

The suspension is a preliminary move until the commission meets next week to determine its final action. Tyson was not present at the hearing.

The commission voted 5-0 to serve Tyson with a complaint and sign a waiver that would enable the disciplinary hearing to begin on July 8.

Meanwhile, Tyson's 30 million dollar purse was frozen. By law, the commissioners can only fine Tyson up to 10 per

cent of his purse, or three million dollars. The infamous bout set pay-

per-view records, the Showtime network said. A spokesman for the cable

network said preliminary numbers indicate the fight was purchased by between 1.8 and 1.9 million people, breaking the 1.6 million record set by the first Tyson-Holyfield match last November. Final figures will not be available for several






