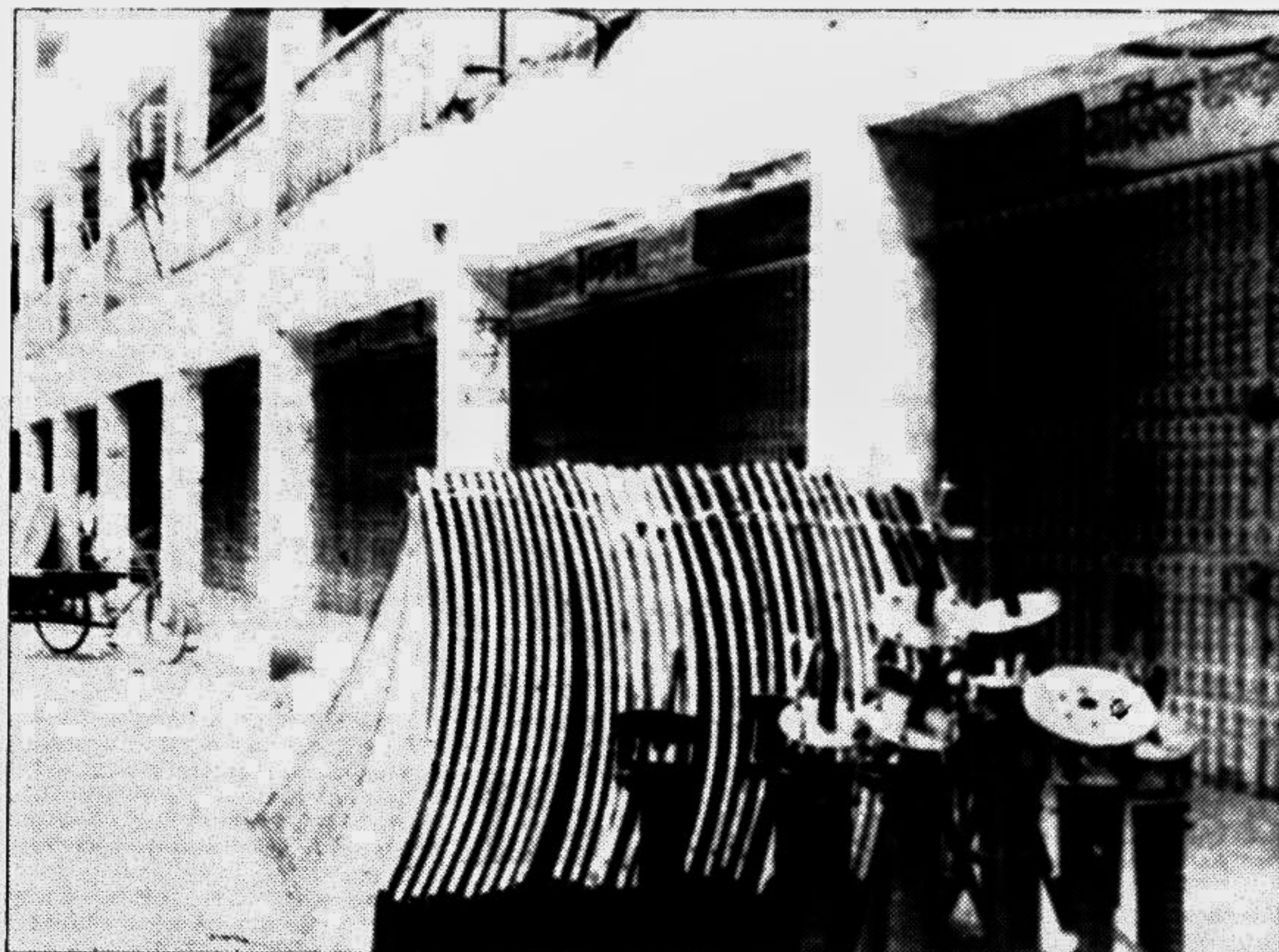

Ctg mass killing case: Further hearing today

CHITTAGONG, Aug 4: The court here today resumed hearing for framing charges against the lone accused, former CMP Commissioner Mirza Raquibul Huda, in the case of mass killing by police firing at Laldighi Maidan in 1988, reports UNB.

District and Sessions Judge Mohammad Zahurul Islam, after an hour-long submission by the defence lawyer, fixed tomorrow for further hearing in response to a prayer for time by the government side.

Twenty-two people were killed and more than a hundred injured on January 24, 1988 when police opened fire on Awami League leader Sheikh Hasina's entourage on way to attend a public meeting at Laldighi Maidan during the Ershad regime.

Pleading against the framing of charge against Raquibul Huda, defence counsel Ahsanul Huq Hena submitted that since the accused himself had not fired, nor did he burn the bodies in crematorium, there is no proof of concealment of cognizance.

When principal accused is not sued, then charge could not be framed against an abettor, he said quoting DLR 26 in page 219.

Sino-Indian border talks resume

NEW DELHI, Aug 4: India and China resumed running talks on a border dispute here today, Indian Foreign Ministry sources said, reports AFP.

The two-day talks in New Delhi, following a visit by Chinese President Jiang Zemin last year, will focus on implementing treaties signed during previous negotiations, the sources said.

China's Vice Foreign Minister Tang Jiaxuan heads the Chinese delegation while India's Foreign Secretary K Ram Nath is leading the host team.

The two neighbours fought a limited but bitter frontier war in 1962, leading to the mutual withdrawal of ambassadors. Those ties were restored 14 years later.

India says that China still holds around 40,000 square kilometres (16,000 square miles) of Indian-claimed territory at Aksai Chin in Kashmir northwest India. China lays claim to a large swathe of Indian territory in the northeastern state of Arunachal Pradesh.

The current talks are the 10th round of Sino-Indian negotiations since 1988. The last were held in October last year.

Showcase on Khatib: IF body meets soon

The governing body of the Islamic Foundation will meet soon to take a decision regarding the reply to a showcase notice served on the Khatib of national Mosque Baitul Mukarram.

State Minister for Religious Affairs Moulana Md Nurul Islam told The Daily Star yesterday that the meeting would be convened as soon as the official probe committee submitted its report on the untoward incident at the July 17 Miladun Nabi function at Baitul Mukarram premises.

The three-member probe committee, headed by a joint secretary of the ministry, would submit its report by August 7, the state minister hoped. The committee was formed at the last meeting of the governing body on July 22.

Moulana Nurul Islam said, before taking any decision on the issue, both the probe body report and the Khatib's reply will be taken into consideration.

The Khatib, Moulana Obaidul Huq was earlier served with a notice to showcase why he should not be relieved of his responsibilities.

In his reply, Obaidul Huq termed the allegations, mentioned in the notice, 'not true and baseless.'

On July 17, President Justice Shahabuddin Ahmed had left the Miladun Nabi function amidst a chaotic situation.

The clash between the rival groups was over a conflict related to a local club, local people said. The chase and counter-chase between the rival groups created a widespread panic around the Shantinagar bazaar area for sometime.

Motijheel police said they could not arrest anyone in this connection till last night. They were preparing to file a case in this regard.

Kibria invited to address C'wealth Business Forum

Finance Minister SAMS Kibria has been invited to address the Commonwealth Business Forum which will be held in London from October 22 to 23 as a prelude to the four-day Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting (CHOGM) in Edinburgh beginning October 24, reports AFP.

Devi, elected to parliament last year after serving 11 years in jail without trial, told the lower houses: 'punish me if I am guilty, but once I have been pardoned, I should be allowed to lead a normal life.'

'I will self-immolate if I am not allowed to lead a normal life.'

The 35-year-old Devi, who comes from the northern state of Uttar Pradesh and is a hero among low-caste Hindus, faces 55 charges of murder and robbery. She has denied them.

She was detained without trial after surrendering in 1983. She was pardoned in 1994.

A recent court hearing, however, overturned the reprieve after the families of the victims demanded a fresh trial.

Devi, who cannot read or write, appealed for a presidential pardon in March before going underground for a while to avoid a court appearance to review the charges against her.

The forum is jointly organised by the Commonwealth Secretariat, the British government and the Financial Times conference.

The invitation to the Bangladesh Finance Minister is a clear recognition of the various reforms undertaken by the government of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina in macro economic management as well as further liberalisation of the economy including establishment of the export processing zones in the private sectors and efforts to privatise state-owned enterprises.
