But due to corruption of some food officials and dishonest traders, the farmers are being compelled to sell their produce at throw away prices.

The smugglers mainly use six ghats as their transit points. Huge amount of urea fertilizer. Hilsa fish and electronic goods go out of the country to India while different goods, including fruits and essentials, smuggle into the country through these routes.





Some local tribal people including Proma Marma, Bourani Chamchamda, Sushil Borua, Meoching Marma and Ulachi Borua said no official has so far visited them since they took shelter in Bilkis Begum High School on July 9.

They also said they got only three tons of rice from poura commissioners who collected it on emergency basis from those people who were not affected by the flood.

Salma, 20, daughter of Mozammel Hug was married to Habibur Rahman, son of Abu Bakkar of village Bashbaria under Alamdanga thana on cash payment of dowry of Taka 7 thousand. But later on the husband demanded more. He tortured her frequently.

On June 18 when Salma was sleeping her husband poured kerosine on her body and set on fire. Salma shouted for help, but no body came to her rescue. She was burnt severely. The father of Salma filed a case accusing Habib and his father Abu Bakkar under Women and Children Repression Act of 1995.

Alamdanga police have arrested Abu Bakkar. Salma has shifted to Faridpur General Hospital. Later she was removed to Dhaka where she died on June 24. Habibur Rahman is still absconding.
