BANGALORE, Aug 17: A professor here set a world record in playing non-stop 18,737 table tennis rallies in one hour 34 minutes, surpassing the Guinness record in average speed of strokes and in solo TT, reports

Prof S Ramesh Babu, a doctorate from the Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore, told the news agency that he achieved the feat here on Aug 9, playing the rallies over the net, against a vertically placed TT table

Prof Babu, who had announced he would play 10,000 non-stop TT rallies, went far ahead of his goal to reach 18,737, at the average speed of 199.3 strokes a minute, exceeding the 1997 Guinness record of 173 strokes a minute played by two partners.

Also, Prof Baby said, the present record is 2.8 times longer than the recognised solo TT Guinness record set by himself by playing 6,674 strokes in 54 minutes and 54 seconds in

Prof Babu, who is working with the MS Ramaiah Institute of Technology here, achieved the record in the presence of Karnataka TT champion, C R Anand, former national champion Sai Kumar, international TT referees. Krishna Swamy and G Manoharan and veteran

player Bheem Sen. He said an authentication certificate summarising the performance and signed by five officials has been prepared for communicating to the Guiness Book of Records.

# Banks kicks up a row



Denmark's former Kenyan Wilson Kipketer, who smashed Seb Coe's 16-year-old 800 metres world record in Zurich when he clocked a historic one minute 41.24 seconds, was clearly not in record-breaking mood although he won in a quick 1:42.77.

Gwen Torrence's season looked in danger of being brought to a premature end after the former Olympic champion pulled a leg muscle during a 200 metres race. The American veteran had

to be carried from the track on a stretcher after hurting her left thigh in the last 100-metre of the sprint.
