Distress on City Roads

Dhaka city roads are unusually short-lived. This is a serious weakness in road infrastructure. And also not a new thing. This seems to have been inherent in our road construction projects for decades. The result: Huge wastage of public money, not to speak of the great sufferings of the road users.

Every monsoon takes a heavy toll of city roads, particularly when downpours are frequent and the city roads become waterlogged due to faulty drainage system. Following the monsoon, repairs to the roads are not taken up and completed promptly. Before completion of repair works, another monsoon sets in. In this way, a vicious circle goes on and with it the sufferings of the city dwellers.

The Dhaka City Corporation (DCC) has reportedly asked for a government grant of Tk 153 crore for repair of the city roads, lanes and by-lanes. Already it was reported that Tk 30 crore has been allocated for repairs of the most important roads and streets that pose a serious risk to the movement of vehicles.

We have noted a disconcerting trend in the matter of city's road repairs. According to a report, the DCC spent only Tk nine crore on road repairs last year and that without much of a plan. This year, the whole summer has gone without anyone showing any concern on this issue. Now when almost all the roads of Dhaka are riddled with potholes and other major damages, the DCC has suddenly sprung into action. It is felt by observers that this being the rainy season, there are serious doubts about how the new re-

There are also some distributing aspects of the matter. The poor quality of work in construction and repairs of the roads seems in a large measure due to the work-awarding system of the DCC. The normal practice here is to award the work to the lowest bidder. There lies the rub. Certain contractors in their bid to win a particular work tender quotes a price much lower than the estimated cost of the work. The contract awarding authority doesn't question how the desired quality of work can be possible with such low rates.

Since the contractors are in business for profit, they keep a safe margin of profit for themselves by using dubious quality materials and work procedure. Even casual observation will show how quality is sacrificed on the basis of lowest tender system. Other reasons for lesser life span of city roads relate allegedly to gross defects in construction procedures. Here there are mainly two types of roads bituminous and concrete. In neither type of road construction, the correct procedure and proportion of mixture of materials are followed. The result is

poor quality of work. Observers are therefore of the view that under the present contracting system with the absence of quality control, the huge expenditure in construction and repairs of roads serve no durable purpose. The urgent need, therefore, in the opinion

It is felt that, as in other quality-conscious countries, the authorities should insist on strict implementation of the given specification of roads under a performance contract system. Therefore, there should be and end to the existing practice of sloppiest work with trashy materials.

About maintenance work, it is felt that the policy of DCC should be based on the timetested proverb: A stitch in time saves nine. If a pothole appears on a road after a spell of rain, it has to be repaired soonest or it has to be filled up tightly so that it does not become much larger. and a complete repair work should be done between two manageable spells of rain.

Again, there are roads the construction of which take months and even years, and the people face much trouble as the roads, even in busy places, remain closed for an unusually long period. The same thing happens when the roads are re-

Recently, a co-ordination committee came into being with the city Mayor and the LGRD minister acting as co-chairmen. We are not aware whether this has made any significant difference in putting their acts together in the matter of public utility services of the metropolitan agencies. It is, therefore, suggested that the committee of co-ordination of the city's development programmes meet more frequently for doing its jobs better and much more efficiently.

Delay in transfer of lines hampering TRE, says WB

The World Bank (WB) has suggested the Bangladesh Power Development Board (PDB) and Dhaka Electricity Supply Authority (DESA) to expedite the transfer of lines, sub-stations and consumers to the project of Pally Biddutayan Samity (PBS) for smooth implementation of its third rural electrification programme (TRE) with Rural Electrification Board (REB), reports BSS.

A WB source said here yesterday that due to the delay in transfer of lines, sub-stations and consumers to PBS, the project's line erection work by REB is being hampered.

Under the TRE project, the WB has already disbursed 60.09 million US dollar out of the total 79.60 million dollar. The project, which is expected to be completed by June 30 next year has the components of distribution network installation in four new samities in Comilla. Cox's Bazar, Dinajpur and Manikganj, and expansion of five existing samities in Rangpur, Sirajganj, Meherpur and

The source said apart from installation and expansion. seven samities will be intensified in Bagerhat, Barisal, Chittagong, Madaripur, Meherpur, Narsingdi and Noakhali. Rehabilitation of distribu-

tion lines and sub-stations taken over from PDB, construction of REB central facilities and technical assistance and training are also the components of the TRE.

While pointing out some major problems facing the project, the WB source said delays are being encountered by suppliers in getting release of retention amounts. REB's loan reconciliation with the government is also being delayed.

The source said it is necessary to carry out a study to assess the magnitude of direct and indirect subsidies for rural electrification system and determine the net transfer of funds between the government and the REB on account of rural electrification programme.

has been facing difficulties because system losses in areas transferred by PDB or DESA are

To take up as some of the key actions for removing the bottlenecks in the implementation of the TRE project, the WB has also suggested the REB to review all pending claims from suppliers and release the retention amounts, and said the material accounting manual and the new accounting policy should be implemented.

The bank said REB, as decided earlier, has to carry out a study immediately to review PBS's financial viability and extent of government subsidies with its own staff.

The source said the World Bank has requested REB to report quarterly progress, the progress of the task force to reduce losses including identifying reasons of high system loss

The experts of WB, however are satisfied with the overall progress of implementation of the project, the source added.

lal's death was the inevitable result of uncompromising conflict among three rival unions backed by the then ruling party (BNP)," the petition said.

It added, "Although everybody knew the cause of the death of Billal, nobody opened mouth so far due to political reason and the situation prevailing inside the Titas Gas Co." Till late 1989, there was only

one employees' union in the Titas Gas Company. In '89, the then ruling party. Jatiya Party. backed up a new union. This union extended its support to BNP after it came to power. Soon, some "unscrupulous" union leaders formed two new unions with support from BNP. Existence of three unions backed by the same political party led to severe conflict among them, resulting in the death of Billal.

Elaborating further, it said. at around 10 am on July 9. 1992, a clash between activists of the rival unions began. During the clash, Billal, a member of one of the three conflicting unions, fell from the seventh

Afterwards, the "unscrupuious" leaders and their influential "political masters" held the leaders of the original union responsible for the death, although they were not involved in the conflict.

General Manager Khandker Moniruzzaman and office assistant Faruk Hasan Joarder (also the general secretary of the original union) and nearly 30 others were accused of murdering Billal. Of them,

quitted by the court. Others are

project proposal including the BOT and the lease agreement was finalised. With the formal signing of the contract on the basis of BOT on December 1, Indus went to the Gulshan Registrars Office to register the land the next day. Officials of different gov-

ernment and private organisations expressed their surprise how BOT system of such a project was adopted without any study whatsoever. "BOT scheme on Dhaka Eastern Bypass Study is being examined for over long time to see whether it is viable or not," said a senior engineer of Public Works Department (PWD). He said he was surprised how a 213 million dollar project got through without any study and without the consent of the External Resources Division, the Prime Minister and

the Planning Commission. The lease agreement gives the lessee the power to transfer. mortgage, sublease, charge or otherwise assign, sublet, encumber or in any way part with any portion or the whole of the property without the prior con-

sent of Rajuk.

In a recent letter to the Works Ministry, the Rajuk Chairman said initially 150 acres of this land were earmarked for the project. He claimed that when Indus surveyed the area and found 70 acres more, this was later incorporated.

For the approval of the plans, Indus submitted its formal proposals to Rajuk on January 20 this year and those were approved in a couple of days bypassing all departmental procedures and law of the land.

As per the original agreement, all Indus payments should have been made in foreign currency. But documents show it paid Tk 23.10 lakh plan fees in local currency, violating the agreement and foreign currency rule.

In the original agreement, Member (estate) and Member (finance) of Rajuk and Khorshed Ansar Khan, Joint Secretary Ministry of Works, signed as

witnesses. Asked if he signed after verifying whether Rajuk had complied with the procedures, Khorshed Ansar said he could not remember signing any such document. "I sign so

many things with Rajuk, I can-

not remember which one you

are talking about," he said. Whenever a Rajuk land is leased out, its town Planning, Engineering and Estate departments hand over the property after a joint survey. In this case, the 220 acres were handed over only with the participation of the Estate Department.


