

Le's triple delight

FUKUOKA, Japan, Aug 13: World sprint record holder Le Jingyi saved some face by winning the first gold medal for China in her favourite distance at the Pan-Pacific Swimming Championships today, reports AFP.

The Olympic 100-metre champion, who was beaten by Jenny Thompson in the 100m Monday, gained a measure of revenge over the American to win the women's 50m with a time of 25.24 seconds.

Thompson came in 25.42, followed by fellow American Nicole de Man in 25.66.

Le's victory, her first international win since prevailing in a relay race at the World Short-Course Championships in March, ended Thompson's hope of winning six gold medals here.

Fellow American Brooke Bennett and Kristine Quance, holders of the best times of the season in the world so far, stroked to easy victories in their favourite distances.

Bennett, the Atlanta Olympic women's 800m freestyle champion, faced no series challenge completing a start-to-finish victory in 8:26.36 to add to her 1,500m freestyle gold.

It was also the best time of the season in the world, breaking her own previous best of 8:28.79.

Quance, the winner in the women's 400 individual medley, made it a double by taking the 200m title in 2:13.79, beating Canadians Marianne Limpert and Joanne Malar into second and third.

Ricardo Busquets clinched the first gold for Puerto Rico when he shared top spot with William Pileczuk of the United States to win the men's 50m in 22.42.

Matthew Dunn took the day's first gold medal for Australia and his second in the competition when he won the men's 200m individual medley in 2:01.14 in the absence of American Tom Dolan.

Hernandez joins Boca

BUENOS AIRES, Aug 13: Luis Hernandez, Mexico's top scorer at June's America Cup tournament, signed up with Argentina's most popular soccer club Boca Juniors on Tuesday, reports Xinhua.

The Mexican national striker played for Necaxa in the Mexican league before transferring to Boca, traditionally the team with the largest following in Argentina.

Cristal's moment of truth



RIO DE JANEIRO, Aug 13: Now only 90 minutes — and Cruzeiro — stand between Sporting Cristal of Peru and a historic triumph in the Libertadores Cup, reports AP.

With a victory in the tournament's final game Wednesday night in Belo Horizonte, Sporting will become the first Peruvian team ever to win the South American crown.

But first, Sporting must upset powerful Cruzeiro, hungry for their second title after a 21-year drought. After winning the Cup in 1975, Cruzeiro lost to Argentina's Boca Juniors in 1976 and have not reached the final again till this year.

Sporting also must climb out of the hole they dug in the first leg last week in Lima. Needing a win to take an edge into the deciding game, the team played dully and managed only a 0-0 tie.

The two finalist first met in the opening round and split

their series, each winning at home. But in succeeding rounds Sporting faced tougher opponents than Cruzeiro did — and won convincingly.

Sporting knocked out defending champions Velez Sarsfield of Argentina, then easily handled Bolivar of Bolivia. In the semifinals, the team trounced favoured Racing of Argentina, including a 4-1 thrashing in Lima to reach the final.

Meanwhile, Cruzeiro had to go to the penalty-kick tiebreaker to get past modest El Nacional of Ecuador. After eliminating Brazil's gremio, the team squeaked past Colo Colo of Chile, again on penalty kicks.

Wednesday's final stacks up as a shootout between Sporting's big guns and Cruzeiro's all-star goalie Dida.

Forward Luis Bonnet has carried the load for Sporting, scoring five goals in the tournament, while Roberto Solano and Jorge Soto have three apiece. Only one Cruzeiro player, centre-forward Marcelo, has scored three.

But if the game goes to penalties, the Brazilians are convinced that Dida gives them the edge. With cat-like grace despite his 1.98-metre (6-foot-6) frame, Dida rejected two penalties by Colo Colo shooters in the semifinal.

Cruzeiro also will be rested and at full strength, with Elvelton returning to the line-up after a suspension. The club sat out its starters during last week's Centenary Cup invitational tournament to keep them fresh for the Libertadores Cup.

The game will be the last on Cruzeiro for veteran Palhinha, the team's playmaker and field general. On Thursday he flies to Spain, where he will play next season for Mallorca.

It also will be the farewell game for coach Paulo Autuori. After a falling out with team directors, Autuori will move to Flamengo of Rio.

The game starts at 9:40 pm local time (00:40 GMT Thursday) at Mineirao Stadium in Belo Horizonte, 340 kilometres (210 miles) north of Rio.

Steven stuns Courier

NEW HAVEN, Connecticut, Aug 13: Brett Steven continued a solid summer stretch by upsetting an unsteady Jim Courier at the Pilot Pen International, reports AP.

Steven made quick riddance of Courier on Tuesday with a steady serve and well-placed groundstrokes, breaking him four times en route to a 6-2, 6-2 second-round victory that took all of 64 minutes.

"I certainly feel like Jim played a lot worse than I expected him to play, and that certainly contributed to the ease of the win," said Steven, ranked 63rd by the ATP Tour.

Courier, seeded 10th and the top American at the tournament, was moody at times and never found his rhythm on his way to losing his third straight opening match since winning at Los Angeles at the end of last month.

In other matches at the Connecticut Tennis Center, top-seeded Yevgeny Kafelnikov of Russia beat four newcomer Cecil Mamiit 5-7, 6-1, 6-3; No. 3 Petr Korda of the Czech Republic coasted to a 6-3, 6-3 win over Jan-Michael Gambill; No. 7 Tim Lander of Britain edged Daniel Vacek of the Czech Republic 4-6, 7-6, 6-4; and Sargis Srgsian of Armenia rallied to upset No. 13 Marc Rosset of Switzerland 4-6, 6-1, 6-3.

Wimbledon tickets to turn costlier

LONDON, Aug 13: It will cost even more to watch the action at Wimbledon next year — if you are lucky enough to be able to buy tickets, reports AFP.

The all-England Club announced today that prices for each day of the championships, to run from June 22-July 5, will increase by one or two pounds.

Tickets for the men's singles final on the final Sunday have been increased from 54 pounds to 56 pounds, while the women's final tickets on the second Saturday have gone up from 49 pounds to 51 pounds.

Most Wimbledon tickets are sold through a public ballot, for which entries close on December 31 and a draw is made in January. A limited number of Centre Court and No 1 Court tickets are also sold each day of the championships, although none for the last four days for the Centre Court.

Prices will rise by a pound during the first weekend and two pounds during the second week — with the exception of the first Saturday, known as "people's Saturday," when additional seats will be available at a reduced price of 25 pounds. Most seats that day cost 33 pounds.



TORONTO, Aug 13: Top-seeded Monica Seles, competing just two days after winning a tournament in Los Angeles, advanced to the third round of the Canadian Open with a 6-2, 6-4 victory over Asa Carlsson of Sweden on Tuesday, reports AP.

Seles, ranked fourth in the world, arrived in Toronto on Monday and said she practiced just five minutes before Tuesday's match. The 23-year-old added she was feeling the effects of jet lag while on the court.

But she did a terrific job of hiding it from the enthusiastic center-court gathering of about 8,000 at the National Tennis Centre. Seles forced Carlsson, ranked 35th in the world, to commit 35 unforced errors, including 22 in the second set.

"She is one of the biggest fighters out there, she doesn't give you a free point," Seles said. "She has good groundstrokes so I had to go for my shots and luckily my serve was going very well."

Seles has much more on her mind than tennis these days. Her father continues to battle stomach cancer.

"Some days I think I'm han-

Fans set fire to Flamengo



RIO DE JANEIRO, Aug 13: A meeting room at beleaguered Rio soccer club Flamengo was firebombed on Tuesday and a group of angry fans claimed responsibility, reports Reuters.

Witnesses said about six men ran past the room just after a directors meeting had finished on Monday night, threw a bottle full of inflammable liquid on to the floor and then set fire to it before fleeing.

Some windows were smashed and curtains were set on fire but damage appeared to be minimal.

"We are a group of 15 people. We used a drinks bottle with petrol," a telephone caller later told a local radio station.

"We didn't achieve our objective but this isn't the end of it. We are Flamengo fans disgusted with the mistakes made by directors."

Club president Kleber Leite, who was in Sao Paulo at that time, blamed his enemies for the act.

"The real perpetrators of this act are not the ones who threw petrol and set fire to it," he said. "They are the people who hide in the opposition and want to destabilise the club."

Vice-president Michael Assaf, surveying the scene, said, "I can't believe this is the work of Flamengo supporters."

Leite, who took over as president at the start of 1995, has faced increasing opposition

among fans as his incessant wheeling and dealing has failed to produce a decent team.

The club, which claims to be the best supported in the country, are currently 22nd in the 26-team championship.

Leite began his reign in spectacular style by signing Brazilian World Cup hero Romario in early 1995 but since then his signings have been criticised as increasingly incoherent.

More than 50 players have been bought and sold in the Leite era, and he has employed six coaches.

During one three-month period last year, Flamengo signed former international Bebeto, sold Romario to Spanish club Valencia, resold Bento and brought Romario back on loan.

The latest storm has blown up this week following reports that Leite wanted to replace coach Sebastiao Rocha with Paulo Autuori from Cruzeiro.

Although Flamengo have not officially announced the change, Cruzeiro president Zee Pereira accused the club of being unethical in the approaching Autuori while at Flamengo there was criticism at yet another change.

"Once again it will be Flamengo who lose out," said Romario, who has rejoined Valencia but made a flying visit to the club on Monday. "Big uncle (Rocha's nickname) is not to blame for the results."

Rocha himself said, "I will find another path for my life."
