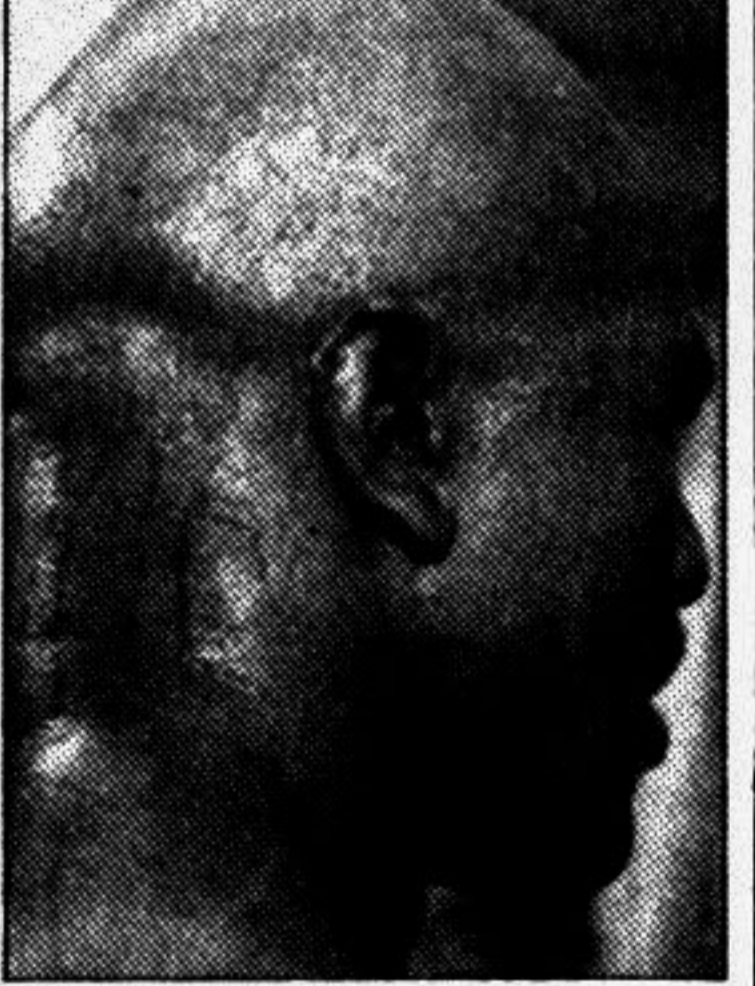

Inter lose in friendly

MADRID, Aug 26: Atletico Madrid beat Inter Milan 1-0 in a hard-fought friendly on Monday with Brazilian star striker Ronaldo failing to sparkle for his new Italian team, reports Reuters.

After a goalless first half, Atletico caught Inter's defence off guard as Christian Vieri, Atletico's big money signing from Juventus, fired the winner in the 62nd minute.

It was a frustrating return to Spain for 20-year-old Ronaldo as he had few opportunities to shoot in a lacklustre performance.

Atletico's other big signing Brazilian midfielder Juninho who came from Middlesbrough for 20.2 million dollars showed off his speed and agility but also failed to score.

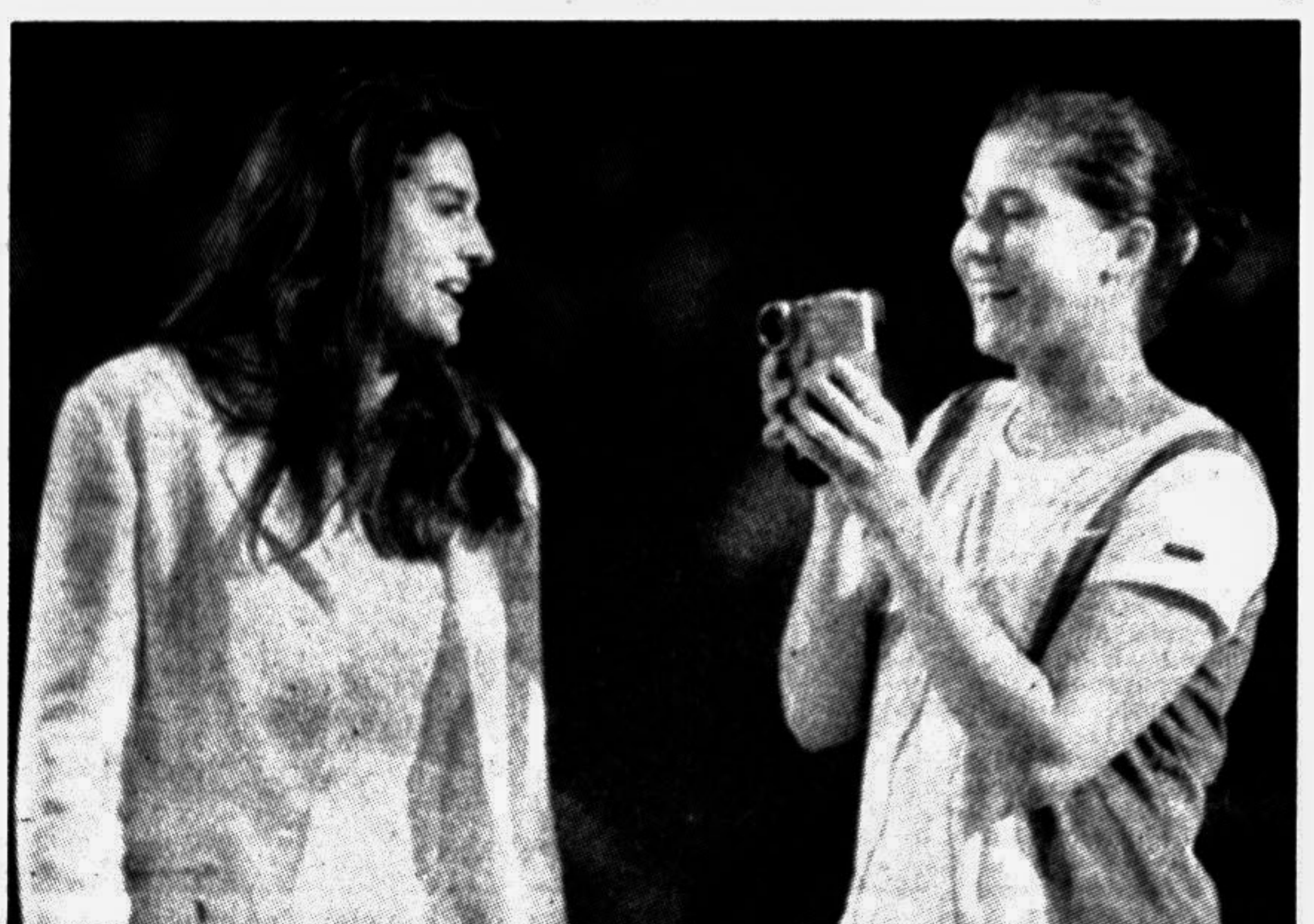

Steffi to sit out rest of '97

NEW YORK, Aug 26: Steffi Graf, still sidelined by injury, made a bittersweet appearance at the US Open Monday night to join a star-studded parade of past champions on hand to dedicate the new Arthur Ashe Stadium.

"I felt awkward already this morning. It's not so much fun coming here and not being able to play," said five-time champion Graf, on the mend from April knee surgery and unable to defend her title.

"But it's been a fun evening to see all the past champions," Graf said of the others, going back to 1937 and 1938 men's champion Don Budge and including the women Graf supplanted at the top of the women's tennis world, Chris Evert and Martina Navratilova.

"It's extremely impressive to see everybody come out here, so I'm happy to be around," said Graf, who admitted she would not have come had it not been for the dedication ceremony.

Graf played only five tournaments this season, winning just one before the knee surgery.

In her absence, 16-year-old Swiss sensation Martina Hingis took over the world number one ranking and claimed the Australian Open and Wimbledon titles.

"She deserves to be where she is," Graf said of the Swiss prodigy. "She has played some incredible tennis this past year. Right now that's the way to look at it."

But the 28-year-old Graf fired a warning shot at Hingis when asked if she thought she could beat the new number one when healthy.

"I don't think I would try to come back if I didn't think that," said Graf, winner of 21 Grand Slam singles titles.

Graf's recovery recently picked up speed when she started to jog, but she is not rushing her return.

"When I come back, I want to be really fit and healthy," said Graf, who hopes to get on the court to start practicing in another six to eight weeks. "I've got a very positive attitude towards it."

And she plans to return to the Grand Slam stage as soon as possible.

"I'm gunning for the Australian Open," she said.

Captaincy in question

New Delhi, Aug 26: It was on August 8 last year that the Indian cricket selectors took one of their boldest steps ever when they appointed Sachin Tendulkar captain of the national team.

It was a move hailed by cricket followers in India and around the world. Tendulkar, at 23, was the youngest captain on the international circuit and one of the youngest in the history of the game.

Cricketers pundits saw the appointment as the dawn of a new era, coming as it did just after disappointing tour of England and under the captaincy of Mohammad Azharuddin. Despite being India's youngest captain since taking over from K. Srikkanth in 1990, Azharuddin's record abroad and his generally defensive bent of mind had come in for considerable criticism. The time had come, it was generally agreed, to turn to the dazzling talents of one of the game's greatest players.

Despite his youth, Tendulkar had been playing non-stop international cricket since the 1989 tour of Pakistan and had impressed one and all with his shrewd cricketing brain.

Now, after a disastrous tour of Sri Lanka where the Indian

team won just one international match over 45 days — that too against minnows Bangladesh — doubts over Tendulkar's leadership qualities are being openly discussed.

The Indian team's record in one-day internationals since Tendulkar took over has been dismal, placing the country in the seventh position in world, standing above only New Zealand and Zimbabwe. A win-

internationals in the last one year, in all fairness it must be said this was more due to the batsmen faltering at their end rather than any lapse on the part of the captain himself.

An irritating habit of changing the field after almost every delivery — a sign of immaturity according to some senior cricketers — has practically become a trademark feature of his captaincy.

Gone is the decisiveness that saw Tendulkar snatch the ball from his captain's grasp and bowl the final over of that amazing Hero Cup semifinal against South Africa in 1994, just when the team's brains appeared to have run out of ideas.

Now even Tendulkar's mentor, the legendary Sunil Gavaskar, who rarely, if ever, finds fault with the current captain's every move, has made a veiled attack on his leadership skills or lack of them. In his syndicate column Gavaskar writes: "Yes, Tendulkar is young and learning all the time, but how much he has learnt will only be seen in the matches in Toronto and Pakistan."

Gavaskar is also highly critical of the captain's statement before the recent tour that he had been saddled with a "B-grade" side by the selectors. Those comments, reported in a Bengali paper, raised a storm as well as once again bringing up the whole issue of the composition of the panel of selectors who currently represent the four zones.

Former Test players are divided in their opinion of Tendulkar. Ex-skipper and manager Ajit Wadekar feels the captaincy came too soon. Others contend that one year is too short a period in which to pass final judgement, particularly taking into consideration his age.

Former left-arm spinner Maninder Singh, a strong supporter of Azharuddin, has even mooted the idea during a TV interview of giving the reins back to Azharuddin for a year, thus allowing Tendulkar a longer apprenticeship.

Tendulkar himself, perhaps learning the lesson of diplomacy after his pre-tour outburst, has been less harsh on his teammates after returning from Sri Lanka, where India lost the final of the Asia Cup, were whitewashed in the three-match one-day series against Sri Lanka and drew both the Tests. The bowling though was thoroughly exposed as the home team registered a new world record for the highest total in Test history in the first Test in Colombo.

While wholesale changes are expected in the squad for the Sahara one-day series against Pakistan in Toronto next month, Tendulkar's place at the top appears secure. The selectors after all do not have much choice. With vice-captain Anil Kumble woefully out of form and perhaps soon out of the team, the vote will surely go to the incumbent once again.

Varsity Games China picks up three medals

CATANIA, Sicily, Aug 26: Cuba is one nation that's taking the World University Games quite seriously, reports AP.

While some eligible athletes are passing on the 19th edition, the starting lists announced Monday by organisers contain several Olympic and World Championships medalists, and Cuba has the most.

The Caribbean island nation has brought long jumper Ivan Pedroso, winner at the World Championships in Athens, Greece, earlier this month and a men who's always a threat to erase Mike Powell's record of 8.95 metres (29 feet, 4 1-2 inches).

He's joined by triple jumpers Yoelvis Quesada and Alceer Urrutia, first and third in Athens respectively, as well as 800 metres silver medalist Norberto Tellez, and Anier Garcia, world indoor champion in the 60 hurdles, will run the 110 hurdles here.

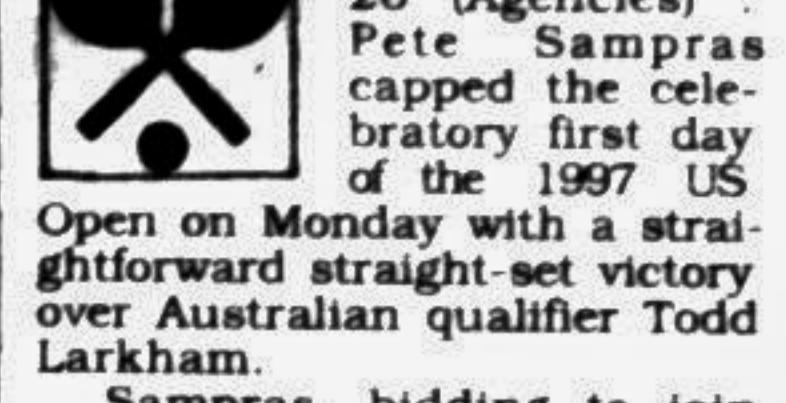
South Africa also has a formidable cast, including world champion Marius Corbett in the javelin, and Llewellyn Herbert, silver medalist in the 400 hurdles.

Monday's light schedule saw China pick up three medals and Italy two. Chinese divers Lu Haisong and Chen Lixia were first and second in the women's 1-metre springboard, while Michelle Rofphon of the United States took bronze. Italy's Valentina Vezzali defeated countrywomen Anna Giacometti 15-9 in the women's foil final. China's Aihua Xiao and Hungary's Idiko Minca, the semifinal losers, each gained a bronze.

In women's basketball quarterfinals, the United States scraped past Russia 78-70 in a balanced game, while Italy beat Portugal 57-45. The Czech Republic beat Sweden 80-58 and Cuba routed Latvia 95-58.

Elsewhere Canada outlasted Italy 3-15, 17-15, 15-9, 12-15, 16-14 in a riveting match to reach the women's volleyball semifinals. Canada next faces the United States, a 15-9, 15-8, 2-15, 15-5 winner over China. The other semifinal has Russia against Japan.

Ivanisevic in ignominy

NEW YORK, Aug 26 (Agencies) Pete Sampras capped the celebratory first day of the 1997 US Open on Monday with a straightforward straight-set victory over Australian qualifier Todd Larkham.

Sampras, bidding to join Jimmy Connors as the only men to claim five US Open titles in the Open era, took the court of the new Arthur Ashe Stadium minutes after a ceremony in honour of the late champion.

After the speeches and fireworks, Sampras 6-3, 6-1, 6-3, victory was almost an anticlimax, although Larkham, ranked 204th in the world, has clearly decided to enjoy himself.

"It was just the experience of a lifetime," said Larkham, a 20-year-old from Canberra who spends most of his time on the Challenger Circuit. "I've played my whole life to walk out there, no way I wasn't going to enjoy it."

He admitted to some jitters before the match in the new stadium which seats more than 23,000 but said he thought he had them under control shortly into the first set.

Controlling Sampras, however, was another matter. "He was just too good," Larkham said admiringly.

"It got a little bit interesting at the end, with the crowd getting into it," Sampras said. "It was nice to play tonight. The conditions were nice, the light was good."

"Once I got into the match I felt pretty good about the way I played. It's a totally different feel out there. I liked it."

The opening day upset came early, as fourth-seeded Goran Ivanisevic of Croatia was upset by 91st-ranked Dinu Pescariu of Romania.

Ivanisevic, plagued by inconsistency throughout his Grand Slam career, was beaten 4-6, 7-5, 6-1, 7-6 (7-3) for his first third-round exit from the Open in four years.

Ivanisevic 24 aces, but even they couldn't make up for inconsistencies that mushroomed as the match progressed.

Pescariu playing in the US Open main draw for the first time, took full advantage.

In the beginning I was not touching his serves," Pescariu said. "Then he started serving worse, and we started rallying on his serve and that was it."

Once Pescariu broke Ivanisevic in the 12th game to take the second set, it was all downhill for the Croatian. Pescariu got the upper hand in the fourth set with a break in the seventh game, and Ivanisevic said that even when he broke back to level the set at 5-5 he didn't feel he had a chance.

"I'm not trying to push enough," he said. "He served for the match and I broke him, and then I stopped again. It's not only my serve, everything is not there, you can't win matches when you play like that."

The lanky Croatian had reached the semifinals here at the National Tennis Centre last year before falling to virtual

champion Sampras. Pescariu won a measure of revenge in beating Ivanisevic who defeated the unseeded Romanian in the first round this year at Wimbledon.

The 23-year-old Romanian, who fell to Sampras in the opening round of the Australian Open, had entered the US championships with a 1-7 match record on the ATP Tour this year.

Mark Philippoussis and Felix Mantilla overcame testing first-round opponents.

The 12th-seeded Mantilla of Spain defeated Australian Jason Stoltenberg 7-6 (7-4), 6-4, 6-2, and 14th seed Philippoussis powered past Karim Alami of Morocco 6-3, 6-4, 3-6, 6-4.

Philippoussis pounded home 23 aces and scored 51 winners against 49 unforced errors in his go-for-broke fashion as he avenged a defeat to the Italian Open.

The steady Mantilla, one of a record five seeded Spanish men at the Open, coaxed 56 errors from Stoltenberg, ranked 56, in the one hour, 54-minute match.

In a match between two players who once would have been seeded high and expected to meet in at least the quarters, unseeded America Todd Martin showed he's recovered from elbow surgery in a 3-6, 6-3, 6-4, 6-2 victory over Jim Courier.

Thailand's Tamarian Tanasugarn entered her name in the record books.

The 20-year-old Tanasugarn, a baseliner ranked 41st in the world, took centre stage in the first match played at the new stadium and needed just 53 minutes to eliminate 32nd-ranked Chanda Rubin 6-4 6-0.

Tanasugarn took advantage of 33 unforced errors from Rubin, once touted as one of the brightest up-and-comers in US women's tennis.

Not so fortunate was women's 15th seed Ruxandra Dragomir. The Romanian lost 6-2, 3-6, 6-3 to American Lisa Raymond.

Monica Seles, runner-up to injured Steffi Graf in last year's final, opened the night session with a 6-1, 6-2 victory over Kristie Boogert of the Netherlands.

Seles, who withdrew in the midst of a tournament in Atlanta last week with a virus and strep infection, was happy to get a relatively easy win under her belt.

Eight-seeded German Anke Huber advance smoothly, 6-2, 6-2 over unseeded Italian Gloria Pizzichini.

Other first-round winners included Anna Kournikova of Russia and American Venus Williams.

Kournikova, a semifinalist at Wimbledon, overwhelmed Sabine Appelman of Belgium 6-2, 6-0, while Williams overcame Larisa Neiland of Latvia 5-7, 6-0, 6-1.

World number one and women's top seed Martina Hingis opens her campaign on Tuesday against American Tami Jones man's second seed Michael Chang plays Sweden's Patrik Fredriksson in the afternoon while unseeded but ever popular Andre Agassi headlines the night session along with fellow Olympic singles champion Lindsay Davenport.

Greats gather to salute Ashe

NEW YORK, Aug 26: In a spectacular tribute to Arthur Ashe, the greatest collection of tennis champions ever assembled gathered Monday night at the dedication of the new US Open stadium named in his honour, reports AP.

The emotional one-hour ceremony epitomised the dignity and grace that characterised Ashe's life, and the mood of the night blended solemnity with joy.

Ashe "embodied the best in tennis and sports," John McEnroe told the sellout crowd of 22,500. "He was a remarkable athlete who led an even more remarkable life. ... He was far and away the greatest ambassador tennis has ever had."

South African Bishop Desmond Tutu, paying homage to Ashe for joining the fight against apartheid, was among the dozens of celebrities attending the ceremony.

Jeanne Moutoussamy-Ashe received two warm, standing ovations from the crowd as she spoke of her late husband's emphasis on "inclusion" in tennis and in all walks of life.

From Don Budge and Jack Kramer to Boris Becker and Stefan Edberg, from Louise Brough to Billie Jean King, from Chris Evert and Martina Navratilova to Monica Seles and Steffi Graf, 37 US singles champions from the past 60 years attended the ceremony.

Among the notable absentees was Andre Agassi, who attended a player's dinner earlier in the evening but skipped the ceremony when it was announced he was "unable to attend."

Whitney Houston sang "One Moment in Time" as scenes of the champions in action were shown on the two giant screens atop the new stadium, and fireworks lit up the night sky at the end of her song.

Rovers rout Wednesday

LONDON, Aug 26: Blackburn Rovers kept up the pace at the top of the English Premier league when they trounced Sheffield Wednesday 7-2 in a frenetic match at Ewood Park on Monday, reports Reuter.

Following Chelsea's 6-0 drubbing of Barnsley on Sunday, the game got off to a torrid start as Blackburn, champions in 1994/95, went 3-1 up in the first 10 minutes thanks to two goals from Kevin Gallacher and an own goal from Graham Hyde.

Italian Benito Carbone, whose top-flight evening came to a premature end after an hour when he was sent off for head-butting an opponent, responded with a close-range strike to keep Wednesday in touch but after 24 minutes Blackburn had stretched the lead to 5-1.

Jason Wilcox slid home the fourth after 20 minutes before Chris Sutton found the back of the net with the goal of the night, a right-foot shot which curled around Wednesday keeper Kevin Pressman.

Two minutes into the second half Carbons gave Wednesday fresh hope with his second but five minutes later Lars Bohinen restored Blackburn's four goal advantage.

Things got even worse for Wednesday when Carbone, reacting to an appalling tackle from Gallacher, responded with a head-butt and was sent off.

Shortly after, Blackburn lost their goalkeeper John Flann who was stretched off with suspected broken arm and was replaced by England, 'keeper Tim Flowers.

Blackburn moved to 10 points at the top of the league with three wins and a draw from four games, three clear of Arsenal, Manchester United and Leicester, who have all played a game fewer.
