## Construction worker shot

A construction worker sustained bullet injuries as a gang of extortions fired on him at North Goran in the city. Thursday, reports UNB.

Hospital sources said the extortions shot at Mamta Ali, 28, a labourer of an under-construction building at 254, North Goran, when he refused to pay them toll.

He was admitted to Dhaka Medical College Hospital at about 11 am with bullet injury in one of his legs and later shifted to Orthopaedic Hospital.

## One allegedly commits suicide in city

A middle-aged man allegedly committed suicide by hanging himself in the city's Sheorapara area under Mirpur thana Thursday, reports UNB.

Police said Rupeshwar Pal alias Dipu, 45, was found hanging with a rope from the ceiling inside a phone-fax-shop, Tedcom International, at 722/2 Sheorapara, at about 7:30 am.

Police recovered the body and sent it to Dhaka Medical College Hospital morgue for autopsy.


