

Fuel price hike for transition to market-based economy, says ADB President

Asian Development Bank (ADB) President Mitsuo Sato arrived Dhaka last night for an appraisal of Bangladesh's future development agenda, reports UNB.

Talking to newsmen at the Zia International Airport, Sato said his 4-day visit is aimed at further strengthening the ties between Bangladesh and ADB.

Describing Bangladesh as an important member of ADB, he said the implementation of different ADB-funded projects here had improved a lot in recent times.

He declined to comment on the general strike called by the opposition parties protesting

Khaleda leaves for Pakistan

She is first paying a three-day visit to Pakistan at the invitation of Pakistan Premier Mian Mohammad Nawaz Sharif.

The BNP chairperson accompanied by her party leaders Dr Abdul Moyeen Khan MP, Salauddin Ahmed MP and Selima Rahman, flew for Karachi by a Biman aircraft at 6.57 pm from Zia International Airport.

A close aide of Begum Zia told UNB that during her stay in Islamabad, the former Prime Minister would pay a courtesy call on Nawaz Sharif and exchange views on various bilateral matters as well as regional and international issues of common concern.

Accord likely as CHT talks resume Sept 7

The next round of talks between the National Committee for Chittagong Hill Tracts (NCCHT) and the Parbatya Chattagram Jana Sanghati Samity (PCJSS) will be held on September 7 in Dhaka, authoritative sources said last night.

Earlier on Wednesday, the PCJSS sent a message to the NCCHT through the liaison committee proposing that the next round of talks be held on September 7.

The sources told The Daily Star NCCHT is sending its reply soon confirming the date.

The meeting is being seen as very important since the last round of talks between the two sides in Dhaka ended on July 6

inconclusively after five days. The last meeting, however, made 'satisfactory progress,' working on a draft for a permanent ceasefire in the CHT, scene of decades-old insurgency by Shantibahini, military wing of PCJSS.

The PCJSS delegation, led by its Chairman Jyotirindra Bodhipriya Larma alias Shantu Larma, then went back to their headquarters in Southern Tripura via Dukukhbari carrying a draft of the proposed agreement. Officials said an agreement is likely to be initialled at the next round of meeting.

This will be the sixth round of talks between the two sides

since the government reconstituted the NCCHT in October last year. It resumed dialogue with the PCJSS, making rapid progress, resulting in the PCJSS leadership arriving in the capital in January this year for the first time to hold talks.

Shantu Larma, however, is facing enormous pressure from hardliners in his camp, who are pressing for total autonomy and expulsion of the settlers from the CHT along with withdrawal of the security forces.

Recently the militants have taken over control of various fronts of PCJSS and left its student wing, Pahari Chhatra Parishad, split on peace negotia-

Peak hr power demand to be 4051mw by 2001

The peak hour estimated demand for power in the country by the year 2001 and 2002 has been projected at 4,051 megawatt with an installed generation capacity of 5,132 mw and in-built reserve margin of 1,081 mw, Dr. Luther Rahman, member, General Economics Division of Planning Commission, told BSS.

Giving an outline of power sector projection in the draft Fifth Five-Year Plan (FFYP) in the city yesterday he said, 'we have planned to add another 2,459 mw power generation capacity to the present power infrastructure to raise the installed power generation capacity to 5,334 mw. An investment of Tk 8100 crore will be needed

for the purpose.'

The FFYP proposed significant private sector investment along with the government investment to mobilise adequate funds required for the programme and also to encourage the participation of the private initiatives in the generation and transmission of electricity.

The plan laid emphasis on development of extensive power transmission and distribution network in the urban and rural areas of the country, with the target for transmission and distribution line set at 1,580 kilometre and 59,091 kilometre respectively. Dr. Rahman informed.

He said the desired growth of

Space theatre to be built at Agargaon

The country's first Space Theatre, a modern version of a conventional planetarium, will be built in the city's Agargaon area within the next two years, sources concerned said.

The Space Theatre, named after Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, will be built on three acres of land at a site near the National Museum of Science and Technology at a cost of Tk 52 crore. Prof AM Azizur Rahman Khan, Director of the Museum and the Space Theatre Project said.

With its modern tilted dome, the 350-seat Space Theatre will

BNP-called countrywide dawn-to-dusk hartal today

The BNP has called a dawn-to-dusk hartal across the country today to protest the price hike of gasoline, reports UNB.

The consequences will be dreadful if the government takes up any repressive measure during the hartal hour," BNP secretary general Abdul Mannan Bhuiyan said in a statement last night.

This will be the first day-long hartal by the main opposition party against the 14-month-old administration of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina.

Earlier, BNP enforced half-day hartals on March 23 and July 3 on different national issues.

The cabinet at a meeting on August 18 raised the prices of all petroleum products due to

The second prize of Tk 5 lakh went to each of the holders of ticket no Gha-0321596 and Gha-0092306.



Teenage boy stabbed to death in city

A teenage boy was stabbed to death at Lalmatia under Mohammadpur thana in the city last night.

The dead was identified as Mustafa, 18. Police said a gang of about five youths attacked Mustafa near a market at Lalmatia and stabbed him indiscriminately. He died on the spot about 9:30 pm, police said.

A resident of New Colony drivers' quarters, Mustafa came under attack allegedly following a conflict among friends, police said. However, the real motive behind the killing could not be known immediately.

Mohammadpur police sent the body to the Dhaka Medical College Hospital for autopsy. Besides, they were preparing to file a case in this connection last night.

Put doctors charge fees many times the rates fixed by govt

metropolitan cities charge between Tk 300 and Tk 500 while those who fall in the category of general practitioners' charge between Tk 100 and Tk 200. The minimum fee charged by a junior doctors is Tk 40 to Tk 100.

When the matter was brought to the notice of Dr. Muniruzzaman Bhuiyan, General Secretary of Bangladesh Private Medical Practitioners' Association, he said, 'The law was passed by the then military rulers. We reject the law. We shall abide by the terms being imposed by the health policy. The policy regulates new rates of fees which should be reasonable for both patients and private practitioners.'

About the fixed rates of consultation fees, Dr. Bhuiyan said, 'Doctors never demand fixed fees. It depends on the ability of the patient. Some doctors charge consultation fees based on the patient's apparent wealth.' Sighting an example, he said, 'A patient from a poor family was asked to pay whatever she could afford while the same doctor charged Tk 300 from a patient who was a businessman from Chittagong.'

The 1982 Ordinance states, 'Every registered medical practitioner carrying on private medical practice shall issue receipts to patients and keep a copy for inspection. Practitioners must also display a list of fees and keep a register of patient's names and addresses.'

Majority of the patients complained that the regulations were being violated in the
