ATHENS, Aug 9: Japan's Hiromi Suzuki pulled away from the ftt [1] field 15 kilometres from the end to win the women's marathon

at the World Championship Saturday with no fans in the stadium to see her because of Friday's Stockholm bombing. reports AP. The 28-year-old from Chiba

covered the strenuously undulating 42.195 kilometres course in two hours 29 minutes, 48 seconds.

Defending champion Manuela Machado of Portugal placed second in 2:31.12 and Romania's Lidia Simon won bronze in 2:31.55 ahead of another Japanese Takako Tobise. Simon was one of several athletes treated at the finish line because of dehydration. Olympic champion Fatuma Roba of Ethiopia dropped out about halfway through the race.

Unlike when Spyridon Louis won the first Olympic marathon in 1896, Suzuki ran

Sampras Chang sail into semis

MASON, Ohio, Aug 9: Top seed Pete Sampras and second seed Michael Chang expended little energy in winning quarterfinal matches Friday but fifth seed Thomas Muster had a long struggle against Jan Siemerink at the ATP Championship Friday, reports Reuter.

It look Muster two hours, 43 minutes to grind out a 6-7 (1-7). 7-6 (7-3), 7-6 (7-5) against the 36th-ranked Dutchman.

By contrast Sampras beat seventh-seeded Yevgeny Kafelnikov of Russia 6-2, 6-2 in a brief 53 minutes and Chang scored a 6-1, 6-2 victory over 10th-seeded Gustavo Kuerten of Brazil in 57 minutes.

With the win Chang reached his sixth consecutive ATP Championship semifinal. He won the title here in 1993 and 1994 and reached the final the past two years.

In a match between Spaniards, 14th-seeded Albert Costa emerged the victor over sixth-seeded Sergi Bruguera when at 4-6, 6-3, 5-2 Bruguera retired from the match with cramps that started in his left leg. Éarlier in the week Bruguera was experiencing problems with his neck.

The semifinals pit Sampras against the 17th-ranked Costa and Muster against Chang.

Six of the eight players in the quarter-finals were ranked in the top 10 in the world number one Sampras, number two Chang, number four Muster, number six Kafelnikov, number eight Bruguera and number 10 Kuerten. Only Costa and Siemerink are not members of this elite group.

Some were given oxygen and others liquid on a drip and one was taken to hospital for treatment.

Like Sunday's men's race, the route followed the original run in 490 BC by the soldier Pheidippides, who carried a message that the Greeks had beaten the Persians in battle.

It went from the ancient battlegrounds of the Marathon village past the tombs of the war riors and into the marbled Panathinaikon stadium in central Athens.

ATHENS, Greece, Aug 9: Ato Boldon of Trinidad and Tobago made up for his flop in the

100 metres by streaking to victory in the 200 at the World Championships Friday night for the first major international title of his career, reports AP.

Boldon, who had faded to fifth in the 100 m final last Sunday, made no mistake this time as he pulled away from the field down the straight to win easily in 20.04 seconds. His time would have been faster if he hadn't thrown up his arms in victory before crossing the line. Namibia's Frank Fredericks

won the silver in 20.23, while Brazil's Claudinei Da Silva took the bronze in 20.26. Jon Drummond, who was

even with Boldon at the turn, faded and finished seventh in Boldon was hugged after the

finish by training partner Maurice Greene, who won the 100-metre gold medal last Sunday in 9.86 seconds. Boldon then took a victory lap, tossing his shoes into the stands and jogging the rest of the way in his black socks.

Boldon won the bronze medals in the 100 and 200 at last year's Atlanta Olympics. but until Friday night, he had never fulfilled his brash promises and predictions.

In the women's 200, Merlene Ottey's bid to become the oldest athlete to win a World Championship gold medal was

foiled Friday when she was overtaken by Ukraine's Zhan-

na Pintussevich. The 37-year-old Ottey, the two-time defending champion in the event, got out to a fast start and had a comfortable lead coming around the turn but

faded down the stretch. Pintussevich pulled ahead in the last 10 metres to win in 22.32 seconds. With Ottey tying up, Sri Lanka's Susanthika Jayasinghe outleaned her at the tape to take the silver in 22.39. Ottey had to settle for the bronze in 22.40.

It was Ottey's 14th medal at a world Championship. She al-ready held the record with 13. "It was just the last 20 metres," Ottey said. "I didn't have

the endurance. To win was actually was a long shot for me because I wasn't racing well until the last few races." Kim Batten, who set a world record for the 400-metre hur-

dles at the last Worlds in Gote-

borg, looked well beaten by Olympic champion Deon Hemmings before they reached the final straight. But both were made to look slow by a late burst by Nezha Bidouane of Morocco, who raced past them both for the

gold medal. Hemmings took silver and Batten the bronze. The men's triple jump was expected to be a duel between Edwards, also the world record-

1:44.00. Kenah was another .25 back. Kipketer tied Coe's time a month ago at Stockholm, Sweden and was expected to improve on it here. He was barred from the Atlanta Games last summer because he had renounced his Kenyan citizenship. He will become a Danish citizen in December.

The 26-year-old, who also smashed the indoor 800 mark twice in three days at those championships at Paris in March, is undefeated in the 800 the last two years and is the only runner since 1984 to go under 1:42.
