Ellwood and McQuillan were picked Friday despite the recent good form of teammates Kunce and Kerry-Anne Guse in Europe. In the 3-2 victory against South Africa earlier this year,

Ellwood, who in the latest rankings in 66th, defeated Joanette Kruger while McQuillan, with seven years' experi-ence in the Fed Cup, beat top 10 player Amanda Coetzer. Against Australia, Spain

will be looking to erase the memory of their last Fed Cup match where they lost 5-0 to Belgium. Spain needs to beat Australia to stay in the eightteam World Group 1.

### Becker will be at US Open

NEW YORK, July 11: Former champion Boris Becker entered the upcoming US Open on Thursday, ending speculation that his recent Wimbledon appearance would be his last at a Grand Slam event, reports Reuter.

The 29-year-old Becker announced after his quarter-final loss to Pete Sampras last week at the All-England Club that it had been his last appearance at Wimbledon, a tournament he won three times.

The German, who won the US Open in 1989, will be giving Grand Slam tennis at least one more try next month at Flushing Meadows.

"I'm very glad that Boris will make at least one more appearance at the US Open," said tournament director Jay Snyder. "He has always been one of the most exciting players in the sport and an integral part of US Open history the last 12 years."

Backer has not played in the US Open since 1995 when he lost to Andre Agassi in the semifinals. He missed last year's event due to an injured right wrist.



BEIRUT, July 11: The Beirut Sports City, flattened by Israeli warplanes in 1982, has emerged from the horrors of devastating conflict to host the 8th Pan-Arab Games and stand as testimony to Lebanon's post-war revival, reports AFP.

The Games will be opened Saturday by President Elias Hrawi and prominent foreign visitors including Arab League secretary general Esmat Abdel Meguid and Juan Antonio Samaranch, chairman of the International Olympic Committee.

Some 3,000 athletes from 19 Arab countries alongwith hundreds of trainers and administrators and thousands of foreign spectators are expected in Beirut for the July 12-27 Games.

The astonishing come back of the capital's sports city is seen by the government of Prime Minister Rafic Hariri as the jewel of the ambitious 18billion-dollar rebuilding programme launched after the 1975-1990 civil war.

### Marcelo bites the dust

GSTAAD, Switzerland, July 11: Fourth seed Marcelo Rios was sent packing by Spain's Juan Albert Viloca in the second round of the Swiss Open on Thursday, reports Reuter. Viloca swept aside the world

No 9 6-3, 7-6. While it was Viloca's first ever win over a top 10 player, it was the second time in three meetings that he had beaten the moody Chilean.

"That guy, sometime he plays unbelievable and if he's playing well he's difficult to beat," said Viloca. "I beat him before but then he was number 11, so this is a good win for me."

Kiefer, ranked 68 in the world, one spot below Viloca. advanced with a 7-5, 6-3 win over American Richey Rene-berg, who had upset defending champion Albert Costa in the first round.

Seventh seed Alberto Berasategui set up an all-Spanish quarterfinal clash with Corretja by prevailing 7-6, (7-2), 1-6, 7-5 over Italy's Renzo Furlan in a seesaw battle that was twice interrupted by rain.

Pioline, the first Frenchman since 1946 to reach the Wimbledon final, was trailing second seeded Alex Corretja of Spain 2-6, 2-3 when he was forced to abandon the match because of a sore right arm.

Pioline said he would return to action at the Canadian Open on July 28.

### Paes in Hall of Fame semis

NEWPORT, Rhode Island, July 11: Seventh seed Leander Paes of India upset top seed Alex Radulescu of Germany 6-3, 7-6 on Thursday to reach the semifinals of the 255,000 dollars Hall of Fame tennis championships, reports Reuter.

The 24-year-old Paes, surprise bronze medal winner at the Atlanta Olympics, ended the quarter-final match in straight sets by storming to a 7-1 decision in the tie-break.

# Some solace for Mike

CATSKILL, New York, July 11: Mike Tyson and former trainer Kevin Rooney may

have their differences, but even Rooney believes the boxer's indefinite ban from the sport is a bit much, reports

"He had to be suspended. think a year was satisfactory. I think a year is more than enough," Rooney said Wednesday after the Nevada State Athletic Commission revoked Tyson's licence and fined him 3 million dollars for biting Evander Holyfield's ears in a June 28 title fight.

Tyson can reapply for his licence in a year, but it will be up to the commission to decide if he will fight again. Some residents in this small

town, where Tyson used to train, criticised the decision. "The only reason they did it

is because he's Mike Tyson and they hate the fact that he came from the streets," said Linc Harris, who, like Tyson, originally hails from Brooklyr. " think they should have treated him fairly like they would have treated everybody else." Tyson lived and trained here in the '80s with Cus D'Amato,

who later adopted him. After D'Amato's death in 1985, Tyson continued to work with Rooney in Catskill until he fired the trainer in 1988. While Harris and others believe Tyson should have been


punished, they think the penalty is too harsh Rooney, who is suing Tyson for breach of contract, said the penalty leaves Tyson's career in limbo and called it a "death sen-

That means that some one

commission even had the authority to ban Tyson. "You can be banned for substance abuse, medical reasons. and that's about it," he said.

"There are tons of fighters out there who do stupid things. I don't think he should be banned for a lifetime at all "she said. Harris lamented not only the fate of Tyson, but of boxing

"Boxing isn't going to be anything unless those two fight," he said. "I think they should have let bygones be bygones, suspended him ... and give him a

"I don't think they should take away a man's life and end his career over it. It was a mistake."

Meanwhile, Tyson may get a chance to talk about boxing even before he tries to climb back into the ring. The former heavyweight

champ could eventually return as an analyst for Showtime's boxing broadcast team. Jan Larkin, an executive producer for Showtime boxing

programmes, said that reports that the cable network was considering hiring Tyson to help deliver the blow-by-blow of matches were premature. "I will not rule out anything,

nor will I endorse anything at this moment, until I know what Mike is doing with his life." Larkin said.

Technically, Tyson is only prevented from boxing in Nevada. But other states are expected to honour the ban.

Showtime has not had any contact with Tyson since the fight, Larkin said. And the network, realising credibility is an issue, would not consider using him as an analyst until he shows he has gotten his life back on track.

"Mike has a lot of accounting to do, a lot of healing to do. And I don't think that throwing him in front of a camera would be the best thing right now,' Larkin said. "... But at the right time, it's something we would

Tyson has worked as an analyst for Showtime on two previous occasions, the first time in 1990, just before he went to prison for his rape conviction and a second time in 1995, Larkin said.

"He did an excellent job both times," Larkin said.
