"I am very excited and success is definitely on the cards when everyone here is fit. Our main aim for next season will

be a European place."

World number one Pete Sampras withdrew from the event last week with a nagging arm injury.

In other matches Monday, 12th-seeded Jonas Bjorkman of Sweden beat Bobby Kokavec of Canada 6-2, 6-3 and No. 15 Jan Siemerink of the Netherlands defeated Leander Paes of India 6-3, 6-4.

ATHENS, July 29 International sports officials keep telling Greeks the World

Championships is the biggest sports event they will host since the first modern Olympic Games were held here in 1896, reports AP.

But Greeks hope that Athens' successful hosting of the championships Aug 1-10 will convince sports officials to let them win an even bigger prize:

the 2004 Summer Olympics. "The benefits from the championships will be enormous. The image of Greece will be at the epicenter of international attention, an event that can't be translated into economic terms," said Sports Min-

ister Andreas Fouras. Sports officials here are hoping members of the International Olympic Committee will be impressed enough to vote for Athens when they meet in Lausanne, Switzerland, Sept 5 to pick the host city.

Other contenders are Buenos Aires, Argentina; Cape Town, South Africa: Rome: and Stockholm, Sweden.

"We hope the foreign delegations will become ambassadors of goodwill for Greece, something exceptionally important for us since the final decision on the Athens candidacy for the Olympic Games of 2004 is due very soon," Fouras said.

He has made the comment so often in recent months that organisers of the World Championships have even included it in their news bulletin.

"It will go hand in hand with Athens' bid for the 2004 Olympics" said IAAF General Secretary Istvan Gyulai.

Organisers have spared no expense to spruce up the capital and spent 5.6 billion drachmas (20 million dollars) to stage the event. State television has spent an additional 2.8 billion drachmas (10 million dollars) won the tie 2-1.

ATHENS, July 29: Denmark's Kenyan born dual world record holder Wilson Kipketer is certain not to rest on his

laurels or live up to his name which translates into born on the verandah when the 800 metres heats get underway at the World Championships, reports Kipketer, who's age varies

from 26 to 29, has hardly stopped breaking records and winning since he missed out on the Olympics last year because of intransigence on the part of the Kenyan Olympic Commit-The committee did not want

to see one of their own, the reigning world outdoor 800 metres champion, winning gold under a different flag. Kipketer, who moved to

Denmark in 1991, broke his former compatriot Paul Ereng's world indoor 800 metres record at the World Indoor Championships in March and the improved on it two days later in the final.

"I felt that it would be worth seeing how my training regime was going and I think I can say that I shouldn't change a thing,' Kipketer said.

In typical disarming fashion Kipketer said that he had only decided on coming to the World Indoors at the last moment.


Kipketer never gives very much away and said he would train and attempt to break Sebastian Coe's outdoor 800 metres world record of 1:41.73 the longest standing men's world record set in 1981 - in his own way.

"I do not study videos of Coe's races and I don't want to know how he trained. He may have been quicker over 200 or 400 but it's not important to me as the way he trained could be bad for me, I will continue to train in my own style," Kipketer said. He duly went out in Stock-

holm and equalled it though his

reaction was more one of relief that people would stop asking him questions about it. "I could hardly run in the

last 50 yards. I just pushed my-self but it felt as if I was not moving," said an exhausted but delighted Kipketer afterwards.

which Kipketer at first regret-"I thought what on earth have I done coming here, why didn't I go to the United States'? However, as I got involved more in the community then I settled

down and I really liked it," he said. Denmark's favourite adopted son may feel nothing much happens but if he brings home a second gold and sole position of the outdoor world record he will find that underneath it all the Danes like noth-


