Greenidge to replace
injured Pilot!

Coach Gordon Greenidge is likely to stand behind the wicket in absence of injured wicketkeeper Khaled Masood Pilot during Bangladesh's second warm-up match against the Sri Lanka Cricket Board President XI at the Moors Sports Club ground in Colombo today.

But the celebrated Caribbean coach of the national team may not be able to show his boys how to keep as the persistent rain, a common phenomenon in this part of the world, is threatening to a possible wash-out.

Bangladesh, who are now in Sri Lanka to participate in the four-nation Pepsi Asia Cup, lost their first warm-up match against the second fiddle of the world champions by 33 runs on Wednesday in a rain-reduced affair, which was also marked by injury to two key players.

Khaled Masood, the lone wicketkeeper of the 14-member Bangladesh squad for the four-nation tournament, lost two of his teeth after being hit by a rising delivery from slow left-arm Enamul Haq Moni. Besides, all-rounder Athar Ali Khan left the field on the day complaining a back problem after conceding 16 runs in his two prodigious overs.

But after a day's break things have been improved a lot with Athar, a veteran of seven

one-day internationals, joining in the team's indoor practice session in the evening and Pilot recuperating fast, said a BCB official yesterday. The dashing wicketkeeper-batsman,

who had to take two stitches in his bruised lips, is expected to be fit again before Bangladesh's Cup-opener against Pakistan on July 16.

Zaheer hoping
against hope

ISLAMABAD, July 10: The newly appointed cricket transfer manager of the Pakistan team, Zaheer Abbas, has expressed the hope that Pakistan would be able to break the Asia Cup jinx and win the tournament for the first time, reports PTI.

Despite the fact that Abbas would be accompanying a highly depleted team to Asia Cup starting in Sri Lanka early next week, he said, "I have faith in the ability of the selected Pakistan team to win the Asia Cup for the first time ever."

Pakistan, a former world champion, has never won the Asia Cup since its inception in the early 1980s.

Abbas, a brilliant batsman of yesterday and a national selector now, told a local daily, "Despite the unavailability of a number of regulars we have still managed to select a balanced and variable side."

Five regular Pakistani bowlers, Wasim Akram, Waqar Younis, Mushtaq Ahmed, Mohammad Zahid and Mohammed Akram and one batsman, Ijaz Ahmed, have expressed their inability to join the team due to their preoccupation with the English cricket.

The team, however, would benefit from the return of opening batsman Aamir Sohail, whose two-year ban was lifted by the Pakistan Cricket Board and was selected for the Asian Cup.

Desai waiting for Sachin



BOMBAY, July 10: The chairman of India's cricket selectors said today he planned an urgent meeting with national skipper Sachin Tendulkar following his reported complaint that he had been "saddled with a B-grade team."

Selection board chairman Ramakant Desai told AFP: "There could be a dispute (between the captain and the selectors) over one or two play-

ers. But that does not mean you can call the entire team B-grade."

"I do not believe Tendulkar could have made such strong statements, which is why I am waiting to discuss with him, before talking about any disciplinary action."

Tendulkar was quoted in the Calcutta-based Aajkal newspaper on Wednesday as saying that he was unhappy with the side selected for the Asia Cup, a one-day tournament in Sri Lanka, later this month.

He was quoted as saying, "They have saddled me with a B-grade team. I have decided to speak the truth."

Desai said he doubted whether Tendulkar, currently in London at an International Cricket Council captains' meeting, had made "such sweeping statements."

Desai said Tendulkar was scheduled to return to Bombay by the end of the week. "I will meet him as soon as he is back," he added.

The newspaper said Ten-

dulkar was unhappy over the omission of left-handed batsman Vinod Kambli and wicket-keeper Nayan Mongia for the Asia Cup. Kambli was dropped in favour of former Indian captain Mohammad Asharuddin.

India fly out next week for the event, a four-nation tournament involving Bangladesh, India, Pakistan and Sri Lanka. They also take on Sri Lanka in a two-Test series and three limited-over internationals.

The selection row is the second scandal to hit the Indian team in recent months following allegations by former Test player Manoj Prabhakar that an unnamed team member offered him money to lose a match. The allegations are currently under investigation.

Kallis keeps Middlesex up



LONDON, July 10: A century from South African Jacques Kallis boosted Middlesex to a thrilling four-wicket NatWest Trophy win over Gloucestershire with just three balls to spare at Uxbridge on Wednesday, reports Reuters.

West Indian Monte Lynch earlier in Gloucestershire to 277 for nine, hitting exactly 100 in just 108 balls and with nine fours and two sixes.

But then Kallis, who was also Middlesex's leading wicket-taker with four for 47, weighed in with exactly 100 of his own off 138 deliveries with three sixes and four fours.

Then Jason Pooley, hitting his first half-century in the competition, cracked an unbeaten 79 and hit a boundary off the third ball of the final over to enable Middlesex to win by four wickets.

Australian Stuart Law was another to score exactly 100 as he steered Essex to a seven-wicket victory over Worcestershire at Chelmsford in another

second round match. His 91-ball innings laid the foundation for victory with 15 balls to spare after Graeme Hick's 146 had been the mainstay of the visitors 286 for nine.

Law helped himself to two sixes and 11 fours before he was finally caught in the deep after sharing in a third-wicket stand of 132 in 24 overs with Ronnie Irani, but then Irani (79 not out) and Paul Grayson (82 not out) shared an unbroken stand of 136 in 29 overs to complete a comfortable win.

Hick had needed just 157 deliveries to score his runs, 26 of which came in one over from left-arm spinner Grayson. In all, he plundered 10 fours and five sixes, one of which left a woman spectator needing attention after being struck above an eye.

Former Warwickshire skipper Dermot Reeve made an unhappy return to Edgbaston as his former charges pulled off the kind of miraculous win he often masterminded to dump Somerset out of the competition.

Reeve won the NatWest trophy on four occasions, once with Sussex and three times with Warwickshire, before mov-

ing to Taunton as coach at the end of last season.

But there will be no Lord's trip for him this September after his side surrendered a position of strength when chasing a target of 221 in 60 overs.

They reached 135 for two and needed only 86 from the final 20 overs with eight wickets in hand, but were then undone by inspired spells from pacerman Gladstone Small and South African Allan Donald who each took three wickets.

Spinner Ashley Giles wrapped up the game by bowling last man Andy Caddick with nine balls remaining as Warwickshire squeezed home by 11 runs.

Fast bowler Devon Malcom fired Derbyshire past Northamptonshire and into the quarter-finals with a seven-wicket burst, and then said he was itching to get back into the England fold.

The 34-year-old paceman, omitted from the squad which was defeated in the third Test, claimed competition-best figures of seven for 35 from 10.1 overs as Northants were shot out for 180, chasing a mammoth 324 for seven.

FIFA to break
jinx on July 22

ZURICH, July 10: Ronaldo's controversial transfer from Barcelona to Internazionale will be discussed by FIFA on July 22, reports Reuters.

FIFA's Players' Status Committee will also examine an equally contentious move by French international defender Bixente Lizarazu from Athletic Bilbao to Bayern Munich.

At the centre of the disputes are the "buyout" or withdrawal clauses found in Spanish league contracts.

Ronaldo is reported to have bought out his contract with Barcelona for 27.5 million but the Spanish Football Federation has refused to issue a transfer certificate on the grounds that such "buyouts" are valid for domestic transfers only.

FIFA rules state that a player cannot buy out his contract for the purposes of obtaining an international move.

The dispute has been further complicated by a recent European Commission statement that FIFA transfer regulations may contravene of European Union laws.

No comment from
Hollyfield

CAPE TOWN, July 10: World heavyweight champion Evander Holyfield, on holiday in South Africa, ducked comment on Wednesday on rival Mike Tyson's boxing ban and 3 million dollars fine for biting a chunk off his ear, reports Reuters.

Holyfield is on the phone to his lawyer, Jim Thomas, and then he's going out for dinner, an aide told reporters waiting for the champion.

Holyfield arrived in Cape Town on a private flight from East London, where his promotional coaching tour ended on Wednesday.

No comment, he told reporters as he left East London. After an hour-long game of cat and mouse with reporters, Holyfield was bundled into a minibus and driven off for a late dinner in the city.

The aide said Holyfield had nothing to add to his statement when he arrived in South Africa on Sunday and said that as a Christian he had forgiven Tyson for biting his ears during their June 28 championship bout.

MELBOURNE, July 10: Australian leg-spinner Shane Warne arrived home Thursday for a brief break from the Ashes cricket test, unimpressed over a controversial one-finger salute to English fans, reports AP.

The Victorian state captain is back for three days to see wife Simone and new daughter Brooke. But his first matter of business was to express that he has been taunted about his weight by English fans, but it was all good natured and instead of annoying him, it spurred him on to take nine wickets during the Test.

They (the crowd) have made up a few songs and have been singing and we just sprayed the champagne around after we had won," Warne said. "Then I just showed them my spinning finger, which took a few wickets, and that was about it."

"If people take offence to that then that's up to them but all we've been doing is having some fun with the crowd."

Warne said he saw no point in getting upset by the teasing. "If you take it to heart it makes it worse for you and it puts you off your game, but I use it more as an inspiration," Warne said.

Warne also received criticism from anti-smoking lobbyists in Australia when he was photographed in England smoking a cigar after learning of the birth of his daughter.

"I had just had baby and I celebrated with the guys," he said.

"I didn't ask for the camera to be there but it was there because people want to see me celebrate and it just happened that someone took a photo."

"One of my bad habits is that I smoke but it's not against the law," he quipped.

Boxing bites back with ban, fine

LAS VEGAS, July 10 (AP) Mike Tyson's harshest critics got what they wanted from Nevada boxing regulators. It may also turn out to be what Tyson wanted, too.

Tyson expected severe sanctions for biting Evander Holyfield's ears, and he got them himself as a nephew of Tyson's friend.

"He's upset, but he knows he's got to handle it," Stevens told the New York Post. "He knew it was justified."

The 20-year-old student said Tyson told him all he wanted to do was "to be around his family

with the financial investment placed in him... all these things will weigh in his favour," said Larry Hazzard, New Jersey's boxing commissioner. "If he lives a clean life and gets psychiatric counselling, I do believe strongly they will give him his licence back."

It took boxing commissioners only 26 minutes Wednesday to judge Tyson guilty of unsportsmanlike conduct and discrediting boxing. Another 18 minutes later, with little discussion, they voted unanimously for what on the surface seems to be the harshest penalty possible.

Then they held out hope that the fighter involved in most of boxing's richest fights may not be out of the sport long.

"The one person who has the most influence on how long this will last is Mike Tyson," said commission member Dr James Nave.

Even at a minimum of one year, the penalty will be financially severe for Tyson, who has made 140 million dollars in the ring in the two years since he was released from an Indiana prison after serving a sentence for rape.

At age 31, a lengthy absence from the ring would also hasten what many view as a decline in his boxing skills exposed in the two fights with Holyfield. If he is allowed to return to the ring, it could be more as a curiosity than a serious heavyweight contender.

It will be the second exile in 13 years of pro boxing for Tyson, who spent three years in prison after being convicted of raping Desiree Washington in an Indianapolis hotel room.

By revoking Tyson's licence, the commission also ordered him not to have dealings with people who hold Nevada boxing licences. That includes promoter Don King, who has guided Tyson's career and promoted his fights for much of the last decade.

Commissioners said Tyson's absence had nothing to do with his penalty, though chairman Dr Elias Ghanem said he would advise Tyson to show up when he wants his licence back.

Nevada's action does not automatically mean that Tyson cannot fight in other US states, but boxing regulators believe the revocation will be honoured by all other states. A new federal law doesn't specifically address whether licence revocations have to be honoured in other jurisdictions.

"I think the spirit of the law dictates it," said Joe Rolston, the deputy attorney general who prosecuted Tyson. "But if a state wants to have Mike Tyson there are probably ways around the federal act."

New Jersey's top boxing regulator agreed.

"I'm sure Mike Tyson is being the attraction he is in the sport of boxing, and the attraction he is in the State of Nevada, and
