direction. Lewis said track and field's governing body, the International Amateur Athletic Federation (IAAF), had picked the wrong time to cut its bans for serious drugs like steroids from four to two years because of legal problems.

"At a time when everybody thinks the sport is dirty . . what's the message?" the nine-times Olympic champion said before Wednesday's Zurich

meeting. "They (the cheats) know that they can come back before the next (Olympic) Games (after a two-year ban). I am not comfortable with the direction of

Santiparb resigned his seven committee posts on July 31 in protest at legal wrangling by the government over a 10 million dollar sponsorship agreement with Taiwanese computer firm Acer Inc. for the event.

The Olympic Council of Asia then stepped in to try to convince him to stay saying he was a key player in preparations for the event, which will be the 13th time the Games have been staged.

Charuek Arirajkaran a (BAGOC) member and secretary general of the Olympic Committee of Thailand put in his resignation Saturday, the Post said. He tried to resign once before. after being sacked as BAGOC's secretary general, but was encouraged to stay on.

Other committee members are threatening to follow suit, the Post added

Charuek said he was angered by BAGOC's acceptance of Santiparb's resignation and the immediate naming of replacements for his positions.

"It would have been better if the Deputy Prime Minister had consulted me before naming anyone, but it seems he has little faith in me," he told the Nation newspaper.

### Sweden's 2004 Games bid at gunpoint STOCKHOLM, Aug 12: An

anonymous group threatened today to target athletes and the public if the Swedish capital city is awarded the 2004 Olympic Games, reports Reuter.

The group, whose existence was immediately challenged by police, said in a letter received by the Swedish news agency that it was responsible for eight recent fires at sports venues and a bomb explosion last week at Stockholm's Olympic Stadium.

The group, calling itself "we who built Sweden", said it represented the country's poor and Bight-fires and one capit
