The Sri Lankans, bowled out for 239 after being sent in to bat on a damp wicket, restricted Pakistan to 224 after Salim Malik appeared to be running away with the match with a stroke ful 57.

Malik put on 63 for the fifth wicket with Inzamamul Haq (48) and 40 for the sixth with Moin Khan (14) to lift Pakistan to 205 for five by the 46th over.

But left-arm spinner Sanath Jayasuriya turned the match in Sri Lanka's way with three of the next four wickets-all to catches in the deep by Ruwan Kalpage as Pakistan managed to add only 19 more runs: Off spinner Kumara Dhar-

masena lent admirable support by bowling Malik out in the 48th over to finish with one for 33 runs in 10 disciplined overs. The Sri Lankans won despite an indifferent batting display in which three batsmen were




