Abul Hossain's letter yet to be forwarded to President

By Staff Correspondent Resignation letter of State Minister for LGRD and Cooperatives Syed Abul Hossain was not forwarded to President Shahabuddin Ahmed for his acceptance till yesterday.

Syed Abul Hossain tendered his resignation letter to Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina earlier on Sunday last. His resignation followed a visit to Singapore without government's permission, carrying an ordinary passport instead of the diplomatic passport.

Cabinet Secretary Ataul Haq told The Daily Star last night that the resignation letter was vet to be forwarded to the Presi-

Asked why the acceptance is taking such a long time, he said "once the process is completed the news would be made available to the press.

Talking to this correspondent last night, a senior minister said, the resignation would be accepted soon. He, however, could not explain why the process was being delayed.

Some activists of Jativatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCĎ) threw eggs and shoes aiming at the Vice-Chancellor of Dhaka University and damaged his car on the campus yesterday.

The VC, Pro AK Azad Chowdhury, faced the humiliating situation when he went to Jasimuddin Hall and Ziaur Rahman Hall to supervise 'rehabilitation' of the 'displaced' activists of JCD and BCL (Bangladesh Chhatra League) in their respective halls, witnesses said. The VC went to the Jasimuddin Hall first at about 12:30 pm.

Later, JCD activists brought out a procession on the campus at about 2 pm and ransacked the office of the Proctor of the university at the Arts Faculty building.

Yesterday's 'rehabilitation' process began as per an August 9 decision of the DU Paribesh Parishad which comprises representatives of the university authorities and student organi-

The freeze on the bank account of deposed president HM Ershad and his wife Begum Raushan Ershad has been withdrawn.

Bangladesh Bank in a letter

Court on May 14 had withdrawn its instructions for seizure and freezing of the accounts of Ershad and his wife Raushan. The same court had ordered on July 6, 1991 the seizure and freeze of their accounts.

Ershad was enlarged on bail on January 9, 1997. The court order came three months after his release from jail.

Ershad, who was forced to resign after a mass upsurge on December 6, 1990, was convicted in three cases and sentenced to 13 years in jail. But later, he was acquitted in one case, of keeping arms without authorisation, on appeal by the High Court.


