Jayasuriya's innings had as many as 33 boundaries and two sixes off 568 balls in 782 minutes of batting while Mahanama stroked 25 fours, faced 541 deliveries in an occupation of 740 minutes.

hopeful ATHENS, Aug 5: Triple 3.000m world steeplechase champion Moses Kiptanui's dreams of gaining a fourth title with a new world record have all but melted under the sizzling Greek sun, reports AFP.

Before the World Championships the 26-year-old had been musing over how much faster he could go since his 1995 world record of 7:59.18.

"I can see the 3,000m steeple being run in 7:55, and I believe it will be me," said Kiptanui.

But after easily qualifying for Wednesday's final the Kenyan admitted that the heat in the Olympic Stadium would make it almost impossible. "The heat is incredible. I

found it very difficult to breath," said Kiptanui, who remained last for the first 1,000 metres. "They went off far too fast

for the conditions. I knew they could not keep up that pace," he explained.

He was proved right when he left his rivals standing — at the end of the race.

As the rest of the runners came to a grateful halt in the sweltering stadium, bent over and gasping for breath, Kip-tanui did not even break stride.

He continued on for another 15 metres, turned right and raced through the tunnel and into the bowels of the stadium to collect his tracksuit.

In the end the former corporal in the Kenyan Army was happy to take third place in 8 mins 20.76 seconds.

"It is the final that counts," explained Kiptanui. In the second heat the

Kenyan duo of Bernard Barmasai and Wilson Boit Kipketer ran in tandem to finish first and second.

Earlier this year Kipketer closed in on Kiptanui's world record of 7:59.18 when he ran 8:02.77 in Stockholm and the duel between the two on Wednesday threatens to be one of the championship highlights.

Athens behind expectation

ATHENS, Aug 5. The organisers of the World Athletics Championships are set to lose millions of dollars, it was reported here today because ticket sales are way down on expectation, reports AFP.

The Greek daily newspaper Eleftherotypia said that there would be a huge financial fall out from the lack of paying spectators estimating that ticket sales would only recoup 6.9 million dollars of the cost of hosting the Championships of 51 million dollars. According to the paper fi

tickets were handed out to Greek sports associations on Monday in a desperate attempt to fill up the stadium.

Evangelos Savramis, president of the organising committee, said that 22,000 tickets, out of a capacity of 80,000, had been sold for last Saturday's opening day while a disappointing 46,000 people had paid to watch the 100 metres finals on Sunday, traditionally the blue riband event.

The organisers said on Monday that they were hopeful of reaching a target of 45,000 spectators each day till the Championships and on Sunday still nowhere near what was budgeted for.

SOCOG's new team member

SYDNEY, Aug 5: Nicole Feely, a key member on the staff of Prime Minister John Howard, resigned Monday to take up a senior position with the Sydney Organizing Committee for the Olympic Games. reports AP.

Feely, who was Howard's chief-of-staff and regarded as one of his most influential advisors, will join SOCOG as general manager, government support, the organisation said in a press release. Feely's role will be to serve

as a link between SOCOG and government departments in the lead-up to the 2000 Olympics. "Nicole's background and

experience in government make her ideally suited for his position," said SOCOG chief executive Sandy Hollway.

'The success of the Sydney 2000 Olympic Games will require a close partnership between SOCOG and all levels of government."

ture a world or Olympic track title, the 400-metre runner also has been carrying an anti-discrimination message for her people to be accepted in their own homeland. "I guess I drew strength from

it. Being the first is always special. I'm so glad of what I am -Australian and aboriginal. They're two and the same. "It gives me a special feel-

ing," the 24-year-old Australian said after her World Championship triumph. "I didn't have a lot of energy to carry the two flags but I felt strong enough to hold the two." Freeman, silver medalist at

last year's Olympics in Atlanta and double Commonwealth Games titlist in 1994, has openly used her successes on the track to campaign for aboriginal rights. She said her victory in Athens was politically significant. "It was very important be-

cause it shows I can deal with on me by outsiders," Freeman said. "It makes little children feel they have a chance when they see me, feel me, touch me,

I take my role seriously as role

She won the world title by

beating her close friend and training partner, Jamaica's Sandie Richards, and American former world titlist Jearl Miles-

Richards said she was well aware of Freeman's crusade at home and the problems she encountered from the non-aborig-

"She's from Australia and they don't look up to the aborigines," the Jamaican said. "There are a lot of prejudices against Cathy Freeman.

"They're nominating people to carry the flag in 2000 lat the Sydney Olympics) and some people are questioning why she should be nominated, why does she have to shave her head to get attention and why she hasn't won any big races.

"I held her before the race and told her she could to it even though I was in the race." Richards said. "I told her we could be 1-2." They were.

Richards, Miles-Clark, Germany's Grit Breuer and Freeman appeared level as they hit the straight. The Australian kicked for home in lane one and held off a late charge by Richards, who overtook Miles-Clark in the final 20 minutes but couldn't catch her training partner.

Freeman clocked 49.77 to edge Richards by .02 and Miles-Clark took the bronze in 49.90 ahead of Breuer.

While Freeman made history as the first aboriginal champion, Llewellyn Herbert was the first South African to win a

world championship medal when he placed second in the 400 metres hurdles.

With world and Olympic champion Derrick Adkins already eliminated, another American hurdler, Bryan Bronson, was the big favourite after consistently fast victories all season.

But he trailed Frenchman Stephane Diagana in the straight and was caught in the final few strides by Herbert. Diagana's winning time of 47.70 was fastest of the year, Herbert clocked 47.86 for the silver and a disappointed Bronson had

World and Olympic champion and world record holder Noureddine Morceli of Algeria and this year's fastest, Morocco's Hicham El Guerrouj, are on collision course in the 1,500 metres.

Both won their semifinals to set up a showdown in Wednesday's final.

Sarka Kasparkova of the Czech Republic won the women's triple jump with the world's best leap the year, 15.20. Romania's Rodica Mateescu won the silver with 15.16 and Yelena Govorova of Ukraine placed third ahead of Olga Vasdeki of Greece with 14.62.

Germany's Sabine Braun, titlist in 1991, regained her heptathfon championship with 6,739 points with Olympic bronze medalist Denise Lewis of Britain, winning the silver with 6,654. Remigija Nazaroviene of Lithuania placed third with 6,566.


