judgement

By Staff Correspondent Sammilito Nari Samaj. a women's organisation. has expressed surprise at the court judgement ordering release of all the three accused in the Sheema rape case in Chittagong.

"The verdict proves the government's incompetence in framing charges against the accused and the charges lacked adequate proofs for the rape which ultimately helped the culprits get rid of the case," said a statement of the organisation issued last night.

"Absence of proofs does not prove there was no rape," it pointed out.

Quoting reports from Chittagong, the statement said the accused were celebrating thejudgement which it said had demeaned the women community of the country and had exposed it to a great threat.

A case was filed with Raozan thana against five people - Abdul Hafiz, SI Uttam Kumer Majumder and constables Sadeq Ali, Goura Chandra Karmaker

and Abul Bashar. Later, Shima was sent to Chittagong jail for safe custody where she died mysteriously on February 9 this year. A UD case

was filed. Afterwards, the home ministry formed a probe body to enquire into the mysterious death of the girl. A parliamentary committee was also formed with Foreign Minister Abdus Samad Azad as its chief to investigate the death in jail,

which is still conducting investigation. After their arrest, the four accused policemen were sent to Chittagong jail. First, they were temporarily suspended under Police Officials Special Ordi-

nance. The court, after hearing, exempted Abdul Hafiz from charge.

After the verdict of the rape case, Public Prosecutor Advocate Nurus Safa Talukder told UNB that they would think about appeal to the High Court after getting the copy of the judgement. Officially, two days may be needed for getting the judgement.





Dhaka was 182 mm against 386 mm monthly average of 47 per cent of it. In Sylhet, it was 328 mm against 528 mm (62 per cent), in Chittagong 231 mm against 690 mm (33 per cent), in Rajshahi 254 mm against 395 mm (64 per cent) and in Khulna 111 mm against 358 mm (31 per cent).
