

England stay the same

LONDON, July 9: England cricket selectors on Tuesday expressed a vote of confidence in the side which lost the third Test to Australia by keeping the same players for the fourth Test starting on July 24, reports Reuters.

In a surprise move, the 12-man squad was named more than two weeks before the start of the next Test at Headingley in Leeds.

Spinner Phil Tufnell was the only player added to the team. Fast bowlers Devon Malcolm and Mike Smith, who were included in the squad for the third Test, were overlooked by selectors.

Albanian booters seek asylum in Spain

MADRID, July 9: Six Albanian under-21 international soccer players seeking political asylum in Spain pleaded on Tuesday with Spanish clubs to sign them, reports Reuters.

The six, and the team Masseur, sought asylum in April after the European soccer governing body UEFA had ordered their match against Germany to be played in the Spanish town of Quadix because of the unstable political situation in Albania.

Only one of the group, Ervin Fakaj, has been signed by a Spanish club, Second Division side Toledo.

"We realised it would be difficult to get signed by a First Division club but we all thought that we'd be playing in the Second Division," said their spokesman Kresnik Zeka.

"The problem is that we do not have the knowledge of how to go about getting a contract and what to put on it. The Spanish federation promised to act as our agents but only Ervin has been found a team."

FIFA, the sport's world ruling body, has authorised the Spanish Football Federation to allow the signing of the players while they wait to see whether they are given refugee status.

They are presently learning to speak Spanish in the mornings and training in the afternoons.

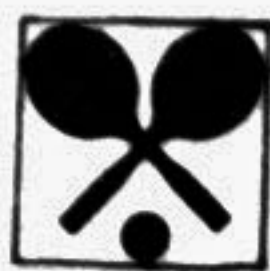

Sampras joins select band



LONDON, July 9: Pete Sampras heralded his arrival on the world tennis scene back in 1990 when at the age of only 19 years and 28 days he defeated Andre Agassi in straight sets to win the US Open Championships as the youngest player.

And on his way to the final he accounted for Ivan Lendl and

John McEnroe. This was no flash in the pan as the young American continued to show his prowess in the international matches. From a position of 97 in the world ranking at the year end in

1988, when he became a professional, he has progressed to the number one position in 1993 and is still on the top of the world tennis.

By winning the 1997 men's title at Wimbledon Sampras has joined the select band of players who had won four or more titles here. The others are: William Renshaw (7), Laurie Doherty and Bjorn Borg (5), Reggie Doherty, Anthony Wilding, Rod Laver and Pete Sampras (4).

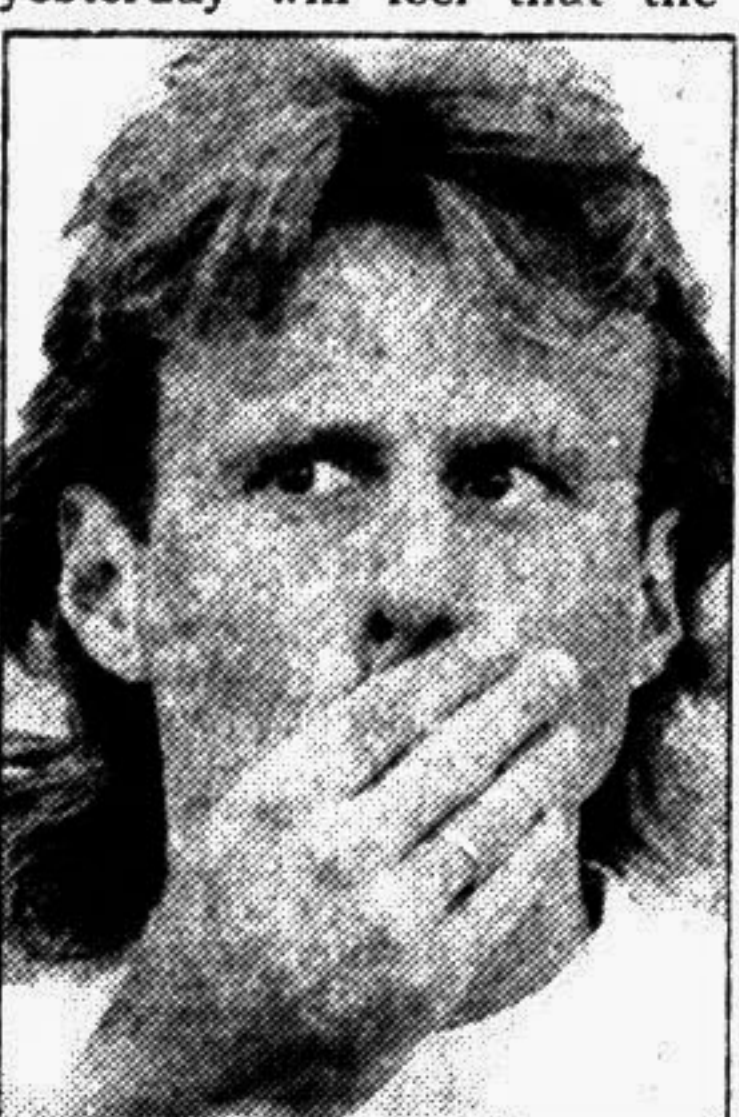
But the fact remains that William Renshaw won it six times on the trot while Borg won it five times in the Open Era between 1976 and 1980. Sampras is likely to win many more titles here but may not be able to match the Swede's record.

Sampras' mastery over his opponents was so complete that in the seven matches he won, he played 118 games involving 24 sets and dropped his service only twice. The only worthwhile opposition he met was from the thin Czech Petr Korda, the 16th seed in the fourth round. Sampras has now 10 Grand Slam titles to his credit (2 Australian, 4 Wimbledon and 4 US Open). Only three players are ahead of him — Rod Laver and Bjorn Borg with 11 titles each and Australian Roy Emerson topping the list with 12 (six Australian and 2 each in Wimbledon, French and US Open).

Sampras has now equalled the record of the all-time great tennis player Bill Tilden of the

United States.

The best compliments for this tennis genius came from John Parsons who wrote in The Telegraph: "As a schoolboy, Pete Sampras used to say his lifetime ambition was to play well enough to be regarded as a right-handed Rod Laver. Most watching him outplay Frenchman Cedric Pioline so comprehensively on the Centre Court yesterday will feel that the

dream has been achieved." Laver twice achieved the Grand Slam (winning all four titles the same year in 1962 and 1969), a feat difficult to match in the present day tennis even for players like Sampras.

Steffi hopes to play in late autumn

FRANKFURT, July 9: Germany's tennis star, Steffi Graf, who is recovering from knee surgery, says she expects to return to play this fall, reports AP.

"If everything goes well, I'll be able to play again in late autumn and will then be in the tournament of the Masters of Champions in Frankfurt at the beginning of December," Graf told Sunny, a German weekly newspaper.

Following major knee surgery on June 10 in Vienna, Austria, the 28-year-old Graf, who has won Wimbledon seven times but was unable to defend her title this year, says she has no complaints.

"I'm now doing very well."



she said. "Directly after (the surgery) it was a bit difficult. Now I can move without pain," Graf said.

Dr Reinhard Weinstabl, who operated on Graf, said she is making an amazing recovery. "Everyday it's going better. She can now nearly make it without a brace on her knee," he said.

Graf says she's looking forward to next season. "My main goal is to be fit and to win the Grand Slam tournaments in 1998. That is my personal goal and naturally a certain amount of ambition goes with that," Graf said.

Bruguera blown away



GSTAAD, Switzerland, July 9: French Open finalist Sergi Bruguera was upset 7-6 (7-3), 6-2 by compatriot

Javier Sanchez in the second round of the \$75,000 dollar Swiss Open here today, report agencies.

Third seed Bruguera, who held an 11-5 lead in the rivalry heading into the match, had won the last seven meetings and started as clear favourite.

The stunned world No. 7 said: "It's never nice to lose. I didn't play very well and was especially bad on returns. I gave him a lot of free points."

Sanchez won the first set in a tiebreaker, then broke in the second for 3-1. Bruguera double-faulted into a match point in the eighth game, and promptly saved it.

But Sanchez came good just a few moments later to take the victory when Bruguera volleyed a short forehand into the net.

Earlier, South African Wayne Ferreira reached his second quarterfinal of the year, putting down an early challenge from Spanish qualifier Fernando Vicente 6-2, 6-3, 6-4.

The eighth-seeded Ferreira, ranked 26th on the ATP Tour computer, will await an opponent from the second-round match between Swiss Marc Rosset, conqueror of top seed Yevgeny Kafelnikov, and Slovakian Dominik Hrbaty.

Ferreira recovered from a poor 22-minute first set at the 1,000 m altitude Gstaad Centre Court to methodically turn the tide against the Spanish baseline. The South African triumphed despite more than 50 unforced errors.

On Tuesday, Kafelnikov, the 1996 French Open champion and winner of the Swiss title in 1995, was brushed aside 6-4, 6-3 by 1992 Olympic champion Rosset while number five Albert Costa, last year's champion, fell to American Richey Reneberg 6-2, 1-6, 6-4.

Rosset who has seen his world ranking slip to 26, delighted the hometown fans as he overpowered the fifth ranked Russian in just 59 minutes.

Cedric Pioline, who lost in the Wimbledon final to Pete Sampras on Sunday, also struggled to find his footing back on clay.

The Frenchman appeared unsure as he dropped the first set to compatriot Fabrice Santoro before battling back to take a narrow three-set decision, 3-6, 6-2, 7-6 (9-7).

Fourth seed Marcelo Rios of Chile, who enjoyed unexpected success at Wimbledon advancing to the fourth round before falling to Boris Becker, made a smooth transition from grass back to clay brushing aside Brazilian qualifier Jaimir Oncins 6-4, 6-2.

Woodforde wins the hard way

NEWPORT, Rhode Island, July 9: Just two days after his historic Wimbledon doubles victory, Australian Mark Woodforde was pushed to the limit before advancing to the second round at the Hall of Fame Championships on Tuesday, reports Reuters.

Second seed Woodforde, who teamed with countryman Todd Woodbridge to claim a fifth consecutive Wimbledon doubles title, had to win a second-set tie-break 7-4 to stay alive before pulling out a 4-6, 7-6, 7-5 over American Steve Bryan.

Woodforde reached the fourth round in singles at Wimbledon before falling to Michael Stich. While his doubles partner was an unexpected semifinalist in singles.

Top seed Alex Radulescu of Germany also needed three sets to win his opening match in American's only grass court tournament on the ATP calendar.

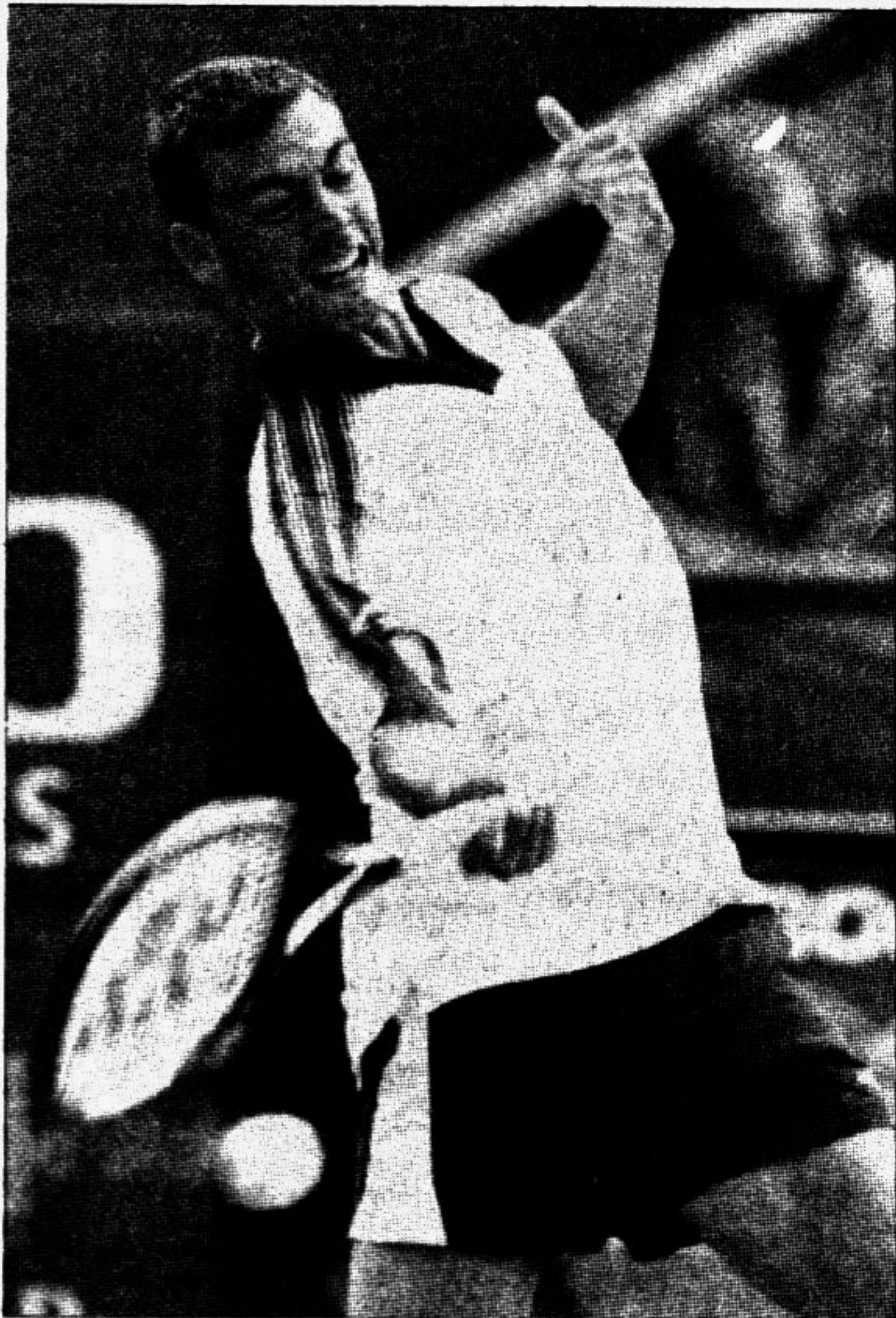
Radulescu, who reached the third round at Wimbledon, held off American Vince Spadea 6-4, 6-7, 6-3.

Last year's runner-up Grant Stafford of South Africa, the third seed, ousted American Jeff Salzenstein 7-5, 6-3.

But Nicolas Pereira of Venezuela is not defending his title, opting instead to represent his country in Davis Cup qualifying this weekend.

The tournament, with its usual weak field coming on the heels of Wimbledon when most of the world's top players take a breather before starting the summer hardcourt season, lost one seeded player Tuesday.

Little-known Marzio Martelli of Italy, the sixth seed, was bounced by American David Wheaton 4-6, 6-4, 6-2.

Navratilova on Fed Cup



BROOKLINE, Massachusetts, July 9: Fed Cup captain Martina Navratilova was feeling good about the chances of the United States winning its way back into the World Group after her squad's first on-site practice for the weekend tie against Japan, reports Reuters.

"Everybody's healthy and ready to go," Navratilova said in a teleconference Tuesday after the Americans practiced at the Longwood cricket club.

"We know we're the overwhelming favourites," added Navratilova, who took over as US captain this year only to watch the defending Fed Cup champions fall to the Netherlands in the opening round.

That surprise defeat in March put the United States in the unlikely position of having to win a play-off in order to compete for the Cup in 1998.

But Navratilova, who compiled a perfect 28-0 Fed Cup record as a player, for Czechoslovakia and the United States, exuded confidence that competing at home would help her team carry the day.

"I'm definitely a lot more confident here than I was in Holland," Navratilova admitted. "If we had played that match here, I feel we would have

beaten the Dutch."

Navratilova's team for the Saturday and Sunday best-of-five match tie is led by Olympic champion Lindsay Davenport, who helped the United States beat Spain in the 1996 final, and cup veteran Mary Joe Fernandez.

Kimberly Po and Lisa Raymond complete the squad. "I expect Mary Joe and Lindsay will be playing our singles matches, but I'm still playing around with different combinations for the doubles," Navratilova said. "We don't have to announce our doubles team until Friday and that will be after our last practice."

The draw for the tie will be held Friday at noon (1600 GMT) in downtown Boston.

"It's easy to get pumped for these matches because we're playing for our country and we have to win to get into the World Group one competition next year," said 13th-ranked Fernandez, who carries an 11-8 Fed Cup singles record into the tie, including wins that kept the 1996 US title run alive.

With the retirement of Kimiko Date, the Japanese hopes rest with 34th-ranked Ai Sugiyama and 47th-ranked Naoko Sawamatsu, who Davenport called "two very difficult players."

"Their strength is foot speed. They take all the balls very early," said Davenport, who boasts a 12-2 Fed Cup singles record.

"If they have a weakness, it would be in their serves," added world number seven Davenport, who at 6-foot-3 (1.90 m) is nearly a foot (30 cm) taller than her singles opponents.

"On the hardcourt, the higher the bounce the better for us, because we're taller than they are," said Navratilova.

Greek GP from July 13

There are big changes for rounds four and five of the Formula 1 World Powerboat Championship as the circus moves south.

The biggest change is the big water... no river or lake courses these at the Greek Grand Prix in Corfu, and Gallipoli, Italy, site of the three seas Grand Prix, says a press release.

AT SEA
Both races are run in bodies of water off the Ionian Sea — Corfu (Kerkira) in the Bat of Granitosa off the west coast of Greece, Gallipoli, in the heel of Italy's famous boot, in the Gulf of Taranto, Rock and roll, the drivers like to say.

"Good weather in Corfu, and only problem is caused by the wakes of the big ferries which come past, although they are a fair distance from the course," says team manager Malcolm Williams.

The rollers take 15 minutes to get to the course. The organisers put out a boat to warn us and we radio our drivers.

ROUGH CONDITIONS

Gallipoli is another hard-bourside course and "conditions can get very rough when the wind is in the wrong quarter," Williams adds.

All said, however, the pleasures of southern Italy and Greece far outweigh the disadvantages, even in the Gold Leaf F1 racing team had to endure a 1,500-mile drive from Wales to Brindisi, Italy and then a 12-hour ferry crossing, to get to Corfu. Massimo Roggiere has good memories of both races, won by archival Guido Cappellini in 1996 Roggiere finished second at Corfu and fifth at Gallipoli, one spot behind Jonathan Jones.
