'Salman Shah's murder was pre-planned'

Rizvi Ahmed, arrested in connection with the alleged murder of popular film star Salman Shah, has confessed in the Chief Metropolitan Magistrate's Court that he was involved in the murder.

Rizvi was produced in the court Tuesday on the expiry of his one-day police remand. Cantonment police arrested

him Sunday night from a house in the city's DOHS area where Salman's parents are now residing.

According to Rizvi's confessional statement, Salman's murder was pre-planned. He said, following instructions from the 'Godfathers', the murderer went up to the apartment of Salman at Eskaton Plaza at about 2 am on the day of the incident. He then called up a waiting group which included Rizvi. The murderer knocked the door and Salman's wife, Samira opened it. The group entered the

The petitioners also prayed that IFIC and its directors be asked to show cause as to why they shall not be restrained from holding the AGM of IFIC on July 27, and further prayed for an ad-interim injunction to that effect, pending the disposal of the application.


