Health Minister Salahuddin Yusuf yesterday informed the Jatiya Sangsad that so far 1420 persons with arsenic poisoning have been identified in the country, reports BSS.

Replying to a question of Mohammad Fazlul Azim (BNP-Noakhall-b), the minister said the government has taken ex-tensive measures to contain arsenic contamination through identification of patients. treatment, follow-up programmes, supplying pure drinking water, training doc-tors and creating awareness. Yusuf said the government is

running two projects, one con-ducted by NIPSOM and the other by Public Health Engi-neering Department, to combat

He said, three committees, namely Arsenic Steering Committee, Scientific Research Committee and Technical Committee on Arsenic, are guiding, directing and coordi-nating the programmes for con-taining arsenic contamination. The minister said a task force is being constituted to run

district-wise programmes.
The minister said Public Health Engineering Depart-ment has already installed some deep tubewells in the affected areas. The department has also taken measures to supply arsenic-free water in the affected areas and is gathering samples of polluted water for testing.

#### BCL threatens agitation against Jagannath Hall provost

Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL), Jagannath Hall unit, Dhaka University, has threatened an agitation against the provost of the hall protesting some of his measures which, they term, are against the interest of the hall residents.

At an activists' meeting, BCL leaders of the hall unit decided to place their demands before the provost with an ultimatum. sources said. If the demands are not met, BCL will launch an agitation programme against the provost, the meeting decided.

But according to hall sources, the BCL leaders are threatening the agitation as the provost is not allowing outsiders associated with the Awami League-backed student body into the hall. He started a move against the outsiders who were still staying in the hall,

BCL activists also attacked a procession brought out by Chhatra Union a few days back demanding opening of the north gate of the hall. The gate was closed as per a decision taken at a meeting of the Dhaka University Paribesh Parishad. When asked, the residents of the hall said that the north gate should be opened.

The provost of the hall Dr Durga Das Bhattacharya could not be reached yesterday for comment.


#### Turkish envoy meets Faezul Turkish Ambassador to Bangladesh Kemal Ozcan Davaz
