs Abul Hasan Chowdhury. Some top BNP leaders oppose today's hartal By Nazmul Ashraf

BNP faced dissension from some 'very influential' party leaders as regards its plan for an eight-hour countrywide har-tal due to start at 6 this morning, highly-placed sources in

the party said. Three members of BNP's highest decision-making body - the National Standing Committee (NSC) - were 'dead opposed' to the hartal, called to protest the national budget for fiscal 1997-98 termed by the party as anti-people and devel-

opment-shy. BNP Chief and Leader of the Opposition in Jatiya Sangsad

Begum Khaleda Zia, however. ignored the suggestions by the three top notchers in her party and gave in to the pressure from the younger leaders to opt for hartal, according to sources close to her

The three NSC members reportedly advised Begum Zia not to go for 'harmful programme like hartal' she was opposed to while ruling the country for five

They also argued that today's hartal would virtually lead to a three-day shutdown as the next two days are weekly holidays. See Page 12 Col 7

BNP-called 8-hour hartal today
