Four months ago, PCD Gen-

Petrobangla's Operation Directorate, which plays a vital role in monitoring activities of foreign oil and gas companies in Bangladesh, has become virtually inoperative due to manpower shortage.

There is no General Manager in the Petroleum Concession Division (PCD) under the Operation Directorate while one of its two managers resigned recently. The Director of Operation has gone on a three-month leave from this month, official sources said.

One of the five Deputy General Managers in the PCD retired few months ago but he was not replaced.

The PCD is the prime unit of the Operation Directorate. Among its many important works, the PCD negotiates with foreign oil and gas companies and monitors their activities after an agreement is signed.

Such a situation is prevailing at a time when the government has floated the second round bidding for hydrocarbon exploration in 15 blocks in the country. When the bidding process is expected to be completed in December 15 and at least a dozen Production Sharing Contracts (PSCs) are expected to be signed, the Operation Directorate would assign its officials to form Joint Review Committees (JRC) against each PSC.

Steps planned to increase forex, industrial lending

The government is considering a number of major policy options including floating of new bonds for non-resident Bangladeshis (NRBs), resumption of rediscount window, and giving facilities to foreign banks to bring in funds from abroad for investment.

These steps are being considered to reverse the falling trend in foreign exchange reserve and to give a boost to industrial lending.

Options have also been proposed to provide funds to commercial banks for term-lending and giving interest subsidy to foreign banks which will invest

These proposals were dis-

cussed in a recent meeting of the Advisory Committee of the Finance Ministry. It was attended by economists Dr Wahiduddin Mahmud, Binayak Sen and Sazzad Zahir among, Governor of Bangladesh Bank Lutfar

Rahman Sarkar, Banking Secretary Amir-Ul-Mulk, NBR Chairman Shah Abdul Hannan and Finance Secretary Dr Akbar Ali Khan. The meeting exclusively dis-

cussed the precarious situation in foreign exchange reserve which is now staggering at 1.6 billion dollars, barely enough to meet two and a half months' imports, and the problem in project financing due to liquidity shortage for such long-term lending.

The meeting suggested that the central bank should open up its rediscount window to help banks with liquidity. The facility has been virtually stopped since 1995 in fear of inflation. However, the meeting viewed

Cancellation of GSP certificates

Opposing views on impact Star Report

Garment exporters and buyers differ with each other in assessing the impact of cancellation of disputed GSP certificates while Bangladesh authorities are yet to take a decision.

An importer in Britain, Alan Henderson of TCAS Partnerships, believes withdrawal of GSP will not only affect Bangladesh exporters but also lead smaller European importers into bankruptcy.

A German importer agrees with Henderson. Gotlib Charles of a Stuttgart-based company calls it a frustrating situation for importers who will now be forced to pay duties on products they have already sold in the last three years. His company did business without taking the cost on duty into account, and now finds the loss could be as high as 14 per cent.

The buyers' view runs contrary to that of Mostafa Golam Quddus of BGMEA who says the industry can still sustain even if there is no GSP.
