However, Azharuddin has not played any cricket since then because it is the off-season in India.

Regular wicket-keeper Nayan Mongia, was axed from the squad, making way for Saba Karim of Bengal. Two newcom-ers were drafted in, left-arm spinner Nilesh Kulkarni and seamer Debashish Mohanti.

World champions Sri Lanka, Pakistan and Bangladesh are the other teams taking part in the Asia Cup starting in Colombo on July 14.

Manoj receives death threats?

NEW DELHI, July 7: Former Indian Test cricketer Manoj Prabhakar has received death threats after accusing an unnamed teammate of bribery and match-fixing, a magazine reported, says AFP.

The Outlook weekly, which last month published Prabhakar's charges that he was offered money to lose a match to arch-rivals Pakistan, said he was being pressured not to disclose the player's name to a former Indian chief justice probing the allegations.

"Telephone calls warning him to keep his gab shut started coming in at his home and on his mobile phone," the magazine said.

"Finally an incident occurred that told him what a can of worms he had opened, and who he was up against.

"Prabhakar was returning home in his car when he was flagged down by two persons. When the cricketer rolled down is window to help, one of them held a gun at his temple and said: "If you take the name we will kill you.

Prabhakar has written to the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) saying he had been "visited by a man who has threatened to kill me if I disclose more." Outlook added

The BCCI appointed former Indian chief justice YV Chandrachud to probe Prabhakar's allegations that he was offered 72,000 dollars by an unnamed teammate to ensure India lost to Pakistan in a limited overs tournament in Sri Lanka in

Prabhakar also hinted that India's defeat by England in the World Cup semifinal in 1987 may have been fixed.

The signed article alleged that top players had links with illegal bookies and journalists involved in betting rings.


Chandrachud, who is expected to submit his findings by the end of July, told the Indian Express that Prabhakar should have no worries about his security and that he could be given protection.

Brawny win for Aussies

MANCHESTER, England, July 7: Fast bowler Glenn McGrath wasted no time in wrapping up the England second innings on the fifth morning Monday as Australia completed a series-levelling victory.

The Australians won the third Test at Old Trafford by 268 runs after setting England 469 runs to win in a little over four sessions, report agencies.

The win here enabled Australia to level the series with one win apiece after England had won the first Test by nine wickets at Edgbaston and the match at Lord's had been drawn. Skipper Mark Taylor, one of

Australia's most successful captains despite his personal low scores, felt things began to change for his team the day after the first Test defeat.

Taylor raised a few eyebrows when he decided to bat first on a green and moist wicket. "It wasn't a gamble that we

took to bat first. We batted positively and toughed it out on the first day on a difficult wicket." But the game belonged to man-of-the-match Steve Wau-

He hit 108 and 116 with a badly bruised right hand and became only the third Australian to score in both innings in an Ashes Test.



they have a 100 per cent record. Paraguay, who suffered their first home defeat in four years as they went down 2-1 to Argentina, stayed top with '23' points, but their lead over Argentina was reduced to one point.

Paraguay, Argentina and Colombia, who have 18 points, look fairly certain of a place in France next year as the top four

teams in the group qualify. However, after Saturday's debacle, Colombia, who have taken one point from their last five games, know that any more slip-ups could be fatal. Chile's win before a 75,000

crowd in Santiago was set up by a first-half hattrick by Marcelo Salas, two of his goals were created by striker Ivan Zmorano, who also converted a last minute penalty for his 10th goal of the qualifiers. Peru's win in Lima kept
