Army continuing relief work in flood-hit areas

Members of the Bangladesh Army are continuing their relief activities in coordination with the local administration at different flood-hit areas, an ISPR press release said yesterday reports BSS.

Army personnel belonging to the Chittagong area of the Bangladesh Army so far have distributed 2,000 kgs of chira, 600 kgs of gur, 800 kgs of biscuits, 5,000 pieces of bread, 300 packets of oral saline and pure drinking water among the flood victims at Bandarban area.

Meanwhile, the Comilla area of the Bangladesh Army on request from the local civil administration, engaged a group of army personnel at the Jaffarganj Companygani section of the Gumti Embankment for round-the-clock patrol to forecast its possible breach.

Another team of army personnel reached Habiganj for ascertaining the extent of damage to the Purnabazar Bridge at Shaistaganj on the Dhaka-Sylhet highway, the press release said.

Bangladesh Air Force helicopters are air lifting food and other relief materials from Chittagong to Bandarban and other flood affected areas everyday.

Meanwhile, Bangladesh Navy ships have also been kept ready for taking part in flood relief activity if required.

Hartal hampers relief work

Relief materials could not be reached and relief work was not possible to conduct in 20 flood affected districts of the country due to yesterday's hartal, reports BSS.

A government sources said no transport could ply from thana or government godowns with relief materials during the day due to hartal programme.

It was also stated that the relief workers all over the country faced obstacles due to absence of the relief transports which has increased the sufferings of the flood victims.

Directive to send more medical teams to flood-hit areas

Health and Family Welfare Minister Salahuddin Yusuf has directed the authorities concerned to send more medical teams to the flood-affected areas of Bandarban, Cox's Bazar and Chittagong districts, reports UNB.

A good number of medical teams with adequate medicines and water purifying tables are now working in the flood-affected areas of the districts.

Suranjit visits flood-damaged Khowai bridge

Suranjit Sengupta, Parliamentary Affairs Advisor to the Prime Minister, along with senior officials of the Roads and Highways Division, recently visited Purnabazar where the bridge on the River Khowai has collapsed, reports BSS.

The bridge on the Habiganj-Shayestaganj road collapsed a few days ago due to the strong current of the river created by heavy rains and on-rush of waters, resulting in disruption in road communication between Sylhet and rest of the country.

Talking to BSS, Suranjit Sengupta said the wreckage of the bridge fell into the river bed diverting the flow, which is threatening the embankment. "A breach has already been developed in the embankment," he said.

Sengupta directed the officials to remove the wreckage from the river bed and set up a Bailey bridge immediately to restore road communication between Sylhet and rest of the country.

He said various perishable goods, particularly the exportable ones, were now being stockpiled as there was no means of transporting them to the capital elsewhere.

A makeshift communication arrangement has, however, been made for the movement of light vehicles from Habiganj to Dhaka via Aoushanki. Sengupta said adding, police posts have also been established at various places to look after security.

Flood Information Centre bulletin says Goalundo, Louhajang Srinagar may be flooded afresh

As the Ganges continued to surge rapidly at all points, more areas of Goalundo in Rajbari, and Louhajang and Srinagar thanas of Munshiganj district may be flooded afresh, reports UNB.

Four other rivers — the Brahmaputra, Dharla, Surma and the Khushia — were also flowing above their respective danger marks yesterday, a Flood Information Centre bulletin here said.

Flood situation of Rowmari and Chilmari thanas of Kurigram district, Kazipur, Belkuchi, Chouhali, Shajadpur and Sadar thanas of Sirajganj district may start improving.

The situation in Bani Bazar, Zakiganj, Kanaighat, Companyganj and Sadar thanas of Sylhet district and Chhatak, Doara Bazar and Sadar thanas of Sunamganj district may also improve.

According to the bulletin, the Brahmaputra registered fall at upstream points while the rivers in the Meghna and South Eastern Hill basin recorded rise and fall in the last 24 hours ending at 9 am yesterday.

Forecasting for the next 24 hours, the centre predicted the Brahmaputra at Chilmari is likely to fall by 12 cm and may flow 27 cm below danger level.

at Bahadurabad it may fall by 8 cm and may flow 25 cm above danger level, at Sirajganj it is likely to fall by 3 cm and may flow 19 cm below danger level, and at Aricha it is likely to rise by 6 cm and may flow 4 cm above danger level.

The Ganges at Goalundo is likely to rise by 15 cm and may flow 20 cm above danger level, and at Bhagyakul by 12 cm and may flow 28 cm above danger level.

In Brahmaputra basin, the Brahmaputra was flowing by 37 cm above danger mark at Bahadurabad and the Dharla at Kurigram by 1 cm above the danger level. All rivers in the basin were flowing below their danger marks.

All the rivers in the Ganges basin were flowing below the danger levels, excepting the Ganges at Bhagyakul, where it was flowing 14 cm above danger mark.

In Meghna basin, the Surma was flowing above danger marks by 1.15m at Kanaighat, 11 cm at Sylhet and by 35cm at Sunamganj while the river Kusiara by 1.60m at Amalshid and 50cm at Sheola.

All the rivers in Southeastern Hill basin were flowing below their respective danger marks.

30 lakh people affected by flooding in 21 dists

Nearly thirty lakh people, belonging to 4,63,621 families, have been affected by the current spate of flash flood that hit 21 districts of the country.

A top official of the Ministry of Relief told BSS yesterday that till Monday evening, 29,01,148 people in 96 thanas were recorded to have been affected by the sudden surge of water. He said the floods, caused mainly by incessant rains for days together, damaged crops on nearly 160,321 acres of land.

The floods claimed 69 lives till Monday. The deaths were caused mostly by landslide and drowning. Many people were also injured as houses collapsed.

The official said 3,77,099 dwelling houses were damaged, of which 14,412 were fully destroyed. Due to the damage to houses, many people have taken shelter in government designated centres and other places organised by NGOs or local bodies.

He said although the actual extent of damage is yet to be fully computed, according to preliminary figures, the flash floods so far spoiled 178km flood embankment and damaged 280 bridges and culverts. A total of 286 educational institutions were either fully or partially damaged, he said.

The official denied incidents of gastroenteritis in the affected areas as has been reported, and said arrangements have been made for supply of dry food and pure drinking water. Besides, water purifying tables have been supplied and measures taken so that tubewells could function in those areas. He further said a good number of medical teams are also working in the affected areas.

Dwelling on the cause of the current floods, the official said it was due to excessive rainfalls. The entire month's average rains poured down in less than a week, and as the absorption capacity of the water bodies got exhausted, flooding occurred. Bandarban experienced record rainfall in more than two decades, he said adding the situation was similar in other places.

As fair weather is now prevailing, water has begun receding from many areas particularly in the hilly districts, he said adding that as a result, the

Prof ABM Akhtarul Huq, former secretary of Comilla Education Board, Professor of Philosophy and

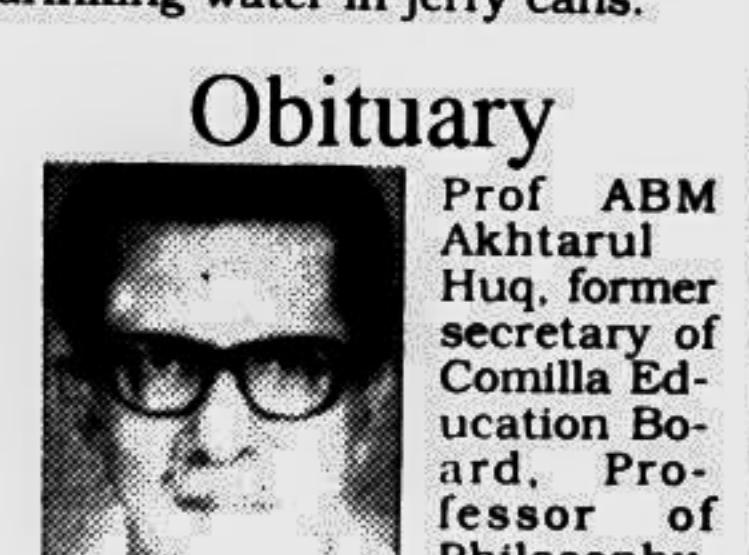
former Principal of Khagrachari Govt College, died in the early hours yesterday. He was 74, says a press release.

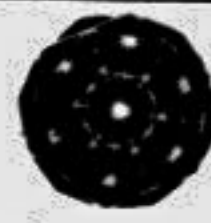
