# Several dacoities committed in Sylhet in two weeks

SYLHET, Aug 26: Law and order situation in Sylhet has deteriorated with increasing incidents of dacoities, thefts, mugging and extortion of illegal tolls in different areas in two

weeks. Armed dacoits attacked the house of Ahmed Ali at Lamabazar Sheikhpara area of Sylhet town in early hours of Saturday last. The dacoits numbering about 10 to 15 swooped the house situated about one hundred yards off the Lamabazar police outpost at about 2 am on

the day, sources said. The dacoits entered into the house by breaking open the grills and tied up the Dr Taifur. son of the house owner and confined him in a room. They took away the key of the wardrobe from the wife of Dr Taifur at gunpoint and took away 60 tolas of gold ornament, cash amount of Taka one lakh and other valuables from the house.

The miscreants managed to escape along with the booty worth about a total of Taka 4

A case was lodged with the Kotwali police, but no arrest has yet been reported. People became frightened since the dacoity took place within a distance of only hundred yards from the police out post. In another incident, armed

gang of dacoits took away money in cash and other valuables worth about over Taka one lakh from the house number 52 in the Shahjalal Upashahar in the midnight following August 17. The gang masked with black clothes looted valuables at arms point from 'the house of Syed Akhlaque Ahmed and managed to escape. The dacoits also attacked the first floor of the same house. They took away money in cash and other valuables worth about Taka 30 thousand.

Another dacoity was committed in the house of Sayad Miah, an employee of an insurance company in the Shahajalal Upashahar area in the night of August 16 last.

The dacoits took away cash money and other valuables worth about Taka one lakh 25 thousand from the house number 11 of Block A.

A daring dacoity bid was foiled due to the resistance of local people at Shibganj Bamapara on the night of August 15. The dacoits entered into the house by breaking open the grill, but failed to commit dacoity as the neighbours chased

# Chowgachha-Churamonkati road in bad shape

JESSORE, Aug 26: A portion of Chowgachha-Jessore road, has become totally unfit for traffic movement now.

Chowgachha—Churamonkati portion of the road has been damaged completely.

Alleged irresponsibility, negligence of duty and in difference of the officials and staffers of Roads and Highways (R&H) Department have triggered this situation.

Innumerable cracks, potholes and ditches have emerged all over this portion of the road. Edges on both sides of the road have reduced its width. It has now become totally risky for any vehicle or pedestrian.
