
BIEL, Switzerland, Aug 2: Viswananthan Anand of India clinched the prestigious Credit Swiss Grand Masters' title, stamping his authority as the best player in the Grand Masters circuit when he drew with the FIDE world champion Anatoly Karpov of Russia, here today, reports PTI.

World number two Anand's authority on top remained intact with this victory - his fifth crown in seven tournaments during the year — which came after having been leading the tournament from the beginning. He faced a shock defeat at the hands of Vladim Milov of Switzerland in the seventh round, when he shared the lead with Karpov.

"It is always good to maintain a winning streak and I am happy to win the tournament all alone," Anand said pointing out that he shared the titles with others in most of the tournaments he won during the



his eighth Test century as India made an impressive start in the first cricket Test against Sri Lanka here today,

report agencies. His 111, supported by a dazzling unbeaten 65 by skipper Sachin Tendulkar and a typically sedate 69 from Rahul Dravid lifted India to 280 for three at close of the opening day's play.

Sidhu, 34, playing only his 41st Test in an international career spanning 14 years, took advantage of a slow wicket at the Premadasa Stadium.

He followed his unbeaten hundred in a drawn three-day match with his second tour century, made with the help of 13 fours and two sixes.

Displaying tremendous confidence, Sidhu hit the first of two sixes when off-spinner Muttiah Muralitharan came on to bowl his first over. He sent the ball out of the ground at long-on and picked the second six off the same bowler over mid-off.

The opener stayed at the crease for 260 minutes and was out edging a Chaminda Vaas delivery for wicket keeper Romesh Kaluwitharana to take the catch in front of first slip.

Dravid batted impressively to 69 before losing his wicket in the most unusual of circumstances.

Dravid played a delivery from left-arm spinner Sanath Jayasuriya hard on the back foot but the ball hit the ankle of silly point fielder Marvan Atapattu to rebound to the bower for a return catch.

It was Dravid's ninth halfcentury in 23 innings since his debut in England last year and provided the Indians the ideal launching pad for a big first innings score.


