Asian b'ball qualifiers from Aug 5

The Asian basketball championship Middle-East zone qualifying round will be held at the National Indoor Gymnasium at Mirpur from August 5 to

8, reports BSS. Two teams will qualify for the final round to be held in Saudi Arabia later in the year.

Sri Lanka and India have already confirmed their participation. Ujbekistan is also expected to take part. Bangladesh will be the other team.

An organising committee has been formed with Commerce and Industries Minister Tofael Ahmed as its chairman.

Mexico bid impresses PASO

WINNIPEG, Canada, July 27 Delegates at the 34th general assembly of the Pan-America Sports Organisation enthusiastically greeted a presentation Saturday by Guadalajara in its bid to host the 2003 Pan-American Games, reports AFP.

The Mexican City's bid for the 2003 Games was the final presentation by the four candidates to host the event.

While the three other bids by Santiago (Chile), Santo Domingo (Dominican Republic) and Medellin (Colombia) — received polite applause, the slick Guadalajara presentation was greeted as "incredible, brilliant, wild, by delegates here.

The Guadalajara video, accompanied by Mariarchi music. feature views of some of the city's most scenic spots and sporting venues.

The current president of PASO is Mexico's Mario Vasquez Rana, who presided over the 1975 Panams in Mexico City.

Because of a possible appearance of bias. Vasquez told reporters he would be suggesting that the decision on the 2003 venue be made outside Mexico.

He said he would be polling PASO members to try to find a consensus on where and when the decision should be made.

Nevertheless, after Guadalajara's presentation Saturday, a deliberately ambiguous Vasquez beamed: "Never as president of PASO will I move a finger to help Guadalajara in its bid: however, as president of the Mexican Olympic Committee, I will do all I can for them."

Guadalajara has a budget of 140 million US dollars for the Games with everything so far having been paid by sponsors.

To sweeten the offer, the city provided two airline tickets (to Guadalajara) in a gift package to the presidents and secretaries of all the National Olympic Committees here.

Santo Domingo offered a more toned down presentation. perhaps symbolic of their city's weak economy.

The ongoing 17th Federation Cup football tournament experienced a bizarre second spell of inauguration yesterday after it had been duly declared open last week.

Shamimuzzaman Basunia the treasurer of the Bangladesh Football Federation (BFF) stunned all who were present at the stadium when he performed the opening of what the organisers called the beginning of the eight-team second phase.

The season's curtain-raiser was earlier kicked off on July 20 with the general secretary of the BFF, Harun-ur-Rashid gracing the much-publicised ceremony as-the chief guest. But the publicity-happy organisers, who had to take the back seat during the inaugural ceremony. formulated an unprecedented scheme to let the tournament have another inauguration with the centrestage seized by the rest of the BFF bosses, not to mention for yet another photo

session. The BFF supremo Mayor Mohammad Hanif, who had missed the July 20 inauguration, arrived late at the stadium but managed to get introduced with the players on completion of the first match.

Mohammedan defenders have a good run for their money, had Ponir beaten fair and square with a grounder. But the ball narrowly missed the far post.

After surviving those close calls Mohammedans never looked back once Shabbir celebrated his second goal seven minutes into the second half to give his side an unassailable 3lead.

Alfaz then sealed the fate of the match in the 74th minute shooting home a square pass from Shabbir. But Mohammedans could have run away with an even flattering margin of victory had not the attempts of Arman and substitute Ranjan ricocheted off the cross-piece in the last quarter of the see-saw encounter.

Although the commendable victory suggests an boastful start for the defending champions, the new-look defence appeared to be very fragile in absence of Jewel RNA who deserted the Mohammedan tent for Muktijoddha after captaining them last year.

NASHVILLE, Tennessee, July 27: The United States will have at least a few familiar faces at the World Championships next January in Perth. Australia, reports Reuter.

The first swimmers to qualify for the US team Saturday night at the Phillipe 66 US national championships were 1996 Olympians Jenny Thompson, Amy van Dyken, Kurt Grote, Jeremy Linn, Josh Davis and Brooke Bennett.

The top two finishers in each event qualify for the World January 8-18.

The seven-day meet is also serving as selection trials for the Pan-Pacific Games in Japan August 10-13 and World University Games August 25-30-in Sicily: Thompson, 24, qualified in

the 100-metre freestyle. Her morning preliminary time of 54.95 seconds was the fastest time swum in the world this year. She won in 54.96. Van Dyken, 24, the top US gold medal winner at the 1996 Olympics with four, was second

Indianapolis. He has run only once since then and finished fifth in a 400metre race in Paris, snapping his 58-race winning streak in the event. From Paris, Johnson returned home to Dallas and began two-a-day workouts and
